Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 17, at 7:00 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the Joe Lee Gym at 1395 Mendell on the report of a bullet hole and found shell casing. The gym employee provided the officers with a spent shell casing found inside the gym when it was opened this morning, and also a bullet hole in one of the doors. The shot was apparently fired sometime after the gym had been closed for the evening (041 191 296).

On October 18, at 1:25 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Kirkwood and Mendell when they saw a validated member of the Westmob gang loitering on the corner. The officers knew that the gang member, living on Jennings Court, had failed to properly register as a convicted drug offender, and he was arrested for violation of his probation (041 191 644).

On October 18, at 1:45 p.m., Bayview officers took a report of an attempted pursesnatch from a woman who had been walking home at Sweeny and Merrill when she was approached by two suspects who tried to pull her purse from her grip but were unsuccessful. The two suspects ran to a tan vehicle and then fled the scene. The suspects are described as black males, average height, dark colored shirts (041 192 830).

On October 18, at 3:24 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at 3rd and Hollister when they saw two local drug dealers who have each been arrested recently for selling drugs on this specific corner. One was arrested September 14, and the other was arrested October 13. Searches of both men revealed varying amounts of marijuana. One man, living on the 1500 block of Shafter, was booked for simple possession and loitering for purposes of drug sales. The second man, living on the 900 block of Hollister, was booked for possession for sale of marijuana and loitering for purposes of drug sales (041 191 923).

On October 18, at 3:42 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 3rd and Newcomb when they saw a woman they knew to be the subject of a court-issued stay away order. The officers arrested the woman for the violation of the court order and also for an outstanding arrest warrant (040 894 299).

On October 18, at 4:45 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the Walgreen's at 5300 3rd Street on the report of a shoplifting suspect who was resisting arrest (by the security guards). The security told the officers that they had seen a man and woman enter the store together, and had then seen the woman fill her purse with various items. The man had then departed the store, followed by the woman. The store security then stopped the woman and asked for the stolen items back, and the man grabbed the security guard from behind in a "bear hug" and yelled out, "let her go." the woman then kicked the security guard in the groin and the two of them had a tug of war over her purse, which fell to the ground, spilling its stolen contents onto the floor. Both suspects then began to flee from the store, but stopped long enough to steal several umbrellas from a display near the store's front door. The security guard again approached the female, who again kicked him in the groin and then punched him in the nose. Bayview officers arrived at this time and took both suspects into custody. The female suspect, living on the 1000 block of Ingerson, was booked for strongarm robbery and an outstanding warrant charging her with petty theft with a prior. The man was cited for petty theft and battery (041 192 363).

On October 18, at 5:10 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living in Suisun City, at 1087 Oakdale for violation of his parole (041 192 567).

On October 18, at 5:33 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a validated gang member, living on the 1000 block of Connecticut, at Harbor and Northridge for loitering for the purposes of selling narcotics (041 192 523).

On October 18, at 6:15 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 1700 block of LaSalle on the report of an aggravated assault. The officers met with the female caller who was bleeding from a large cut on her lower lip. The woman told the officers that she had met the suspect the prior day downtown, and they had decided to "have a little fun," and had caught a bus to the Bayview together. Today, the victim and suspect began drinking together (they were both intoxicated when speaking with the officers) and an argument had ensued. The male then punched the female because, "She started acting like she was running the house." The woman was transported to the hospital for treatment of her injuries, and once there, she refused to cooperate any further with the officers. Due to the severity of the injury to the woman, the male was charged with felony assault (041 192 965).

On October 18, at 11:14 p.m., Bayview officers made a traffic stop on a vehicle on the 1700 block of Revere Avenue for a traffic violation. The driver had no driver's license and no identification and when the officers asked him for his name, he replied, "Frederick Gibson," but he could not provide his birthdate, saying that he had forgot it due to nervousness. The officers became somewhat suspicious and placed the man under arrest as an unlicensed driver. A search of the vehicle revealed a bottle of 41 pills of suspected "ecstasy." The officers determined the man's real name and booked him for the drug charges (possession for sale of ecstasy) and the vehicle code violations. Note that the officers also found a cell phone in the vehicle, and one of the entries on the phone was for a person named "client" (041 193 587).

On October 18, at 11:56 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a juvenile male at 3rd and Quesada for an outstanding arrest warrant (041 193 678).
