Crimes and Law Enforcement

THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

Tuesday, February 21, 2006, 1:15 AM. Threats, Warrant Arrest, 100 Block Bridgeview Drive. CS #: 060 196 962:

Bayview Officers responded to the 100 block of Bridgeview Drive on report of women screaming for help. Upon their arrival they saw three hysterical women pointing at a white male across the street and they declared, "That is him, officers." One of the women was holding a broom handle as if to protect her. The man declared, "I did not do anything." The Officers walked towards the man and he assumed a fighting position. A physical struggle ensued and the man was brought into custody.

It was learned that the man had been dating one of the women for approximately five months and they were having an argument over infidelity committed by both parties. And the argument escalated to the point where the man threatened, "I will get you b#\$%*s, I'll put you to sleep!"

The man was booked for threats and numerous domestic violence charges.

While onboard a #15 MUNI Bus an area teen was approached by two teens. They asked the teen to see his cell phone that he was holding in his hand. One of the suspects ripped the phone from the victims' hand and tossed to the second suspect. The victim got out of his seat and confronted the suspect that now had his phone. An elderly passenger told the suspect to give him his phone back, and the suspect relented.

The victim exited the bus and so did the first suspect. The suspect punched the victim in the face twice and threw him to the ground by his backpack. The victim got up and retaliated and punched the assailant twice in the face. A citizen intervened and prevented the melee from continuing. The victim kept his phone but the suspect escaped.

Bicycle Officers Dalton and McPherson arrested a San Francisco Probationer on a stay away order violation that prevented him 150 yards from this street. The man was previously warned by the officers that he would be arrested if he was there again. True to the officers word he was arrested and a probation hold was placed on the man.

A San Mateo man was booked this day for possessing marijuana with the intent to sell. The man was leaning into his car when he was approached by plainclothes officers. When the officers got closer they could detect a strong odor of marijuana coming from the man and his car. Further examination revealed a large amount of marijuana and packaging material. The man later admitted to growing marijuana in his San Mateo home and selling it.

Plain Clothes Officers Aherne, Fitzpatrick, and DeJesus were driving in the area of 3rd and Newcomb when they heard the sound of tires screeching. They looked and saw an Acura NSX speeding up Third Street weaving through traffic. The officers pulled the car over a few blocks away. But before

the officers could contact the driver the Acura sped away. A short chase ensued and other officers closed into the scene. Fortunately, the driver went down the dead end block of Quesada off Third Street. The driver got to the end of the block, exited the car and started to run except additional officers were blocking his path. The suspect was apprehended.

Turns out the Acura was stolen out of San Mateo County. Additionally, the driver, a parolee, had a felony domestic violence warrant, stolen property and narcotics in his possession. The driver was booked for numerous violations.

Thursday, February 23, 2006, 7:41 PM - Possession of a Firearm by a Felon - Garlington Court - CS #: 060 209 383:

Plainclothes Officers Aherne, Fitzpatrick, and DeJesus under the guidance of Sgt. Hagan were on patrol in the area of Garlington Court in the Bayview District. This area has seen more than its fair share of gun violence and narcotics activity. To combat the problem Officers Fitzpatrick and Aherne walked through the area on foot while Sgt. Hagan and Officer DeJesus drove around the area to see if they could "flush" any criminals out.

Officer DeJesus spotted a gang member that has been arrested numerous times for possessing firearms, narcotics and has been implicated in numerous shootings. This individual was out on the streets released to probation. When Officer DeJesus stopped the car to speak with this individual, the individual grabbed his waistband and began to run.

As the action was broadcast over the radio Officers Aherne and Fitzpatrick headed to where the suspect was running. The suspect rounded a building and was seen by Officers Aherne and Fitzpatrick diving into bushes. The suspect was ordered out of the bushes and brought into custody. In the bushes where the suspect was crawling through was a loaded 9mm semi-automatic handgun. Forensic tests are underway to confirm that the handgun was in the suspects' possession.

Friday, February 24, 2006 4:35 PM - Attempted Robbery - 300 Block of Bayshore - CS #: 060 211 651:

A young woman was walking into a business on Bayshore Boulevard when two young men approached her. She felt someone grab her purse and when she turned around to see who it was that was doing it she was punched in the face by the suspect. The woman screamed and the suspects ran away. A few minutes later she saw a passing patrol car and waved him down. A search of the area was negative.

The first subject is described as a light complexion black male between 18-20, 5'10" 160 lbs. wearing a blue puffy coat, blue jeans, and black

Saturday, February 25, 2006 1:26 AM - Vehicle Burglary, Vandalism, Battery of a Police Officer, Resisting Arrest, Possession of Burglary Tools, Probation Violation, Warrant Arrest - 400 Block of Bayview Circle - Case #:060214564.

Bayview Officers Wise, Berge and Leudtke responded to the 400 block of Bayview Circle when a citizen reported that a suspect was breaking into a Ford parked on the street. The Officers found the silver SUV and noticed that a rear window had been smashed in. They also noticed a man in the back seat. The suspect was wearing a black knit cap, a dark jacket, dark pants, and black gloves. Upon seeing the Officers the man scrambled out from a rear door and began to run off. A foot chase ensued and the Officers caught up with the suspect as he attempted to climb a wooden fence at the base of a hill. The fence collapsed under the combined weight of the suspect, and Officers Luedtke and Wise. After a short struggle the Officers managed to arrest the suspect. They found an automotive glass breaker in one of his pockets. The Officers also determined that the man was on felony probation in Alameda County for possession of stolen property and felony probation in San Francisco County for grand theft. The man, a Bayview Resident was booked at Bayview Police Station.

Saturday, February 25, 2006. 9:30 AM. Found Gun. 1100 Block of Palou. Case #: 060215318.

Officers Bandvik, Anderson, Knoble, and Ferrira were driving in the area of the Oakdale Housing Projects when they noticed a known gang member walking in between two housing units. The Officers walked behind one of the units and looked in the bushes. Stashed in the bushes they found a loaded 9mm handgun and a realistic replica of a Mac-10 submachine gun. The guns were taken to Bayview Station and collected by CSI for processing.

Sunday, February 26, 2006. 5:00 PM. Attempted Robbery, Battery. 1500 block of Third St. Case #: 060220323.

Bayview Officers Chiang and McCormick responded to SFGH to meet with a robbery victim. They met with the 79 year old man who explained that he had been preparing a sandwich in his department store on 3rd St. when a man wearing a plastic bag over his head entered the business wielding a 2 x 4 board. The suspect demanded the victim's money. Before the victim could react, the suspect smashed the board onto the victim's head. It is worthy of note that this particular victim is a proud veteran of the United States Navy. In fact he was aboard the USS Missouri during the signing of the Japanese surrender of WWII. Using the butcher knife he was holding to

prepare the sandwich, the brave veteran chased the suspect from the store, possibly wounding him in the process. The victim is recovering from head lacerations.

Sunday, February 26, 2005. 3:30 PM. Cocaine Possession, Driving with a Suspended License, Warrant Arrest, Traffic Violation. Palou Ave. at Phelps St. Case #: 060219893.

Bayview Officers Catlett and Barron were on patrol when they noticed a vehicle at the above intersection make a left turn without using a turn signal. The Officers stopped the vehicle and contacted the driver, a Bayview resident. A computer check revealed that the man's license was suspended and that he had an outstanding arrest warrant for driving with a suspended license. When Officer Barron asked the man if he had any sharp objects in his pockets the man replied, "I have some cocaine in my pocket". While not normally considered to be a sharp object, Officer Barron thanked the man for the information and retrieved 3 bags of powdered cocaine from his front pocket. The man was booked at Bayview Station.

Monday, February 27, 2006. 10:00 PM. Defrauding a Service Provider. 800 Block of Missouri St. Case # 060224870.

Bayview Officer Robinson was behind the front counter at Bayview Station when a cab driver walked up and reported the following tale: The cabbie had just picked up a man from the 800 block of Missouri. The man had the cabbie drive to another address in the Bayview District. The man exited the cab and rang the doorbell at the address but nobody was home. The man returned to the cab and asked to use the cabbie's cell phone. The cabbie agreed and the suspect dialed three different numbers (all of which were provided to Officer Robinson). Eventually an unknown female approached the address and let the suspect in. The man and woman were in the house for about 5 minutes when a vehicle pulled up behind the cab. This car was occupied by two unknown females. The driver got out of the car and hopped into the back seat. Next, the suspect exited the house and got into the driver's seat of the car. Without paying his \$40.00 fare the man sped off in the car with the two females. The cabbie followed the car but gave up his pursuit after the suspect ran a red light.
