Crime and Enforcement Update

Attempted Homicide With a Gun 1624 Keith Ave

9:09 pm

A Bayview Officers responded to Oakdale and Keith regarding shots fired. Officers Borgen and Chaing were south on Keith near Revere when an unknown African American male approached them. The African American male told the officers that there was a black male down on the ground at the corner of Keith and Revere. When the officers arrived at Keith and Revere they found the victim on the ground in front of 1624 Keith. When the officers approached the victim, they illuminated him and discovered that he was bleeding from his left thigh and groin area. The officer rendered aid and called for an ambulance. The victim did not know who shot him. The victim was transported to San Francisco General Hospital for treatment. No suspects were located or identified.

Prohibited Person With a Gun

120 Middlepoint

11:48 p.m.

A Bayview Officers Christ and Hara were on patrol and observed a vehicle commit a traffic violation. When they conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle to issue the suspect a citation, the suspect parked in front of 100 Westpoint. Prior to stopping his vehicle the suspect began reaching under the front passenger seat. The suspect exited the vehicle and began walking away, he raised his shirt and camouflage jacket revealing his waist band area. The suspect then said, "I don't have anything." The suspect then fled on foot and Officer Hara pursued the suspect. Officer Christ advised Officer Hara that a gun was found in the car. When Officer Hara caught up with the suspect he tackled the suspect and knocked him to the ground. The suspect struggled with Officer Hara. The suspect refused to obey Officer Hara's commands. The suspect began punching Officer Hara in the shoulder area with a closed fist. Officer Hara, in the act of defending himself, punched the suspect in the face several times with a closed fist. The suspect was able to push Officer Hara to the ground and fled on foot again. Officer Hara pursued the suspect again on foot and caught up to him. Based on the fact that physical controls weren't effective on the suspect and the suspect had attached Officer Hara, Officer Hara extended his ASP baton. Officer Hara struck the suspect multiple times to "zone two", the suspect lower leg area. The baton strikes had not effect on the suspect and the suspect continued fleeing on foot. Officer Hara continued the pursuit and caught the suspect at 120 Westpoint. Officer Hara struck the suspect again to "zone two." The suspect fell to the ground and laid on his back. Officer Hara order the suspect to roll over onto his stomach and told him if he did not comply he would be struck. Officer Wendell arrived and the suspect was taken into custody. The suspect was transported to San Francisco General Hospital and treated for the baton strikes to his lower leg area. A fully loaded 9mm Browning semi auto handgun was recovered from the suspect vehicle. The guns hammer was cocked and the magazine was fully inserted. After receiving medical treatment the suspect was booked at County jail. Officer Hara was not injured during the altercation with the suspect.

Robbery With Force

3801-3rd Street

Officer Alcaraz responded to 3801-3rd Street regarding a well being check. Dispatch advise him that a female customer approached the assistant manager and told her that her son was making her take out money from her account. The suspect was sitting in the victim's vehicle in front of the bank. Plainclothes officers responded to the area and located the victim's vehicle. The suspect was still in the vehicle and he was detained. The victim told Officer Alcaraz that on 9/7/05 at about 7:00 pm her son beat her up and made her drive him to the bank. Once at the bank he forced her to withdraw \$200.00 against her will. On this date the victim was taking the suspect to get something to eat and the suspect told the victim that he needed some money. The victim told the suspect that she did not have any money. The suspect told the victim that if she didn't get the money, she would get it like last Wednesday. The suspect was arrested and booked at Bayview Station on three felony charges.
