Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 20, at 2:00 p.m., members of our Narcotics Unit, joined by Bayview officers, served a search warrant at 4712 3rd Street, Rudy's Barbeque. The search warrant also listed a specific person and a specific vehicle to be searched. A separate search warrant was issued for the main subject's premises in San Pablo, and that warrant was also served. The suspect, living in San Pablo, was booked for possession of heroin and possession of a firearm by a felon (041 200 007).

On October 20, at 1:35 p.m., members of our Narcotics Unit, joined by Bayview officers, conducted a "buy-bust" operation near 3rd and Quesada, and one of the undercover officers purchased crack cocaine from a man selling on the corner. The man, living on the 1500 block of Kirkwood, was booked for sales of crack cocaine (041 199 773).

On October 20, at 2:00 p.m., members of our Narcotics Unit, joined by Bayview officers, served a search warrant at 2822 Jennings Street, "Quincy's Doublerock Club". Note that these premises were recently cited by ABC for illegal gaming devices and illegal sales of alcohol. The search warrant had been issued due to a sale of heroin which had occurred from the premises recently. No narcotics were found during the search (041 199 961).

On October 20, at 2:40 p.m., members of our Narcotics Unit, joined by Bayview officers, conducted a narcotics operation near 3rd and Newcomb, where they observed an individual make two sales of crack cocaine to passersby. The officers arrested the seller, living on the 1800 block of Eddy Street, for sales of crack cocaine (041 200 308).

On October 20, at 5:23 p.m., members of our Narcotics Unit, joined by Bayview officers, conducted a narcotics operation near Fitzgerald and Jennings and arrested a man with an outstanding warrant for his arrest

charging him with sales of narcotics (041 124 792).

On October 20, at 5:30 p.m., members of our Narcotics Unit, joined by Bayview officers, conducted a "buy-bust" operation in the Doublerock area of the district. The officers purchased crack cocaine from a man standing in front of an apartment on the first block of Nichols. The man, living in the unit he had been standing in front of, was booked for sales of crack cocaine (041 299 819).

On October 20, at 5:30 p.m., members of our Narcotics Unit, joined by Bayview officers, conducted a "buy-bust" operation near 3rd and Quesada, and one of the undercover officers purchased crack cocaine from a man selling in front of 1545 Quesada. After selling, the man hid the remainder of his crack in the mail slot at 1545 Quesada. The man, living on Leonard Street, was booked for sales and possession for sale of crack cocaine. He was also charged with possession for sale of marijuana (041 200 950).

On October 20, at 6:00 p.m., members of our Narcotics Unit, joined by Bayview officers, cited a man, living on Ruele Court, at 3rd and Newcomb for possession of marijuana (041 201 118).

On October 20, at 6:05 p.m., members of our Narcotics Unit, joined by Bayview officers, conducted a "buy-bust" operation near 3rd and Newcomb, and one of the undercover officers purchased crack cocaine from two men standing on the corner. (The men worked together on the sale, apparently willing to split the commission on the sale.) The first man, living on Las Villas Street, was booked for cocaine sales and an outstanding warrant charging him with burglary. The second man, living on the 1400 block of Innes, was booked for sales of crack cocaine (041 201 152).

On October 20, at 7:13 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on the 800 block of Terry Francois when they saw a man behind the barbed wire fence near the water and detained him in order to find out what he was doing. The man identified himself as "Dimitry Andropov," but the officers determined that the name was fictitious, and also that he had an outstanding arrest warrant under his actual name. The man was booked for the warrant (041 201 544).

On October 20, at 9:39 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man at Selby and McKinnon for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with drug violations (041 201 942).

On October 20, at 10:30 p.m., a woman driving at 3rd and Cesar Chavez flagged down a passing police car and told the officers that the driver behind her was "tail-gating" her. The officers pulled behind the vehicle, a black Thunderbird, and it took off at a high rate of speed. The vehicle fled to the Highway 280 on-ramp, got onto the freeway, and accelerated to approximately 100 miles per hour. The officers then notified the CHP of what had occurred, and moments later, the vehicle crashed into the freeway railing near where Highways 101 and 280 cross. The two female occupants of the vehicle were seen throwing something over the freeway railing prior to being taken into custody by officers responding to the accident scene. Additional officers retrieved the items which had been thrown and found the items to contain a "sawed-off" shotgun. The owner of the Thunderbird,

living in Antioch, was contacted and told officers that two women who had been at his home earlier had apparently stolen his vehicle. The driver of the vehicle, a 23 year old woman living on Louisburg, was booked for numerous weapons charges and stolen auto. The passenger, a 17 year old woman (sister of driver) also living on Louisburg, was booked at YGC on the same charges (041 202 025).

On October 21, at 12:26 a.m., Bayview officers made a traffic stop on a vehicle for mechanical violations and determined that the driver was wanted for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with various narcotics violations. The man, living on the 1500 block of McKinnon, was booked for the warrant and for violation of parole (041 202 235).
