she offered that she had a knife in her pocket. **Officers found a lipstick container that concealed a knife inside.**

Crimes of Note:

7/31/07 at 3 PM- A college campus on the **2300 block of Stockton** was besieged by a group of young people who roamed the campus and entered classrooms that were in progress. Apparently it was a diversion used to cover up thefts of wallets and an Ipod. 3 young men and 3 young women 17-20 ran through the building causing a disturbance. **Officers Mary Godfrey, Darryl Fong and Jesse Ortiz** responded and coordinated the investigation. Officers detained individuals from the group at various locations. Four of the five were detained and identified as juveniles and cited for trespassing. A wallet was recovered minus the cash.

8/1/07 at 3:46 PM- **Officers Mary Godfrey and Gary Moriyama** responded to the parking garage on the **400 block of Sutter** where employees were holding a suspect. The garage employees saw the suspect enter the garage and use tools to cut a lock on a bicycle from a post. They stopped him before he could get away with the bike, and called police.

8/1/07 at 11PM- **Officers Brian Oliver and Adam Choy** detained an individual sitting in the closed park at **St. Mary's Square**. The suspect was found to be on active parole and had numerous pieces of stolen identification and credit cards.

8/2/07 at 6:30 AM- 600 block of Pacific Street. A suspect who was arrested last week for a parole violation was back at it. The individual, who was also suspected of being involved in a **Chinatown Burglary series** was caught in the act of a robbery. Witnesses flagged down **Officers Jesse Ortiz and Ben Manning at Pacific and Kearny** and gave descriptions of a black woman and black male who pushed a 66 year old Asian male to the ground near Beckett Alley. Officers searched the area and saw the suspect, still holding a grey messenger bag that was stolen from the victim. The victim said the pair threw him to the ground and took his bag. He sustained a small cut to his mouth from the assault. The 6'1 145 pound suspect was booked for robbery and a parole violation. The woman accomplice was not captured.
