

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE October 4, 2004

Alice Griffith Phone

The San Francisco Housing Authority has provided Bayview Station with an additional cell phone, this one for use in the Alice Griffith (Doublerock) Development near Candlestick Park. Officer Lori Lamma, who is Bayview Station's liaison to this development, will have this phone. The number is 640-6272.

Love Parade

The Love Parade took place in the South of Market and Bayview Districts on Saturday afternoon. This event, which commemorates the fall of the Berlin wall, was peaceful and ended around 9:30 p.m. The Bayview portion of the event took place on Terry Francois Boulevard in the northern part of the district.

Drug Free Zones

All of our Drug Free Zone signs have been placed around the district at our most troubled corners. We will be meeting with representatives from the District Attorney's office this week to discuss the protocol we will be following to ensure that these cases are prosecuted.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 1, at 9:27 a.m., Bayview officers were surveilling the unit block of Latona when they saw a man make two sales of crack cocaine to two local purchasers. Back-up officers moved in and arrested the seller and brought him to Bayview Station (both buyers had fled). A search of the man at Bayview Station revealed that he had hidden a quantity of marijuana in his crotch area, and a baggie containing crack cocaine in his rectum. The officers, I assume while wearing latex gloves, booked all of the evidence and charged the man, living on the 1900 block of Palou, with two counts of sales of crack cocaine, one count of possession of crack for sale, and one count of possession of marijuana (041 124 463).

On October 1, at 1:04 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were working on the unit block of Latona when they arrested a man for possession of crack cocaine and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (041 125 085).

On October 1, at 1:40 p.m., Bayview officers took custody of a man from store security at 345 Williams for shoplifting. The man, living on the 1200 block of Quesada, was charged with petty theft with a prior (041 125 201).

On October 1, at 4:00 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on the 1700 block of Newcomb, for domestic violence against his girlfriend (041 126 152).

On October 1, at 9:43 p.m., Bayview officers were handling an accident at Oakdale and Newhall when they heard shots being fired from the area of LaSalle and Newhall. The officers responded to the area and found a parked

vehicle with its windows shot out, and found numerous shell casings in the street. Numerous witnesses at the scene refused to provide to any information (041 126 710).

On October 2, at 1:23 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the Club Cocomo at 650 Indiana on the report of a stabbing. The victim and his brother, who are from Union City, stated that they were inside the club and had told others in the club that they were from Union City, and a group of approximately 20 Filipino males started shouting out, "Frisco." The victim and his brother then saw a fight break out, and when the victim went to get a closer look he was stabbed from behind (seven times) by an unknown suspect (041 127 326).

On October 2, at 12:35 p.m., a Bayview officer responded to the 1100 block of Fitzgerald on the report of a family disturbance. The officer found a man and a woman (brother and sister) engaged in a verbal altercation, and the man was bare chested and was yelling obscenities at the woman. The officer determined that the man was drunk and placed him under arrest. The officer then interviewed the sister and her grandmother, the latter stating that her grandson was "acting like a maniac" and had torn up her home and then assaulted her, prior to fleeing into the street when he saw her calling the police. The man, living on the 1100 block of Fitzgerald, was booked for battery, public drunkenness, and threatening a police officer (he threatened to "get" the officers who had to transport him to SFGH for a medical clearance after the paramedics determined he was too violent to be transported by ambulance) 041 128 114.

On October 2, at 1:00 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 100 block of Venus Street on the report of an auto boost in progress. As the officers arrived on Venus they saw a man matching the description given by Dispatch and detained him. The man became combative and accused the officers of being racist, and then challenged the officers to hit him so that he could sue the city. The owner of the vehicle then came out of his home and identified the detained man as the individual he had seen breaking into his son's car. The detained man was placed under arrest and then threatened to beat the officers. A check of the arrestee's rap sheet revealed that he had been charged in ten prior incidents involving threats and assaults against police officers. The man, when being booked, also threatened to kill the victim / witness, and again threatened to kill the officers. He was booked for the threats against the officers, the threats against the victim, and the original auto boost charges (041 129 203).

On October 2, at 2:03 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on the 100 block of Westpoint Road, for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with possession of crack cocaine for sale and possession of marijuana for sale (041 128 421).

On October 2, at 3:34 p.m., Bayview officers responded to 3rd and Revere on the report of an auto boost in progress. The officers saw two men standing outside the "VIP Club" who matched the description given for the suspects. The officers detained the suspects and were then approached by the caller, who described to the officers that he had seen the suspects break out the window of a truck and then remove its contents. The witness also saw the suspect then pass the stolen items to a second set of suspects who were

driving by. The first suspect, living on the 1100 block of Visitacion, was booked for auto burglary and conspiracy. The second suspect, living on the 1500 block of Newcomb, was booked for the same charges. A third suspect, living on the unit block of Latona, had walked by while the officers were conducting their investigation and was booked for an outstanding warrant (041 128 788).

On October 2, at 8:39 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a woman, living on the 1400 block of Quesada, at 4700 3rd Street for an outstanding arrest warrant (041 129 427).

On October 2, at 9:38 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 3rd and Palou when they made a traffic stop on a vehicle with no front license plate. The officers determined that the passenger was on probation, and a subsequent probation search revealed a large amount of crack cocaine on his person. The passenger, living on the 1500 block of Palou, was arrested and charged with possession of crack cocaine for sale (041 129 554).

On October 2, at 10:54 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man at 1600 McKinnon as a parolee at large (wanted as a parole violator) 041 129 689.

On October 3, at 1:21 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on the 100 block of Northridge Road when they saw a man walking down the street wearing no shirt and covered with blood. The officers went to approach the man and he threatened to fight them both. The officers continued their approach and the man reached into his back pocket and got into a fighting stance. The officers arrested the man, who was very intoxicated, and removed him from the area since a crowd had now gathered around them. The man, living on the 100 block of Northridge, was booked for public drunkenness and resisting arrest (041 130 238).

On October 3, at 3:57 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Thornton and Latona when they saw a vehicle driving very slowly down the street. Note that there have been numerous acts of violence, including shootings and a murder in this area in the past few weeks. The officers stopped the vehicle and determined that the driver was on felony probation, and the officers performed a probation search of the driver and the vehicle. The driver was wearing a bullet-resistant vest and was carrying approximately \$600.00 in currency. Additionally, a fully loaded ammunition clip was found in the glove compartment. The driver was arrested for the ammunition (which is illegal for a felon to possess), and violation of probation. The man arrested lives on the 6600 block of 3rd Street (041 130 341).

On October 3, at 11:40 a.m., Bayview officers were surveilling the area of Fitzgerald and Jennings when they saw a man selling crack cocaine to others in the area. The officers arrested the seller and charged him with sales of crack cocaine. In addition, the man was also charged with violation of probation. Note that he is on probation for selling crack cocaine at Fitzgerald and Jennings. So much for learning his lesson. The man, living on Coral Court, is on parole for robbery and was also charged with violation of his parole (041 131 377).

On October 3, at 5:25 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol near Newcomb and Mendell when they saw two men standing near the Joe Lee Gym. The

officers knew both men and had received information from our Gang Task Force that one of the men was carrying a firearm. As the officers approached the man they believed to be armed, the second man began to "back-pedal" and then suddenly began to run away toward 3rd and Oakdale. The man was holding his hands near his waistband, and as he continued to run, the officers saw him drop a handgun to the pavement. The man made good his escape and the officers recovered the handgun. A check of the handgun revealed that it had been reported stolen last month. The man who fled is wanted for various gun charges as well as possession of stolen property. Although the man gives an address in San Leandro, he spends most of his time in the Bayview and "hangs out" at the Joe Lee Gym. Bayview officers have been provided with his mugshot and description (041 132 030).

On October 3, at 7:45 p.m., Bayview officers visited a residence on the 1600 block of Quesada looking for the suspect who had dropped a stolen gun while running from the police. The address they visited is where an associate of the wanted suspect stays, and is very close to where the wanted suspect was lost by Bayview officers. The associate, a 17 year old young man, was not home, but his aunt (owner of the home) allowed the officers to search the home for him. The officers found and seized a semi-auto handgun in the nephew's room and booked it as evidence (041 132 228).

On October 3, at 8:13 p.m., two men were walking back to their parked auto at Egbert and Hawes following the 49er game and were suddenly surrounded by six males, one of whom displayed a handgun and demanded their wallets. The victims handed their currency over to the suspects, who then fled on foot toward the Alice Griffith Development. The suspects are described as black males, 17-18, dark clothing (041 132 331).
