BVHP Fit 'n Fun Fair: Saturday, October 1, from 10:30 am to 1:00 pm the BVHP Farmer's Market is sponsoring a fitness fair on Third Street between Oakdale and Newcomb. The San Francisco Department of Recreation and Parks, The Department of Youth and Their Families, and the Department of the Environment among others will co-sponsor the event. Activities are planned for children, adults, and seniors. There will be prizes and "sporty giveaways" as well.

Monte Carlo Anniversary Celebration: The Monte Carlo Bar and Grill is celebrating its fourth anniversary Saturday, October 1. The celebration will take place on Lane Street between Yosemite and Armstrong at 7:00 pm and run until 11:00 pm.

Burning Man Festival: The sixth annual San Francisco Burning Man Festival will take place October 9 and 10 from Noon to 11:59 pm on Indiana Street between Mariposa and 21st. There will be three stages and music will commence each day at 2:00 pm. Five to six bands featuring World Beat Music are scheduled to make appearances. Although bar and beverage booths will be available, there will be no food vendors for this event. Attendees are encouraged to bring picnic lunches. 3000 to 4000 people are expected to attend.

The Portrero Hill Neighborhood House Festival: Portrero Hill Neighborhood House will sponsor its 15th annual festival Saturday, October 15. There will be live music and arts and crafts displays. The following thoroughfares will be closed: Southern Heights Boulevard between Carolina and Rhode Island, DeHaro between 20th and 22nd Streets.

Crimes and Law Enforcement

Saturday, Sept. 17, 12:08 AM, Aggravated Assault with a Gun: Residents from the 100 block of Northridge called San Francisco Police Communications to report that their 20 year old nephew had been shot. Officers arrived at the scene to find the young man bleeding from a gunshot wound to his nose. SFFD Paramedics responded to provide medical assistance. No vehicle or suspect descriptions are available.

Saturday, Sept. 17, 7:26 PM, Aggravated Assault with a Gun: Witnesses on the 1300 block of Palou told responding officers that they heard four to seven gunshots coming from the intersection of Palou and Jennings. Immediately thereafter they saw a gray Toyota four-door with 20-inch wheels speed away from the scene. Residents directed arriving officers to a home nearby where they found one 19 year-old young man with a single gunshot wound to his back. SFFD paramedics responded to transport the young man to San Francisco General Hospital.

Saturday, Sept. 17, 10:36 PM, Marijuana, Possession for Sale, Arrest: Officers Anderson and Farrell had been patrolling the area of 3rd Street and Quesada when they saw a motorist driving a cream colored Chevrolet with expired registration tabs. Four passengers were on board. A traffic stop revealed the driver was on parole and the man seated immediately behind him was on probation. A probation search revealed several small bags of marijuana packaged for sale in an area inside the vehicle under the second man's control. Still more were found in a suitcase at his feet. The officers issued a citation to the man on parole for his registration violation, and arrested the man on probation for possessing marijuana for sale. They booked the man at Bayview Station.

Sunday, September 18, 2:20 PM, Crack Cocaine Arrests: Several Bayview plainclothes officers had been patrolling the area of Third and Newcomb when they spotted a hand to hand narcotics transaction between a man and woman on the south-west corner. They detained both suspects. Both were found in possession of crack cocaine and arrested. The man was booked a Bayview Station while the woman was booked at County Jail 9.

Sunday, September 18, 3:25 PM, Narcotics Arrests: Plainclothes officers Kirchner and Ellis had been driving an unmarked police vehicle in the area of Newhall and La Salle when they observed two men huddled close together behind a parked van. One was lighting what appeared to be a crack pipe. The suspects fled in opposite directions as the officers approached, but both were apprehended. One of the suspects was found in possession of 13 prepackaged bags of marijuana for sale. The other was found in possession of a crack pipe and two rocks of crack cocaine. Both were booked at Bayview Station.

Sunday, September 18, 11:30 PM, Stabbing: The victim of a stabbing told his reporting officers that he had been walking east on Hollister at 3rd when three black male suspects, 19 to 21 years old, approached him from behind. The suspects challenged the victim, asking him where he was, and then attacked him. The victim defended himself, but at some point during the struggle one of the suspects stabbed him in the shoulder. Officers searched the area to no avail.

Monday, September 19, 1:00 AM, Assault with a Gun: Police Communications

sent Officers Gasanyan and Birco to San Francisco General Hospital on the report of a walk-in shooting victim. The young man would not answer any of the officer's questions. A relative who had accompanied the victim to the hospital was more forthcoming. He told the officers that the victim had just dropped off an acquaintance at the Double Rock Development. As he was driving out of the area an unknown party fired several shots in the direction of his car striking him twice, once in the elbow and once in the thigh. Officers searched the area to no avail.

Monday September 19, 9:40 AM, Strong-arm Robbery Arrests: Police Communications broadcast the report of a purse snatch on the 100 block of Goettingen. The victim, a 33 year-old woman, told her reporting officers that she had been walking on Felton Street at Goettingen when she was struck from behind. A 17 year-old young man had grabbed her purse and struggled with the woman to gain control of it. Another young man joined the suspect and together they overpowered the victim. She chased the two to a silver Altima waiting nearby and grabbed one of the young men as they climbed inside. Another suspect waiting inside the vehicle then displayed what looked to the victim like a handgun. The victim, fearing for her life, let go and stepped away. The suspects fled in the vehicle and the victim called for police assistance.

Several Bayview units responded but the suspects were lost in the area. Three hours later Sergeant Mike Moran found the described vehicle parked at Harbor and Northridge. Shortly thereafter all four suspects approached the vehicle and climbed inside again. Several officers gave the good sergeant a hand, placing all four suspects under detention. The victim subsequently identified the suspects as those responsible for robbing her, and an arrest search revealed the suspects had the victim's property in her possession. Two of the suspects were juveniles and booked at the Youth Guidance Center. The other two were adults and they were booked at County Jail 9.

Monday, September 19, 1:05 PM, Homicide, Multiple Shooting Victims: Several Bayview units responded to the report of a shooting at Third Street and Kirkwood. The S.F.P.D. Homicide Detail is conducting a follow-up investigation.

Tuesday, September 20, 1:50 AM, Aggravated Assault with a Gun: Emergency Communications sent Bayview officers to the report of a shooting in the Double Rock neighborhood. A Samoan male fired several shots in the direction of a man and woman standing outside on the unit block of Double Rock Street. One bullet struck the man's ankle and another struck the woman's leg. SFFD paramedics transported both victims to General. Neither victim could identify the suspect. Officers searched the area to no avail.

Tuesday, September 20, 3:40 PM, Robbery with a Gun: A 57 year-old woman told reporting officers that a 20 to 25 year-old Black male used a white metal automatic handgun to rob her of her duffel bag on the unit block of Rebecca. She described the suspect as a Black male (5'08" 150 lbs.) with a short haircut, a three-quarter-length black jacket, and gray pants. Officers searched the area to no avail.

Wednesday, September 21, 2:10 AM, Robbery with Force, Arrests: Two young men told reporting officers MacKenzie, Barcojo and Batchelder that they had

been robbed as they walked past the Bell Market at Girard and Silver. The suspects, two 17 year-old young men, approached the victims from behind and pushed them up against a wall. The suspects then demanded the victims' money, and removed one victim's wallet. The suspect with the wallet then punched his victim on his face and ran east on San Bruno toward Silver. The victims followed and watched as the suspects climbed into a gold Honda Accord and fled the area.

The officers drove around the area with the victims as they took the report to see if they might spot the suspects, but they did not. Roughly three hours later after the officers had dropped off their victims they spotted the suspects heading in the opposite direction, driving North on Carroll. The officers made a hasty u-turn and performed a traffic stop on the suspect vehicle. Additional units subsequently re-contacted the victims who identified the persons detained as the suspects who robbed them. A day-watch unit booked the suspects at the Youth Guidance Center.

Thursday, September 22, 11:30 AM, Purse Snatch: A 38 year-old woman told reporting officers that she had been walking south on Ledyard toward Williams when she was robbed. She had been walking with her wallet clutched in her hand, when a 24 to 30 year-old Black male (6'00", 140 lbs.) wearing a heavy tan jacket jumped out of a brown van and wrested the wallet from her grasp. The suspect then jumped back into the van and fled the area driving east on Williams. Officers searched the area to no avail.

Sunday, September 25, 8:29 PM, Carjacking Arrest: Officers Barcojo, Batchelder and Wolf had been driving east on 23rd Street approaching Arkansas when they spotted a vehicle that had been previously reported as carjacked. When they pulled over to keep their eyes on the vehicle a 16 year-old young man climbed into the driver's seat and drove east toward Dakota. The officers then attempted to perform a traffic stop but the suspect jumped out of the vehicle as it was still moving and fled, running down a hill between 23rd and Connecticut. The officers gave chase and apprehended the suspect all the same. They booked the suspect at the Youth Guidance Center.
