Tip-A-Cop

Every year, law enforcement personnel from across the country support the Special Olympics in a variety of ways, including the annual Torch Run and the Tip-a-Cop event. Tip-a-Cop is a restaurant event wherein sworn peace officers become waiters and buspersons for a day, with all of their tips going toward the Special Olympics. This year's event will take place Thursday, December 2, from 11:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. at Chevy's Fresh Mex Restaurant, Stonestown Galleria, 3251 20th Avenue.

Late Night Basketball

Tomorrow night, Late Night Basketball will wrap up its season with the championship game being played between the top two finishers. The game will be played at 7:30 p.m. at the Joe Lee Gym, Newcomb and Mendell. This program has brought together players and spectators alike from across the Bayview District, and has been a great weekly event for the Bayview / Hunter's Point neighborhood.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On November 15, at 11:51 a.m., Bayview officers monitored a broadcast which described a man in a vehicle who had just brandished a firearm on the 4500 block of 3rd Street. The suspect's vehicle came back registered to the 100 block of Middlepoint Road, and the officers responded to the address provided. The officers located the vehicle parked on the street, and saw a man standing adjacent to it. The man and vehicle were searched, with no firearms located. However, the man was in possession of crack cocaine and a large amount of currency. The man, living on Fillmore Street, was booked for possession of crack cocaine (041 304 477).

On November 15, at 1:08 p.m., Bayview officers responded to an apartment on the first block of Dakota Street on a shots fired call. The caller told officers that her kitchen window had just been shot at, and the caller showed the officers the window, which appeared to have a single bullet hole in it. The caller felt that she was not the intended target of the shot and had no idea of who did the shooting (041 304 819).

On November 15, at 3:33 p.m., Bayview officers responded to Silver and Thomas on the report of a shots fired incident. Dispatch advised the responding officers that a group of 15 juveniles had just run from the scene east on Santa Fe. The officers located and detained 13 juveniles (in two groups), and contacted the caller, who verified that the officers had detained the correct individuals. One expended shell casing was found at the original scene, however, none of the 13 detained juveniles was found to possess a firearm. The juveniles were identified and released (041 305 475).

On November 15, at 3:33 p.m., Bayview officers were identifying the juveniles in the above listed case when they came across a 19 year old male who provided a name they believed to be fictitious. The officers eventually determined the young man's actual name, and found that there

were two stay-away orders issued by the courts which prevented the man from being in the area. The man, living in Union City, was booked for violation of a court order and providing a false name to police (041 305 710).

On November 15, at 8:20 p.m., Bayview officers took a report from a man who told them he went to the abandoned Goodman warehouse at 230 Loomis to speak with his friend, who owed him money. The friend was not happy to be asked for the money, and he struck the victim once in his rib cage with a corkscrew. The victim was treated for his injuries by an ambulance crew. The suspect, Willie Mitchell, is 50 years of age and hangs around the area of the old Goodman's Lumber yard (041 306 611).

On November 16, at 12:06 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 17th and Mississippi when they saw a vehicle drive through a stop sign without stopping and pulled the vehicle over. The driver admitted to officers that his license was suspended, and when they asked him for identification, he showed them his county jail bracelet. The man was arrested for driving with a suspended license, and the officers then determined that he was wanted for an outstanding warrant charging him with stolen auto and possession of stolen property. The man was booked for the traffic offenses and the warrant (041 307 192).

On November 16, at 2:35 a.m., Bayview officers responded to 3rd and Wallace on the report of an assault and people yelling for help. As the officers arrived, the victim approached them and pointed to a man walking into a home on the 1700 block of Wallace. The victim told the officers that the man had just assaulted her and she wanted him arrested. The officers told the man to stop, and he told the officers, "(expletive deleted) you." The officers attempted to detain the man, and he physically resisted, but was eventually controlled. The victim then told officers that she had tried to get the suspect to pay her the money he owed her, and he had balked at this, eventually smashing her vehicle's window and her cell phone to demonstrate to her that he was none too happy with the request. The suspect, living on the 1700 block of Wallace was eventually charged with misdemeanors, including resisting arrest (041 307 346).
