Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 22, at 9:30 a.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 100 block of Kiska Road on the report of a domestic violence case. The female caller told officers that her boyfriend had punched her in the face several times for no specific reason. The female told officers that her boyfriend smokes both crack cocaine and marijuana every day, and that he has battered her numerous times in the past. The man was booked for domestic violence (041 207 451).

On October 22, at 4:17 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 3rd and Palou when they saw several men huddled together in an apparent drug transaction. The officers began to approach the men and they all began to run away in different directions. One of the men was attempting to place an object into his mouth, and as the officers got closer to him, he dropped it to the ground and continued fleeing. The officers detained the man and retrieved the dropped object, which was determined to be tar heroin. An additional quantity of powder heroin was found in the man's pockets, and he was booked for possession of heroin (041 209 162).

On October 22, at 8:55 p.m., Bayview officers interviewed a man (through an interpreter) reporting that he had been robbed. The man told officers that he was walking home and passed the corner of Revere and Roblee when he was approached by a male suspect holding a black revolver. The suspect placed the gun to the victim's abdomen and then went through the victim's pockets, removing his property. The suspect then fled on foot. The suspect is described as a Hispanic male, 17-18, 5'0", 140, medium complexion, wearing a dark ball cap, dark gray jacket and dark jeans (041 210 551).

On October 23, at 2:10 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Bayshore and Industrial when they stopped a vehicle for numerous mechanical violations and then realized that it was stolen. The driver, living in Acampo, California, was booked for stolen auto and numerous traffic violations. The passenger, living on Fulton Street, was arrested for possession of marijuana (041 211 123).

On October 23, at 6:40 a.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 1400 block of Quesada on the report of a restraining order violation. The officers interviewed the female caller, a mother in a wheelchair, who told them that her 49 year old son had tried to break down her front door to gain entry to her home. The son had a history of abusing the mother, and a restraining order had been issued prohibiting him from coming near the home. When the officers attempted to interview the son, he became enraged and told them, "I'll come here whenever the (expletive deleted) I want." The man was arrested and booked for violation of a court order (041 211 452).

On October 23, at 10:47 a.m., Bayview officers responded to an apartment on the 1000 block of Connecticut on the report of a fight. The female caller told officers that she had become angry with her brother when she found that he had urinated on the kitchen counter. The caller told her brother to clean up the mess, and he refused and became enraged. The brother picked up a stick and threatened his sister with it, prior to fleeing from the apartment when the police were called. The officers searched for the brother but did not locate him. Approximately 30 minutes later the sister phoned police again and stated that her brother had just climbed through the bathroom window and was back in the apartment. The officers responded back and arrested the brother for both the threats and for three outstanding arrest warrants charging him with both sales of crack cocaine and possession for sale of crack cocaine (041 212 228).

On October 23, at 11:05 a.m., members of our Traffic company stopped a vehicle at Palou and Newhall and were advised by Dispatch that the vehicle was wanted in connection with an attempted murder gang-related case from Berkeley, California. The man, living in Richmond, was arrested for an outstanding traffic warrant and brought to Bayview Station. Homicide detectives from the Berkeley P.D. responded to Bayview Station and took custody of the man (041 212 325).

On October 23, at 2:15 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on the 300 block of Thornton Street, at Keith and Thomas for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with sales of cocaine (040 579 231).

On October 23, at 6:55 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the first block of Cashmere on the report of a stolen auto. The caller told officers that her car had been stolen and then returned within the past thirty minutes. As the officers were examining the vehicle, a man approached them and asked, "You're not going to fingerprint the inside of that car, are you?" When the officers told the man that the car would be fingerprinted, the man became upset and told the officers that his prints would probably be found in the car, but that he hadn't actually stolen the vehicle, he had just chased down the car thief (on foot), regained possession of the car, and then returned it to the female owner. The officers were somewhat unconvinced of the veracity of the man's story and arrested him. The man was charged with stolen auto, possession of marijuana for sale, and violation of probation (041 214 218).

On October 24, at 12:41 a.m., Bayview officers responded to 19 Harbor Road on the report of a man on the ground and not moving. The officers found a male lying face up in the street with head wounds. The man was deceased

and had a single gunshot wound to his head. A witness who wished to remain anonymous told officers that two shots had been heard approximately thirty minutes prior. A van which had been speeding away from the area following the shots was later located by Ingleside officers in the Sunnydale (041 214 757).

On October 24, at 10:41 a.m. a Bayview officer was on patrol on the 1400 block of Shafter when he saw two men loitering near a home and stopped to speak with them. One of the men told the officer that his name was "Carl Brown," and also that he had been arrested in the past. The officer could find no criminal history information for this name and informed the man of the fact, and the man took off running on Shafter. The officer chased the suspect for several blocks and eventually overtook him and arrested him. The suspect's true identity was determined, and he was booked for violation of his parole, possession of narcotics paraphernalia, and resisting arrest (041 215 523).

On October 24, at 10:56 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Thornton and Latona when they saw a man loitering in front of 75 Latona Street. The man, living on the 1200 block of Oakdale, is well known to the officers as a drug user and seller, and when the officers began to approach the man, he dropped a clear plastic baggie to the sidewalk and began to walk away. The officers detained the man and retrieved the baggie, finding it to contain crack cocaine. The man was arrested and his vehicle (parked adjacent to him) was also searched. The officers realized that the vehicle being searched had just been added to the "hot sheet," and they charged the man in custody with both stolen auto and possession of crack cocaine for sale. There were two females in the parked auto, one of whom told officers that her name was "Jasmine Bennett." The officers determined that this name was fictitious, and upon obtaining her actual name, determined that she had an outstanding arrest warrant charging her with robbery (041 215 551).

On October 24, at 3:50 p.m., Bayview officers responded to 3rd and Quesada on the report of a robbery of a pizza delivery man. The victim told officers that he was delivering a pizza to the 1700 block of Quesada, and when he rang the bell for the house's front door, he received no answer. He then phoned the call-back number given, and it was no good. As the victim walked to his truck, he was approached by three young men, one of whom was armed with a gun. The man with the gun ordered the victim to turn over both the pizza and his money. The officers took the victim with them as they searched the area for the suspects, and the victim saw one of the suspects nearby and alerted the officers. The suspect, living on the 1700 block of Lane, was arrested for robbery. The gun was not recovered (041 216 480).
