Misdemeanor Warrant Arrest McKinnon/Selby 1120 hrs.

Officers found suspected crack cocaine, marijuana, and a large quantity of money on him. Officers seized the narcotics and money. The man was arrested for possession of crack cocaine, marijuana, resisting arrest, and the felony narcotics warrant.

Bayview Officer Cahill was in the area due to the large number of complaints regarding the homeless when he saw a man blocking the sidewalk with several shopping carts. He had the man move the shopping carts and then conducted a record check of him. A record check revealed that the man had an outstanding felony warrant for possessing stolen property.
