Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 28, at 10:58 a.m., a Bayview officer was on patrol at Tocoloma and Blanken Streets when he was flagged down by a man who told the officer that he had just been threatened by a man with a bat. The victim told the officer that the suspect, while waving a bat, had asked him what he "claimed." The officer began to search the area for the suspect, and found a man matching the description given at Tunnel and Blanken. The officer began to approach the suspect and could see that he was concealing something under his jacket. The officer detained the suspect and found that he was concealing a "lawn chair bag" which contained a wooden baseball bat. The bat was inscribed, "DRAGON BROTHERHOOD GANGSTER CRIP." The officer asked the suspect what he claimed, and he responded, "Crips." The suspect further clarified his affiliation by stating that he was from the "Balboa Crips," referencing Balboa High School. The suspect told the officer that his mother had just kicked him out of their house because he had been fighting with his girlfriend, and as he walked away, he came across the victim. The suspect stated that he had only used his bat in self-defense, because the victim had waved a stick at him. Note that no stick was found in the area. The suspect, living on Gillette Street, was booked for terrorist threats, gang affiliation, and brandishing a weapon (041 233 086).

On October 28, at 2:11 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers responded to the 1700 block of LaSalle on the report of two individuals selling drugs. The officers detained a man and a woman and ran both subjects for warrants. The woman had an outstanding warrant for her arrest, charging her with burglary and grand theft, and she was placed under arrest. The officers asked the woman if she was "holding" and drugs, and she admitted that she had secreted drugs in her underwear. A female officer at the scene recovered 51 bags containing crack cocaine from her underwear, as well as four baggies of marijuana from the same area. The officer also recovered four additional bags of crack from the woman's bra. The woman, living on the 1000 block of Connecticut, was booked for transportation and possession for sale of crack cocaine, and possession for sale of marijuana (041 234 153).

On October 28, at 3:20 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were surveilling the area of Revere and Jennings when they saw two men engaged in what they believed to be a drug sale. The officers began to approach the seller and he attempted to enter a passing car, but was prevented from doing so and

detained by the officers. The buyer immediately fled the area. The seller had two "loose clumps" of marijuana in one of his hands, and he was placed under arrest. The seller was transported to Bayview Station, and en route, was squirming a great deal in the back seat. As a result of this, the officers searched the rear seat area and located 11 bindles of heroin. The man was removed from the car and began to "yell unintelligibly," while jumping up and down. The man, living on the 1300 block of Shafter, was booked for possession of heroin for sale, possession of marijuana, and destroying evidence (041 234 363).

On October 28, at 4:59 p.m., Bayview officers took a report of a burglary from the scaffold company at 811 25th Street. The owner of the company told officers that on October 19, an employee arrived at work and found the hinges removed from the front gate to the yard. The employee also noticed that a truck was missing from the yard. The truck was returned to the yard the next day, and the employee found a wallet in the front seat of the truck belonging to another employee of the company who had quit his job ten days prior. The employee also found a piece of paper that listed a name, address, and scaffold measurements on it. The employee drove to the address and saw that the house was scaffolded, and he spoke with the owner of the house, who told him he had contracted with the ex-employee to provide the scaffolding. The ex-employee, living in Pleasanton, now works for another scaffold company (041 234 915).

On October 28, at 6:24 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Northridge and Harbor when they came across a group of approximately 20-30 individuals celebrating the birthday of a recently murdered "Big Block" gangster. As the officers drove by the group, they could hear several people shouting out, "Five-O, five-O," which is street slang for, "Our local law enforcement officers are in the area." The officers then saw one young man run up the hill toward Kiska Road, bend over near the balcony of 107 Northridge Road, and then return to the gathering. The officers went to the balcony and found a loaded firearm under a small piece of carpet. The officers then arrested the man, living on the 700 block of Kirkwood, and charged him with possession of a loaded handgun. The young man, 17 years old, was also charged with possession of stolen property (the gun was reported stolen from Fairfield, California), and possession of marijuana (041 235 048).

On October 28, at 10:20 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol near Lane and Underwood when they were flagged down by two males who were detaining a third male. The reportees told the officers that they had been inside their home when they heard a loud smash, followed by a car alarm sounding, and looked out their window to see the detained man duck down next to their parked vehicle. The reportees went outside and discovered that their vehicle's window had been smashed, and the man they had seen next to it was running away from the scene. The reportees followed the man as he ran and then saw the officers drive by and flagged them down. The suspect, living in Alameda, was booked for vandalism (041 235 781).

On October 28, at 11:46 p.m., Bayview officers made a traffic stop on a vehicle at 3rd and Newcomb because the vehicle had no rear license plate. Upon being contacted by the officers, the driver of the vehicle held his keys up in the air and told the officers he had never been issued a

license. (The driver had been previously booked for this offense and knew the procedure.) The officers arrested the driver, living on the 1600 block of Kirkwood, and during a search of his person found a quantity of powder cocaine. The officers also realized that the driver was wearing a bullet-resistant vest. The driver was booked for possession of cocaine and various vehicle code violations (041 235 963).
