Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 21, at 6:20 a.m., Bayview officers responded to Underwood and Lane on the report of a robbery in progress. When the officers arrived they found a man holding onto a female, with two additional males yelling out, "Let her go." An additional female was present, and she pointed to the female being restrained and told officers, "She took my purse, that's the girl that robbed me." The suspect was arrested, and the victim then pointed to a knife on the sidewalk and told the officers, "She used this on me." The victim told officers that she had been walking down the street when she was approached by the suspect, who was walking a dog, and the suspect displayed a knife and demanded her purse. The suspect threatened to kill the victim if she did not hand over her purse, and the suspect then ordered her dog to "jump" on the victim, and the dog knocked the victim to the ground. The suspect then began fleeing the area on foot when a man driving by realized what had happened and chased down the suspect, holding her for police. The female suspect, living on the 1300 block of Revere, admitted to officers that she had committed another robbery on October 17,

at Loomis and Industrial. The suspect was booked for robbery, aggravated assault, and an outstanding arrest warrant (041 202 633).

On October 21, at 12:52 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on the 900 block of Connecticut when they saw a man trespassing on Housing Authority property. The officers approached the man in order to issue him a citation, and found that he was in possession of both methamphetamine and narcotics paraphernalia. The man was booked accordingly (041 204 184).

On October 21, at 1:10 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on Watchman Way on the report of a domestic violence incident. The officers had been to this home on numerous prior occasions, dealing with other incidents of domestic violence. The female caller told officers that her boyfriend had battered her and then threatened to kill her. The boyfriend was gone when the officers arrived, but they responded to his place of employment and arrested him. The boyfriend was booked for domestic violence and terrorist threats (041 204 322).

On October 21, at 3:23 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers responded to 1560 Jerrold on the report of a robbery. Two victims told the officers that three individuals had attempted to rob them, and had then fled on 3rd Street. The officers placed one of the victims into their car and began to search the area. When the officers drove past 3rd and McKinnon, the victim pointed to a group of three men standing on the corner and stated, "That's them on the corner." The suspects were arrested and both victims were interviewed more thoroughly. The victims stated that they were working on a car in front of 1560 Jerrold when they were approached by the three suspects, and one of the suspects said, "Give me your money." One of the victims then told the suspects that he didn't speak English, so the suspect further clarified his demand and demonstrated his bilingual abilities by stating, "Give me your dinero." The victims told the suspects that they had no money, and the (bilingual) suspect then stated, "I have knives and guns, if you don't give me your money you are going to be in trouble." The victims apparently had some reservations regarding the credibility of the suspects' threats, and phoned the police via a cell phone. The suspects all fled on foot. Suspect one, a 19 year old male living on the 4500 block of 3rd Street, was booked for attempted robbery and conspiracy. Suspect two, a 16 year old juvenile living on the 4400 block of 3rd Street, was booked at YGC for the same charges, as well as for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with aggravated assault. Suspect three, a 15 year old juvenile living on the 1000 block of Connecticut, was booked for the same charges (041 205 057).

On October 21, at 3:45 p.m., a woman walked into the Wells Fargo Bank at 3801 3rd Street and attempted to cash a check payable to her from another individual for \$300.00. The bank employees checked the account card and realized that the signature on the check did not match the signature on the card. The bank employees contacted the person listed on the account and determined that the check was stolen and had not been issued to the woman. The woman, living on Middlepoint Road, left her ID at the bank and fled. Over the course of the next two hours, two additional persons, one male and one female, also entered the bank, and also attempted to cash \$300 checks made out to themselves from the same account. Neither individual was allowed to cash the checks, and they left the bank. If nothing else, this

trio deserves some credit for their persistence (041 205 449).

On October 21, at 5:06 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers received information from a Gang Task Force Inspector that a suspect known on the streets as "Tookey" had been seen carrying a gun in the Doublerock area. The officers were familiar with "Tookey's" actual identity. The officers searched the Doublerock area and saw Tookey near 27 Nichols Way. Upon seeing the officers, Tookey bent down near a parked car and placed something onto the ground. Tookey then walked away from the area quickly. The officers searched the area and located a loaded .357 revolver. The gun was seized and booked for both DNA and fingerprint analysis (041 205 176).

On October 21, at 5:47 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 3rd and Cargo when they saw a vehicle double-parked on 3rd Street and the vehicle's driver speaking with a passerby. The officers, via their PA system, requested that the female driver move out of the traffic lane, and the driver ignored the officers. The male passerby then got into the driver's seat of the vehicle and began to drive away. The officers then received their computer returns and realized the vehicle was stolen. The officers pulled the vehicle over and the male driver told them that the female had asked him to drive the car because she had no license. The female told officers that she had just bought the car from a man named "JD" in the Tenderloin. The "sale" had apparently not been memorialized in any formal sense, and the female had no paperwork or other documentation. The officers decided that the female's story was lacking in both detail and credibility, and she was booked for possession of a stolen auto, as well as assorted traffic offenses (041 187 712).

On October 21, at 8:15 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers arrested a man, living on the 200 block of Putnam Street, at Oakdale and Toland for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with sales and possession for sale of crack cocaine (041 206 055).

On October 21, at 11:22 p.m., Bayview officers responded to 50 Mendell on the report of an auto boosting. The officers saw a man who matched the description given via dispatch walking away from the area and they detained him. The man was found to be in possession of a backpack containing numerous pieces of personal property. The witness (caller) then approached the officers and identified the detained man as the man he had seen breaking into a nearby vehicle. The owner of the vehicle was contacted and he responded to the scene, identifying the property in the suspect's possession as his property, which had formerly been inside his (now boosted) vehicle. The man was booked for auto burglary (041 206 497).
