

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE November 2, 2004

ROSES

Bayview's monthly ROSES meeting will be held this Thursday, at 7:00 p.m., at the Southeast Community Facility, 1800 Oakdale Avenue.

IMPACT

The California Highway Patrol will be returning to the Bayview District this Saturday, November 6, to conduct traffic enforcement as part of their IMPACT program. This traffic enforcement program, which has taken place twice previously in the Bayview District, has been used in numerous California cities and normally results in a number of arrests and citations. The hours for this Saturday's operation will be 7:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 31, at 2:42 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 2100 block of Quesada on the report of an unwanted guest. The female caller told the officers that her boyfriend was drunk and sleeping on the couch and she wanted him to leave. The officers spoke with the boyfriend and discovered that he had an outstanding warrant for his arrest. He was booked at Bayview Station (041 245 677).

On October 31, at 11:56 p.m., a Bayview officer was on patrol at 3rd and Revere when he saw a vehicle run a red light and pulled the vehicle over in order to issue a citation. While the officer was citing the driver for the violation, the passenger stepped out of the vehicle and spoke with the officer, and it was determined that the passenger had an outstanding narcotics arrest warrant. The passenger, living on the 1600 block of Yosemite, was booked for the warrant (041 247 225).

On November 1, at 10:30 a.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 1600 block of Palou on the report of a false imprisonment, attempted extortion case. The female caller, who was inebriated and had facial injuries, told officers that she had allowed an acquaintance and his girlfriend to stay in her home, and they had subsequently attacked her. The victim stated that the two suspects punched her, forced her into her bathroom, tied her hands and feet with an extension cord, placed a sock in her mouth and a shirt over her head. The suspects then began to threaten another man, whom the victim had also allowed to stay in her home, ordering him to obtain some money from his bank. The suspects then left the premises with the male victim, and the female victim then threw a bottle through her front window in order to call for help. The bottle method of alerting the authorities proved unsuccessful, and the victim then phoned the police. The male suspect is described as a black male, 40-45, 5'6", 160, first name of "Dario." The female suspect is described as a black female, 5'2", 140, short natural, first name of "Mika" or "Miko." 041 249 271

On November 1, at 2:44 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 1500 block of Kirkwood on the report of shots fired into a business. The

victim told officers that he returned to work and noticed several bullet holes in the roll-up garage door for the business. The officers determined that the shots were probably connected to a shots fired call from October 30 which was reported on Kirkwood between 3rd and Mendell (041 243 546).

On November 1, at 4:25 p.m., Bayview officers responded to 20 Doublerock on a trespasser call. The officers entered what was supposed to be a vacant unit and found a man sleeping on the floor. The man provided the officers with a name, which the officers later determined to be fictitious. The man, living on the 1000 block of Palou, was booked for trespassing, possession of narcotics paraphernalia, providing a fictitious name, and violation of parole (041 250 701).

On November 1, at 5:13 p.m., a woman living on Westpoint Road told responding officers that her husband had just stolen money from her purse and had then fled from their apartment. The woman stated that her husband had asked her for money, and that when she had refused to give him any, he pushed her down, grabbed her purse, removed the currency from inside the purse, and fled from the apartment. The woman told officers that there have been several incidents of domestic violence in the past, and she wished to pursue the case criminally this time (041 251 129).

On November 1, at 5:30 p.m., a man responded to Bayview Station and told officers that his wife had just beaten him and pepper-sprayed him. The victim told officers that he had been sitting inside a parked vehicle at 100 Westpoint with his friend "Bobcat," when his wife approached him and demanded money. The wife then punched him several times in the head and pepper-sprayed him. A second set of officers were in the station on a follow-up investigation from the 5:13 p.m. incident listed above, and they arrested the man at the station and charged him with robbery (041 251 129).

On November 1, at 5:29 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Evans and Phelps when they saw a man riding a bicycle and recognized the man as being wanted for an outstanding narcotics arrest warrant. The officers stopped the man and verified his warrant, and found it to be the fifth bench warrant issued in this case. The man, living on the 1400 block of Revere, is apparently not taking this court business too seriously (030 889 410).

On November 1, at 8:15 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1200 block of Egbert of the report of an assault. The victim told officers that he had just exited the bus at 3rd and Fitzgerald and was walking past Ingalls and Egbert when he was approached by three suspects who grabbed him and dragged him to the middle of the street. The suspects demanded the victim's money, and when he told them he had none, they beat and kicked him. Suspect one is a Samoan female, 12-13, 5'3", 120, wearing a white long-sleeve shirt and blue jean pants. Suspect two is a Samoan male, 5'6", 140, wearing a green shirt and blue pants. Suspect three is a Samoan male, 5'10", 170, wearing a blue shirt and baggy blue jeans. The victim stated that he recognized all three suspects from the neighborhood (041 251 771).

On November 1, at 9:05 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 2500 block of San Bruno Avenue on the report of a strong-arm street robbery. The officers interviewed the victim through a Cantonese interpreter. The victim was waiting for a the bus in front of 2501 San Bruno Avenue when he

was approached by two juvenile suspects. The victim stated that one of the suspects "bumped" him while the other suspect removed his wallet. Both suspects then fled and the victim phoned police. Suspect one is described as a Hispanic male, 17-18, 5'10", 150, wearing all black clothing. Suspect two is a Hispanic male, 5'6", 120, wearing all black clothing (041 251 878).

On November 1, at 10:59 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Ingalls and Carroll when they saw a vehicle drive past them with its headlights out. The officers stopped the vehicle and asked the driver for his license. He provided a name which the officers later determined to be his cousin's name, and then provided his own name as that of the registered owner. The officers could not verify the identity of the driver, and the driver asked the officers to phone his sister and his father, each of whom could verify his identity. Both the father and the sister attempted to describe the originally named person to the officers, and the sister eventually revealed to the officers that the man they were detaining was her cousin, and not her brother. The man, living on Coral Court, was booked for false personation and various vehicle code violations (041 252 155).
