Crime and Enforcement Update

On July 29, a local gangster (past address on Dedman Court) was arrested on a Ramey (probable cause) warrant for a Bayview homicide and charged with murder. Unfortunately, the man was released from custody several days later due to a lack of evidence. The man left the district, but we received information last week that he was back in the Bayview and was armed with a qun. On November 3, Bayview officers met with the man's parole agent and devised a plan to surveil him in order to determine if he was armed. The man was called in by his parole agent for a meeting, and the Bayview officers picked up his trail as he left the parole office. man was seen walking between two buildings on the 1600 block of Howard Street, and he returned to the street within seconds. The officers noticed that the man appeared very nervous as he walked away, and kept looking back over his shoulders. The man walked, and then traveled by bus, to a check cashing store at 20th and Mission Streets. As the man was entering the store, the officers detained him and patted him down, and located a loaded and concealed handgun in his jacket pocket. The man, upon being arrested, told officers that he needed the gun for protection. The officers discovered that the gun was reported stolen from Nashville, Tennessee. man was booked for possession of a loaded and concealed handgun, possession of stolen property, and violation of parole. Although it is unlikely that the man will be recharged locally with the murder, we are charging the new

gun case in the federal courts, where he is likely to receive a substantial prison sentence $(041\ 259\ 913)$.

On November 3, at 10:15 a.m., a Bayview officer was flagged down at Illinois and Army by a Mitchell Brothers construction worker who reported the following. The worker was driving his construction truck on 3rd Street and was stopped for a red light, when a vehicle pulled up alongside him, and the driver exited the vehicle and removed a power chop saw from the Mitchell Brother's truck bed. The suspect then re-entered his own vehicle and drove away. (Perhaps he thought it was a free sample.) The Mitchell employee described the suspect and vehicle to the officer, and accompanied the officer as they searched the area for the suspect. They located the vehicle in the driveway of 880 Marin Street, and the officer began to search the adjacent buildings. As the officer entered the building at 888 Marin Street, he saw a man who matched the description given of the suspect, and the man immediately took off running. The officer pursued the suspect on foot down Marin to Michigan, down Michigan to Army, and then to 25th and Illinois, where the suspect jumped over a fence into an empty Muni lot. The suspect then climbed up the side of a trailer and proned out on the top of the trailer. The officers at the scene arrested the man and booked him for grand theft, resisting arrest, and traffic offenses (041 258 147).

On November 3, at 2:23 p.m., Bayview officers took a report of an auto boost which had just occurred on the 1600 block of Kirkwood. The victim told officers that he heard his vehicle alarm sound and then saw a man standing next to his vehicle. The victim noticed that his window was smashed and he yelled at the suspect, who then ran away west on Kirkwood. The suspect is described as a black male, 35, 5'8", wearing a red baseball cap and blue jacket (041 259 311).

On November 3, at 3:40 p.m., Bayview officers responded to San Bruno and Mansell as back-up officers for a Traffic motorcycle lieutenant who was calling for assistance. The lieutenant had chased down a suspect in an aggravated assault case and was detaining him as the Bayview officers arrived. The victim, whose face was covered with blood, told officers that he was on a bus with the suspect (they are both students at Burton High School), and the suspect had told him to stop looking at him. The suspect then punched the victim in the face, resulting in a deep laceration over his eye which required stitches. The suspect, 15 years old and living in Daly City, was booked for aggravated assault at YGC (041 259 731).

On November 3, at 4:00 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers arrested a man, living on the 700 block of Missouri, for possession of crack cocaine, and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (041 259 797).

On November 3, at 6:53 p.m., Bayview officers took a report of a street robbery from a 16 year old male who stated that he was walking home on Rebecca when a man suddenly blocked his path and demanded his money. The victim told the suspect that he had no money, and the suspect then knocked him to the ground and removed his shoes. The suspect attempted to take the victim's CD player, but was scared off by a passing vehicle. The suspect is described as a black male, 19-20, 5'10", 170, short "twistie-braided" hair, camouflage baseball cap and camouflage jacket (041 260 330).

On November 3, at 7:19 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers approached a man seated in a car with no license plates on the 1500 block of Kirkwood. The officers asked the man for the name of the vehicle's owner, and he told them that his uncle owned the car. When the officers asked the man for his uncle's name, he stated that he didn't know it. The officers found this somewhat suspicious and started to doubt the veracity of the man's statements. The officers located three bags of marijuana in the vehicle, and an additional bag containing crack cocaine. The man, living on Cashmere, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale and possession of crack cocaine for sale (041 260 283).

On November 3 at 10:40 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the first block of Westpoint Road on a domestic violence in progress call. As the officers arrived at the scene, they saw a man walking away who matched the description given via dispatch of the suspect. Dispatch also advised the officers that the man was "armed with a hammer." The officers asked the man to stop so that they could interview him, and he took off running through the cuts of the development. The officers pursued the man on foot for several blocks and finally caught up to him in a backyard on Cashmere Street. The officers attempted to place the man into custody, and he resisted violently, swinging his arms at the officers, and kicking at them as well. Numerous officers had responded to the area due to the length of the foot pursuit and now responded into the backyard area to assist in the arrest, and as they arrived, a 41 year old woman (mother of the suspect), opened her back door and threw a bottle containing clear fluid at the officers. The fluid contacted the facial areas of five officers, and the eyes of two of the officers. The officers immediately felt a painful burning in their eyes and began to look for water to flush (the still unknown) liquid from their eyes. The man was taken into custody and disarmed (he was still in possession of the hammer). The officers then attempted to arrest the woman, and she too resisted violently. The woman was eventually taken into custody, and she told the officers that she had "only thrown a little bleach." The woman then told the officers that they had overreacted after she had thrown bleach in her eyes, and that was why she was "...out there shooting cops..." The woman went on to state that she, "...still wants to shoot the police." The woman, living on Cashmere, was booked for numerous counts of assault with a caustic chemical and other related charges. The woman's son, 24 years old and living on Westpoint Road, was booked for domestic violence, aggravated assault, violation of probation, and resisting arrest. The man had seriously beaten his girlfriend prior to fleeing his home and being chased by the arriving officers. The officers were treated at SFGH for their injuries and were later released from the hospital (041 261 015).
