Upcoming Committee Items From Supervisor Maxwell's Office

(1) On Monday, May 9 the City & School District Select Committee will consider Supervisor Maxwell's resolution urging the San Francisco Unified School District to implement alternative school breakfast programs such as the "Breakfast in the Classroom" program for the next school year. The Committee meets beginning at 4:00 p.m. in the City Hall Legislative Chambers, Room 250.

(2) On Wednesday, May 11 Supervisor Maxwell's hearing to examine the potential impacts of the proposed UCSF expansion on the Mission Bay Redevelopment Plan will be heard before the Land Use Committee. The Committee meets beginning at 1:00 p.m. in the City Hall Legislative Chambers, Room 250.

Crime and Enforcement Update

Violence

May 6, 10:14 p.m., a man was shot while walking at Oakdale and Baldwin. A crime scene was found and numerous spent casings were located. The victim provided a fictitious name to the officers (they later determined his actual name), and could provide no motive for the shooting and no suspect description (050 506 810).

May 7, 4:02 a.m., a woman reported that she was inside her home when a bullet shattered her front window. No suspects were seen and no motive was provided (050 507 454).

May 7, 7:45 p.m., numerous shots were fired in the area of the 1400 block of Oakdale. Several spent casings were found at the scene, and parked vehicles in the area were struck with bullets (050 509 723).

May 8, 2:10 a.m., numerous shots were fired in the area of Northridge and Dormitory and responding officers located numerous spent shell casings, and then found two firearms hidden nearby. A handgun was found inside a barbecue pit, and an assault rifle was found in some bushes. Nine juveniles were detained as they fled from the area, and they were identified and released to their guardians (050 510 548).

May 8, 5:40 a.m., a man was shot near 25th and Connecticut. The officers looked for the victim but couldn't find him initially. The victim was eventually located on Dakota Street and was found to have two gunshot

wounds to his abdomen. Note that numerous nearby residents ignored the officers as they searched for the victim and failed to point out the victim to the officers. These residents all went into their respective units and closed their front doors, refusing to be interviewed. The victim refused to provide his name and refused to provide any additional information. He did, however, chastise the medical personnel for their delay in transporting him to the hospital. (They were assessing the extent of his injuries). A crime scene with spent shell casings was located by the officers. 050 510 805

Robberies

May 6, 3:30 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on the 1000 block of Connecticut when they heard six to seven gunshots coming from 26th and Wisconsin. The officers went to the location of the gunshots and found a victim who stated that he had just been carjacked at gunpoint. The victim stated that the suspects beat and robbed him, and then fired one bullet at him (missing) before firing several more rounds into the air. The victim knew the suspects from Potrero Hill and stated that they shot at him because he is from the "Fillmore." The victim refused to provide any additional information, saying that he didn't want to "snitch." 050 505 674

May 6, 4:40 p.m., a woman reported to Bayview officers that she was walking near University and Silliman when she was approached by a man who grabbed her purse and tried to pull it free. The victim held onto her purse and the suspect then fled on foot. The suspect is a black male, 17-18, 5'11", 160, wearing a black cap, black jacket, and dark jeans (050 505 903).

May 6, 5:08 p.m., a woman reported to Bayview officers that she was walking at Fairfax and Mendell when a suspect rode up behind her on a bicycle, pushed her, and stole her purse. The suspect is a black male, 30-35, wearing a blue cap, black jacket, blue jean pants, riding a black mountain bike (050 506 036).

May 6, 9:50 p.m., a male reported to Bayview officers that a man armed with a gun had approached him in front of 1019 Woolsey Street and displayed the gun to him. The suspect then pistol-whipped the victim with the gun, and the gun broke into pieces. The victim realized that the gun was a replica firearm and the suspect then fled on foot. The suspect is a black male, 16-25, 6'0", 200, wearing a black jacket and blue jean pants (050 506 729)

May 7, 12:50 a.m., a man reported to Bayview officers that two suspects had just carjacked him at 3rd and Oakdale and fled in his vehicle. An additional team of officers later saw the vehicle being driven in the area and attempted to pull it over, but it fled and was recovered abandoned a few minutes later. The suspects are described as black males in dark clothing (050 507 119)

May 8, 3:05 p.m., Bayview officers took custody of a woman from store security at 345 Williams Avenue. The woman had stolen several items from the Foodsco Store and had then tried to flee from the store. The woman fought with security and was booked for both theft and battery (050 512 118).

May 8, 4:00 a.m., two men were robbed at gunpoint by two suspects at 25th and Connecticut. After one of the victims told the suspects he had no money, the victim was knocked to the ground and pistol-whipped. Suspect one is a black male, 20-25, 5'8", 175, wearing a white T-shirt and black pants. Suspect two is a black male, 5'9", 180, wearing a white t-shirt and carrying a small black handgun (050 510 770).

Drug Arrests

May 5, 5:10 p.m., three individuals were arrested at Jerrold and Barneveld by Narcotics officers for a variety of offenses, including possession of heroin, possession of cocaine, sales of heroin, destroying evidence, etc. The first man is a transient and was also booked for violation of parole. The second man is also a transient and was booked for possession of crack cocaine. The third individual, a transient woman, was also booked for a warrant charging her with robbery (050 501 984).1

May 8, 1:35 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers arrested a man and a woman who were dealing drugs from rooms 9 and 36 of the Franciscan Motel. The man, staying in room 9, was booked for drug charges and violation of probation. The woman, staying in room 36, was booked for drug charges, possession of paraphernalia, and violation of probation (050 512 061).

May 8, 4:16 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers arrested two men at 950 Connecticut following a drug deal. The first man, living in Vallejo, was booked for numerous drug charges as well as a warrant from Solano County. The second man, a transient, was booked for drug charges and trespassing.
