Violent Weekend

This weekend was a very violent one for the Bayview. A total of six people were shot at 3rd and Newcomb, in two separate incidents. Two of the victims have died of their wounds. Bayview officers have blanketed this area with flyers, seeking information, but as of this morning, there are no solid leads in these cases. Unfortunately, a very large number of witnesses were present at the time of the main incident (five people shot), but none of these witnesses has provided any substantive information regarding the suspects. Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 8, at 1:00 a.m., a man living on Keith Street was walking through the Doublerock Housing Development at Nichols and Cameron when he was approached by two teen-age Samoan males who asked him if he had change for a twenty dollar bill. The victim stated that he did and reached into his pocket to retrieve his money. The suspects then hit the victim several times with their fists, knocking him to the ground. Once on the ground, the suspects continued to beat the victim, prior to fleeing on foot with his property. Suspect one was a Samoan male, 16-17, 5'6", 175, wearing a dark blue shirt and white pants. Suspect two was a Samoan male, 5'8", 165, wearing a beige hat, beige sweater, beige pants and black shoes (041 150 725).

On October 8, at 8:36 a.m., Bayview officers arrested a man on the 900 block of Vermont Street for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with burglary and fraud (041 150 587).

On October 8, at 9:44 a.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on the 200 block of Ward, at San Bruno and Thornton for an outstanding arrest warrant and violation of his parole conditions (041 150 872).

On October 8, at 12:39 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 100 block of Venus with a probation officer to conduct a "probation search" of one of his probationers. The subject was found to be in possession of both packaged marijuana and an illegal weapon. The subject was booked for the new charges as well as for violation of probation (041 151 494).

On October 8, at 12:58 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on the

800 block of Oak Street, at 3rd and Revere for violation of his probation (041 151 472).

On October 8, at 6:32 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at LaSalle and Ingalls when they saw a vehicle drive past them bearing a license plate which appeared on their "hot sheet." The officers attempted to pull the vehicle over, and the driver jumped from the vehicle while it was still in gear, and it began to roll backwards toward the officers. Two additional occupants also jumped from the vehicle and fled on foot. The officers pursued the driver, who ran to the rear of 95 Beatrice, where he was finally taken into custody after resisting the officers' attempts to place him under arrest. The 19 year old driver, living on Dedman Court, was booked for stolen auto and resisting arrest (041 136 220).

On October 8, at 11:17 p.m., Bayview officers made a traffic stop on a vehicle near Thornton and Latona for a mechanical violation. The officers identified the driver and determined that she was driving on a suspended license. The officers placed her under arrest and a subsequent search of her backpack revealed crack cocaine. The woman was booked for possession of crack and a variety of traffic offenses (041 154 006).

On October 9, at 12:55 a.m., Bayview officers responded to SFGH on the report of a shooting. The victim of the shooting, a cab driver, was driving a fare north on 3rd Street at Newcomb when a man holding a gun in his hand walked across 3rd Street in front of the cab and pointed the gun at the cab driver. The cabbie turned to the right to avoid being shot and the suspect then fired 3-4 shots at the cab, striking the cab driver once in the shoulder. The cab driver then drove himself to SFGH. The officers examined the cab and found it to have three bullet holes in it. The suspect is described as a black male, 25-30, 5'10", 160, medium build, wearing a black ski cap, black jacket and black pants. The cab driver was treated for a single gunshot wound to his shoulder (041 154 200).

On October 9, at 1:53 a.m., Bayview officers took a report of a residential robbery and burglary on the 100 block of Dakota Street. The victims, two women, had returned home to find a total of six armed men in their home. The men threatened the women with the guns and demanded their property. The first woman gave the men her currency and her gold teeth. The second woman had no property to give. The suspects are described as six black males, 20-30, wearing dark coats pulled up over their faces and dark pants (041 115 457).

On October 9, at 1:00 p.m., Bayview officers took a report of a robbery from two teen-age victims who were walking down a dirt trail leading to the 700 block of Connecticut Street. The victims were suddenly approached from the rear by two suspects who punched them and knocked them to the ground. The suspects took the victims' property and then fled into the nearby housing development. Both suspects are described as black males, 16 years, wearing orange construction vests over white T-shirts and blue pants (041 155 634).

On October 9, at 4:14 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Thornton and Latona when they saw a man known to them from the area displaying crack cocaine in his hand to another man. The officers

approached the man, who is currently on probation from a drug case and is scheduled to report for drug diversion next month, and placed him under arrest. The man, living on the 1500 block of Innes, was booked for possession of crack cocaine (041 156 171).

On October 9, at 8:35 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 1800 block of Egbert on domestic violence call. The officers interviewed the caller, who stated that her boyfriend had been drinking all day in celebration of his birthday and was fairly liquored up. The caller stated that a man then phoned her residence (looking for her sister) and her boyfriend answered the phone and mistakenly concluded that the man was calling for her. The boyfriend became angry and started to choke the victim, and then threw a knife across the room at her. The boyfriend then told both women to leave the house, and when they did, he began to throw their clothing out of a window. The girlfriend phoned the police and the boyfriend fled. The responding officers located the boyfriend several blocks away and booked him for domestic violence and aggravated assault (041 156 892).

On October 9, at 8:55 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a 17 year old female at 3rd and Newcomb for two outstanding arrest warrants. The girl was listed as a runaway from Modesto and was taken to the Youth Guidance Center (041 157 038).

On October 9, at 9:00 p.m., a man parked his vehicle at 3rd and Shafter and allowed his "cousin" to sit in it. The man returned to the vehicle later and drove it away, and upon getting home, realized that his grip was missing from the vehicle's trunk. The grip had contained a firearm and ammunition. The man suspects that his cousin stole the firearm, but he refused to provide his cousin's name to the officers, stating that he was a "bad guy," but that he didn't want to get a family member in trouble (041 163 007).

On October 9, at 10:49 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man at Fitzgerald and Jennings for two outstanding arrest warrants, and during a subsequent search of the man, located a quantity of crack cocaine. The man was booked for possession of crack cocaine and the outstanding warrants (041 157 226).

On October 9, at 11:03 p.m., a woman was depositing a large amount of currency into an ATM machine at San Bruno and Silver when she was approached by two suspects who placed a small handgun to her back and told her to, "Break yourself." The victim dropped the deposit to the ground and the suspects picked it up and ran away with it. The suspects are described as two males wearing all black clothing and ski masks (041 157 248).

On October 10, at 1:15 a.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the first block of Carr Street on the report of a person screaming for help. The officers found a 60 year old male in the bedroom being treated by paramedics. The officers interviewed family members at the scene and learned that the man being treated had been involved in a fight with his son, who had come home under the influence of drugs. The son had initially been in a fight with his sister and, when the father came to intervene, the son beat him and knocked him down. The son kicked the father in the head and then fled the home. The father died of his injuries, and the son was

later tracked to the Sunnysdale by the officers and arrested for murder (041 157 668).

On October 11, at 12:01 a.m., numerous Bayview units responded to 3rd and Newcomb on the report of shots being fired. When the officers arrived, they found a total of five victims who had been shot. All of the victims were eventually transported to SFGH, and two of them expired at the hospital. Although a crowd of approximately fifty persons was present at the shooting incident, little information was provided to the officers. As the officers attempted to tape off the crime scene, the crowd turned on the officers and prevented them from securing the scene. The crowd also prevented the late arriving medical assistance from rendering aid to the victims. The scene was eventually brought under control and taped off. Numerous shell casings were found on two separate corners. A smaller, white vehicle may have been at the scene and may be involved. A "cherry colored" vehicle resembling an Impala may also have fled the scene right after the shooting. Later in the day, Bayview officers handed out flyers in the area seeking information. As of October 12, there are no solid leads in the case, and none of the approximately fifty witnesses present at the time the shooting occurred have provided any substantive information (041 160 893).

On October 11, at 9:25 a.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on Cameron Way on the report of a trespasser. Upon arrival, the officers saw three males fleeing the back door of the premises holding various items. The officers ordered the suspects to "stop," and one of them did, dropping numerous DVD's to the ground. The two additional suspects ran into the premises adjacent to the subject property. The officers ran to the front door of the second premise, just as the suspects were attempting to exit, and both suspects were taken into custody. The first suspect, who had temporarily stopped and dropped several DVD's to the ground, was gone when the officers returned to the original scene. The two suspects in custody are both juveniles and were booked for burglary and possession of stolen property. Note that this development has had a rash of daytime burglaries over the past few months (041 161 625).

On October 11, at 12:40 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers arrested a man at Westpoint and Middlepoint for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with possession of crack cocaine for sale (041 173 639).

On October 11, at 1:53 p.m., Bayview officers saw a man on the 1100 block of Thomas who they recognized as having a court ordered stay-away order from the area. The officers detained the man and found him to possess both crack cocaine and narcotics paraphernalia. The man was booked for the new charges as well as the stay-away order violation (041 162 532).

On October 11, at 3:28 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on the first block of Westpoint, at Westpoint and Middlepoint for an outstanding arrest warrant (041 910 005).

On October 11, at 4:53 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers arrested a man, living in Richmond, on the 1300 block of Palou for possession for sale of marijuana and for an outstanding arrest warrant (041 163 289).

On October 11, at 6:23 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a woman, living on the first block of Latona, in front of her home for an outstanding arrest warrant charging her with possession of crack cocaine for sale (040 843 387).

On October 11, at 7:15 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on the 1200 block of Quesada, at Thornton and Latona for possession of narcotics paraphernalia and loitering for purposes of buying drugs (041 164 209).

On October 11, at 7:31 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at 3rd and Newcomb when they saw a man exiting the liquor store. The officers had prior knowledge that the man had a court ordered stay-away order preventing him from coming near the area, and he was arrested and charged with violation of this order (041 164 055).

On October 11, at 8:31 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Westpoint and Middlepoint when they saw a group of "Westmob" gangsters hanging on the corner. The officers had prior knowledge that one of the men had a court ordered stay-away order preventing him from coming near the area, and the man was arrested and charged with violation of a court order (041 164 180).

On October 12, at 12:29 a.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on the 1000 block of Keyes, for violation of a domestic violence restraining order (041 165 053).

On October 12, at 1:01 a.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living in Sacramento, at 3rd and Revere for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with possession of stolen property (041 165 097).

On October 12, at 3:24 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol near 22nd and Rhode Island when they saw a man crouching down behind a vehicle. This area experiences a great deal of auto burglaries, and when the officers attempted to approach the man to speak with him, he took off running. The officers caught and detained the man, and arrested him for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with possession of cocaine (041 165 241).

On October 12, at 3:48 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 20th and Deharo when they saw a man sleeping on the sidewalk and approached him to check on his condition. The man, living on Baker Street, could not account for his location or his activities, and a subsequent probation search of his person revealed both crystal methamphetamine and ecstasy. He was booked for both offenses (041 165 235).
