

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE October 1, 2004

#### Saturday Basketball

Tomorrow, three PAL basketball games will be played at the Milton Meyer (Hunter's Point) Gymnasium at 195 Kiska Road. As stated earlier, these are the first PAL games to be played at this gym in many years, and it is due to our presence in the gym that these games are being scheduled. Our Bayview "Lakers" team plays tonight at 5:00 p.m. at the SOMA gym. Our Bayview "Warriors" team plays tomorrow, at 10:00 a.m. at Milton Meyer.

#### Crime and Enforcement Update

On September 30, at 4:10 a.m., Bayview officers responded to 18th and Vermont on the report of a street robbery. The officers found the victim lying on the sidewalk, bleeding from a head wound, with numerous other injuries. The victim was very uncooperative and refused both to give the officers a statement and to provide them with her address and contact information. However, a witness to the incident told officers that he had seen a suspect kicking the victim's head, as she lay on the ground, and then saw the suspect take the victim's purse and flee on foot west over the 18th Street pedestrian bridge. The witness described the suspect as a male, 6'0", wearing a black overcoat and a white "newspaper boy" cap (041 119 464).

On September 30, at 9:30 a.m., Bayview officers took a report of a pursesnatch which had occurred on a Muni bus at 23rd and Wisconsin. The victim, who spoke no English, told officers through a translator that she was seated on the bus when a young man approached her, grabbed her backpack, and fled from the bus. The victim stated that the suspect was a 15-16 year old black male, 5'8", wearing a black jacket (041 120 057).

On September 30, at 12:37 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 600 block of San Bruno Avenue on a domestic violence call. The female victim was not present, but a man installing a security device in the home told officers that he was present when the husband had thrown the wife down a set of stairs. The officers were able to make contact with the wife, who had gone to the East Bay, and she stated that her husband had become angry when he thought she was speaking with the employee of the security firm. The officers took the relevant information from the wife over the phone and arrested the husband for domestic violence (041 120 900).

On September 30, at 3:30 p.m., Bayview officers interviewed a 14 year old girl who was walking home from school on Exeter at Paul when a man drove up to her in a vehicle and asked her to approach him. The man asked the girl for directions to "Bayshore," and the girl stated that she couldn't provide them. The man then unzipped his pants and exposed himself to the girl. The man then began handling himself and made additional sexual comments to the girl. The suspect then fled in his vehicle north on Exeter towards Paul, and then east on Paul toward 3rd Street. The suspect's vehicle is a newer, red, possibly American make vehicle, with gray interior. The suspect is a Hispanic male, 25-30, bushy mustache and eyebrows, wearing a brown and red polo shirt and blue jean pants. We will work with our Sex

Offender Unit on this case in an effort to identify this suspect (041 122 263).

On September 30, at 3:40 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Thornton and Latona when they saw a man they knew to be wanted for two outstanding arrest warrants charging him with a variety of offenses. As the officers approached the suspect, he dropped a rock of crack cocaine to the sidewalk, which the officers recovered. The man was arrested and additional crack, as well as narcotics paraphernalia were found in his pockets. The man, living on the 100 block of Venus, was booked for the warrant and the additional drug charges (041 121 691).

On September 30, at 3:50 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were working in the area of 3rd and Hollister when they saw numerous drug deals being conducted in front of "Jimmy's Liquors." Two sellers were eventually arrested, including a man, living in Vallejo, who was charged with three counts of sales of crack cocaine, possession for sale of crack cocaine and conspiracy. A second man, also living in Vallejo, was charged with one count of sales of crack cocaine, possession for sale of marijuana, and two counts of sales of marijuana (041 121 851).

On September 30, at 4:10 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 500 block of Connecticut Street on a "hot prowler" burglary call. The victim was home when he heard his front door open and then heard the door to his downstairs office open and close. When the victim went to his (home) office and tried to open the door, he found that he couldn't. He then heard the office window open and saw a man run down his front stairs. The suspect had pushed a file cabinet to the office door in order to prevent it from being opened, and it is likely that the file cabinet will have some latent fingerprints on it. The suspect was a black male, 25-30, 6'00", 200, "large" build, wearing a dark cap and a dark jacket with tan sleeves (041 121 839).

On September 30, at 5:30 p.m., Bayview officers took a report of an aggravated assault from a man who stated that he had been beaten by four suspects at 3rd and Palou. The victim stated that the assault took place following a confrontation with a woman who had accused him of stealing her rings. The woman, after confronting the victim, returned with three suspects (two males and a female) who beat the victim. The suspects go by the street names of, "Fernando," "Late Night," and "Sandra." The victim stated that the original female suspect is a Muni driver, and is actually just angry with him because he refuses to become romantically involved with her. This latest incident should convince him that she's the gal for him (041 122 194).

On September 30, at 5:35 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a woman, living in Redwood City, at 1335 Fitzgerald for an outstanding arrest warrant charging her with theft (041 122 285).

On September 30, at 7:13 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at 3rd and Jerrold when they saw a woman seated in a parked vehicle smoking crack cocaine. The officers arrested the woman, living on the 200 block of Cashmere, for possession of crack cocaine and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (041 122 520).

On September 30, at 9:41 p.m., Bayview officers took a report of a domestic violence incident involving a handgun. The caller stated that she had been at 3rd and Van Dyke when she was approached by her ex-boyfriend who was driving a beige Ford Explorer. The woman told officers that the man called her a variety of names and then displayed a small handgun to her. As the victim ran to a nearby pay phone, the suspect followed her and threw her to the ground. The officers went to the suspect's home on the 700 block of Delta Street and spoke with the suspect's current wife, who stated that the suspect actually has a restraining order against the victim (041 122 912).
