#### Hunter's Point Meeting

The planning subcommittee of the Mayor's Hunter's Point Shipyard Citizens' Advisory Committee will hold a meeting in the Lennar Shipyard trailer on Wednesday, November 10, from 3:00 to 5:00 p.m. to discuss design for development, open space, demolition and deconstruction, energy conservation, and other topics related to the redevelopment of the shipyard property.

#### Late Night Basketball

The Late Night Basketball program is winding down, with play-off games being played both Wednesday and Thursday of this week. The final workshop will be held tomorrow, with Swinerton Builders coming in to speak with the young men about employment in the construction industry. Following this week's play, the championship will be played next Wednesday. All games are being played at the Joe Lee Gym, Newcomb and Mendell.

#### Christmas Gifts for Bayview Kids

For over a decade, Operation Dream has provided gifts every Christmas for children living in public housing. Operation Dream is a nonprofit charitable organization (501c.3) started and maintained by San Francisco police officers. This year, Operation Dream ordered \$5,000 worth of gifts which will be given to needy children throughout the Bayview / Hunter's Point and Potrero Hill neighborhoods. We are looking to raise the funds necessary for these toys, and appreciate any donations that Bayview residents and merchants care to offer. At the monthly Potrero Hill merchant's meeting, held this morning at Goat Hill Pizza, Keith Goldstein of Everest Waterproofing & Restoration started the ball rolling by pledging \$1,000 to this worthwhile endeavor.

#### Crime and Enforcement Update

On November 5, a Bayview sergeant was in Superior Court Department 13 testifying against a validated member of the Big Block gang on a motion to revoke his probation which stemmed from a domestic violence case. Also present in court was the girlfriend of the defendant, and she testified against him in the domestic violence case. The Bayview sergeant was exiting court with the DA when the witness approached them and related that the defendant had just threatened to kill her. The sergeant memorialized the threats in an incident report and spoke with the DA regarding new charges based upon he courtroom threats (041 277 426).

On November 7, at 10:01 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were walking in the area of Newcomb and Newhall when they saw a man, know to them as a drug dealer, seated inside a parked vehicle looking down toward his hands. The officers approached and saw that the man was sprinkling white crystal powder into a marijuana joint. The officers arrested the man, living on the 1600 block of Kirkwood, for possession of marijuana and possession of methamphetamine (041 275 464).

On November 8, at 11:59 a.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were surveilling the area of Newcomb and Newhall. The officers saw a narcotics transaction take place between two men and detained both men. The buyer, living on the 1700 block of Newcomb, was searched and crack cocaine was found. The buyer was booked for simple possession of crack cocaine. The seller, living on the 200 block of Bridgeview, was arrested and his van was searched incident to the arrest. The officers found a fully loaded handgun, equipped with a high capacity magazine, on the floorboard between the two front seats of the van. A quantity of marijuana was also found, and the marijuana and firearm were both seized as evidence. The officers also searched the area where the seller had been standing, and found a baggie of crack cocaine stuffed into the mail slot at 1715 Newcomb. The officers found an additional quantity of crack cocaine inside a metallic box attached to the van's rear bumper. The seller was booked for numerous drug and weapons charges (041 277 567).

On November 8, at 1:43 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living in Fairfield, at University and Silliman for an outstanding arrest warrant (041 278 139).

On November 8, at 3:33 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on the 100 block of Middlepoint when they saw a man they knew to be wanted and took him into custody. The man, living on the 900 block of Ellsworth, was booked for the outstanding felony warrant (041 278 725).

On November 8, at 4:33 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on Turner Terrace, for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with sales of cocaine (021 008 473).

On November 8, at 6:19 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a 16 year old female, living on Euclid Street, on the 1000 block of Connecticut Street for an outstanding arrest warrant charging her with grand theft (041 279 331).

On November 8, at 9:23 p.m., Bayview officers responded to 3rd and Hollister on the report of two men dealing drugs. The officers recognized one of the men as a well known drug dealer from the area and began to approach him on foot. The man began to quickly walk away and told the officers, "(Expletive deleted) you (n word), you got nothing on me." The suspect then began to run and the officer pursued him. The suspect ran for several blocks and attempted to jump into a backyard, but was scared away by a large dog in the yard. The suspect then climbed under a parked truck and was taken into custody. The suspect, living on the 900 block of Hollister, was booked for transportation of cocaine and delaying an officer (041 279 999).

On November 9, at 2:47 a.m., Bayview officers were addressing myriad issues at a large homeless encampment at Cargo and Amador Streets when they saw a man seated on a motorcycle talking to two additional men who appeared to be hiding behind a parked van. The officers could see a set of bolt-cutters protruding from the backpack being worn by the first subject. Note that this area (mainly the storage business) has been plagued by burglaries recently, and the officers became suspicious upon seeing the bolt-cutters. The officers ran the license of the motorcycle and found it to be stolen,

and as they ordered the subject to dismount, he attempted to start the motorcycle in an apparent attempt to flee. The man, living on the 2100 block of Leavenworth, was arrested and charged with possession of a stolen vehicle and possession of burglary tools. The officers searched the suspect's backpack and found numerous burglary tools, including a flashlight, pliers, two pry bars, wire cutters, and a spark plug (burglars use the ceramic portion of spark plugs to break out vehicle windows) 041 270 602.
