Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 5, at 5:16 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Oakdale and Selby when they realized that the vehicle in front of them was listed on their "hot sheet." The officers ordered the driver to throw the keys out of the window as they approached, and the driver threw a screwdriver out instead. The driver was booked for stolen auto, possession of stolen property, and driving without a license (041 137 610).

On October 5, at 7:38 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1900 block of 25th Street on the report of shots being fired. The female caller stated that she was gathering the belongings of her godson from her home, in order to give them to the godson, who was waiting outside her home. The caller started she heard arguing and looked outside to see her godson arguing with an unknown male. The caller saw that the second man had a small chrome gun in his hand. The caller went back to gathering her godson's belongings when she heard a single gunshot and looked outside to see both individuals were now gone. The officers found a single casing at the scene, but no victims (041 137 723).

On October 5, at 8:10 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1300 block of Shafter on the report of a man with a gun. Upon arrival the officers interviewed the female caller, who stated that her adult son had been arguing in front of her home with an unknown male. The caller stated that her son was drunk and that her husband had attempted, unsuccessfully to "calm him down." The caller stated that her husband and son then became involved in a physical fight, and she used her "stun gun" to control her son. The son was medically evaluated at the scene by paramedics and then arrested by the officers for public drunkenness (041 137 933).

On October 5, at 10:36 a.m., Bayview's day-watch lieutenant responded to 3rd and McKinnon on the report of narcotics sales occurring across from the super market. The lieutenant found a man seated in a vehicle with numerous narcotics-related implements and substances. The man, living on the 1500 block of LaSalle, was arrested for possession of crack cocaine, possession of heroin for sale, and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (041 138 737).

On October 5, at 11:15 a.m., a man walked into Bayview Station and reported that a total of almost \$20,000.00 worth of checks had been written on his business checking account without his authorization. The man, who works on the 2200 block of Shafter, stated that the only person with access to his account is his bookkeeper, who also shares office space with him (041 138 652).

On October 5, at 2:19 p.m., Bayview officers were on foot patrol on the 1600 block of 20th Street when they were flagged down by an employee of the "All States Market" who related to them that a man had been "hanging around" the rest-room at the "Thinkers Cafe" and asking women if they would like to join him in the rest-room. The officers located the suspect and interviewed him, and he denied ever utilizing this unique technique to meet women. The man, living on the 400 block of Argonaut, was arrested for an outstanding drug warrant from Daly City (041 113 597).

On October 5, at 6:49 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1400 block of 20th Street on the report of a street robbery. The officers found the victim, lying on the sidewalk, with injuries to his nose and left eye. While the victim was being treated for his injuries, a witness approached the officers and told them that the victim had been attacked by five to six juveniles, all 14 to 17 years of age. The witness saw the juveniles approach the victim, demand his money, and then proceed to physically assault him. The witness saw one of the suspects holding a stick as if to strike the victim, but is unsure if the stick was used. The witness did see the suspects kick the victim in the head as he lay on the ground. One of the juveniles was described as being a Pacific Islander male, with the rest of the juveniles being described as black males (041 140 845).

On October 5, at 11:30 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 3rd and Newcomb when they saw a man stumbling down the street, in what appeared to be an intoxicated state, and they stopped to investigate his condition. The officers determined that the man was in fact intoxicated, and further, that he had a stay-away order which prohibited him from frequenting 3rd and Newcomb. The man was booked at Bayview Station for violation of the court order and public intoxication (041 141 348).

On October 6, at 2:40 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the 2400 block of San Bruno Avenue on the report of a robbery. The victim told officers that he was walking south on San Bruno Avenue toward his business when a suspect approached him and pulled a silver semi-auto handgun from his waistband and placed it to the victim's head. The suspect demanded the victim's money, and after the victim had given his property to the suspect, the suspect stated, "You better have more or I'll blow you away." The suspect then had the victim turn his pockets inside out and took some change from the pockets. The suspect then fled on foot. The suspect is described as a black male, 20-25, 5'8", 160, wearing a black windbreaker, white T-shirt, black nylon pants and black shoes (041 141 627).
