Halloween Update

Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 13, at 1:30 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 1400 block of Shafter on a domestic violence call. The female caller told the officers that her boyfriend, living five houses down from her, had just battered her at his home and then refused to allow her to leave. The boyfriend then took and hid her clothing and purse, so that she could not leave. The victim, after about two hours, found a pair of sweatpants and fled to her home, where she called police. The officers responded to the boyfriend's home and found him in possession of his girlfriend's clothing and purse. The boyfriend was booked for false imprisonment, domestic violence and possession of methamphetamine (041 117 078).

On October 13, at 1:33 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Fitzgerald and Jennings when they saw what they believed to be a drug transaction. The officers approached the two men involved in the transaction and eventually arrested them both. One man, living on Alemany, was booked for possession of codeine. The second man, living on the 1400 block of Thomas, was booked for possession of heroin (041 171 715).

On October 13, at 3:46 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on the 700 block of Missouri when they saw two men loitering near a building. The men, upon seeing the officers, split up and began to quickly walk away from the area. The officers

stopped both men and determined that one of them was on parole. A parole search of the man revealed crack cocaine in his pocket. The man, living on Buena Vista, was booked for possession of crack and violation of parole (041 172 224).

On October 13, at 4:34 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on the 1500 block of Revere and as the officers were driving north on the 2000 block of Keith, they saw and heard an object bounce off of their windshield, and then observed that their windshield had multiple cracks in it. There was a group of people standing on the west side of the street, and one of them then yelled out, "(Expletive deleted) you, punk ass (expletive deleted)." A 38 year old man then began to walk away from the group and repeated the already offered greeting he had shouted to the officers. The officers detained the man and were then approached by a woman who identified herself as the man's mother. The mother told the officers that the object which had broken their windshield was her son's cell phone, which he had just thrown at their vehicle. The mother went on to tell the officers that her son has bullet fragments in his skull and that he frequently becomes enraged and uncontrollable when he misses his medication. The officers arrested the man and went to place him in their vehicle, and he then kicked the arm rest off of the vehicle's rear door. The mother could offer no explanation for her son's behavior, other than to say that he suddenly became enraged upon seeing the passing police car. The man, living on the 2000 block of Keith, was booked for a psych hold (041 172 462).

On October 13, at 4:48 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol in the area of Palou and Griffith when they saw a man standing in front of 1080 Oakdale whom they knew to be an active member of the "Oakdale Mob" gang. The man appeared to be hiding in a bush, and the officers began to approach him. The man quickly walked away, and was detained by the officers, and when they checked the area where he had been standing, they found a hole in the adjacent wall. The officers looked into the hole and found a loaded semi-auto handgun. The officers ran a check on the gun and found it to have been stolen 10 years ago. The suspect, living on the 1000 block of Oakdale, was booked for weapons charges and for possession of stolen property (041 172 600).

On October 13, at 4:50 p.m., Bayview officers took a report from a woman who told them that on October 12, at 8:05 p.m. she was driving on Middlepoint at Westpoint when her vehicle almost collided with another vehicle. The woman pulled to the curb and the other driver pulled alongside her parked vehicle and its driver pointed a gun at her. The woman crawled out of her car, along with three other occupants of her vehicle, The suspect then fled the area in his vehicle, which is described as a 4 door green vehicle. The suspect is described as a black male, late 20's to early 30's (041 172 525).

On October 13, at 5:51 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at 3rd and Hollister when they saw two men, known to them as local drug dealers, loitering in the area. The officers stopped to speak with the men and found a jacket on the ground nearby. Underneath the jacket was a quantity of individually-packaged baggies of marijuana, and a search of the men revealed that one of them had an additional 10 baggies of marijuana in his pocket. Both suspects were arrested and charged with conspiracy to

sell marijuana. The man in possession was charged with possession for sale (041 172 666).

On October 13, at 6:01 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Fitzgerald and Jennings when they saw a man they knew to be wanted as a "parolee at large." The man was arrested and booked for a parole violation, as well as for possession of marijuana (041 172 923).

On October 13, at 6:32 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol on the 1700 block of Quesada when they saw two men consuming alcohol in public and approached them to issue citations. One man, living on the 100 block of Bayview Circle, was found to possess cocaine and was booked accordingly. The second man, living on the 100 block of Scotia, was found to have an outstanding warrant for his arrest and was booked for it (041 173 125).

On October 13, at 6:59 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on the 1500 block of Kirkwood when they arrested a man, living on the 1200 block of Gilman, for an outstanding drug arrest warrant from San Mateo County (041 178 313).

On October 13, at 7:02 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Lydia and Newhall when they saw a man they knew to be wanted drive past them. The officers made a traffic stop and arrested the man, living on the 1600 block of Quesada, for an outstanding warrant charging him with possession of a firearm by a felon (010 317 685).

On October 13, at 8:36 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 900 block of Connecticut Street on a "shots fired" call. Three shooting victims were located just north of the building at 918-946 Connecticut Street. A large crowd surrounded the victims, making it difficult for the officers and the paramedics to render aid and gather information. Numerous witnesses were present at the scene, but none of them would provide their names. More than one anonymous witness stated that the suspect had driven to and from the scene in a dark gray 4 door Honda Accord or Prelude with a "for sale" sign in the rear window. All victims were treated at SFGH and are in stable condition. At least two firearms were used in this case, one of them an assault rifle (based upon casings at the scene). The exact number of suspects, and their individual descriptions, could not be ascertained from the witnesses' statements (041 173 642).

On October 13, at 9:43 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 3rd and LaSalle when they arrested a man, living on the 4600 block of 3rd Street, for a "parolee at large" warrant (041 173 783).
