Crime and Enforcement Update

Evading an Officer, Phelps and Jerrold, May 30, 8:55 a.m. Bayview Officer Kwan was on patrol when he stopped a vehicle with two occupants on board for traffic violations. As the officer was interviewing the driver, the driver "gunned" the vehicle and took off at a high rate of speed, running stop lights and stop signs as he fled from the officer. The officer lost the vehicle in the area, but it was found, parked and unattended, minutes later by a second set of officers. The two occupants were standing near the vehicle and took of running upon seeing the officers. The two men were seen to enter a home on Cashmere and then slam the gate behind them. The officers made contact with the woman in charge of the unit and she consented to a search of her premises. The suspects were found hiding under a bed in a bedroom and fought violently with officers as they were being arrested. The first suspect, living on the 1800 block of 25th Street, was booked for violation of parole, felony flight from an officer, reckless driving, and driving with a suspended license. The second suspect, living on the 1800 block of 26th Street, was booked for similar offenses (050 602 402).

Road Rage, 1600 Wallace, May 30, 11:58 a.m.

Bayview Officer Mostasisa interviewed a woman who stated that she had been involved in a "road rage" incident a few minutes earlier. The woman had been driving with her daughter when a man driving a second vehicle "flipped (her daughter) off." The woman confronted the man about his rude behavior and he pulled a knife and stated, "I'll flip her (the daughter) with this too." The suspect is a Hispanic male, 40-45, wearing a dark baseball cap, black shirt, driving a 1996 white Chevy truck, California license 6U74017 (050 602 913).

Threats against an Officer, Lane and Underwood, May 30, 12:45 p.m. Bayview Officer Newman stopped a vehicle for traffic violations and while he was speaking with the driver a man walking by on the sidewalk started to yell at the officer. The man was walking a pit bull dog and yelled out that his dog "...liked white meat." When the officer (who is white) asked the man what he meant, the man stated that he was going to "...put a bullet in you (the officer)." The man, living on the 600 block of Keith, was arrested for making threats to an officer and struggled violently with the officer during the arrest (050 603 159).

Vandalism, Warrant Arrest, 1575 Bayshore, May 30, 2:44 p.m. Bayview Officers Alcaraz and Berge responded on a vandalism call involving a Hispanic male who had just thrown a bicycle through a car's windshield. The officers located the described suspect and detained him, and he was subsequently identified by the witness as the man who had thrown the bike. The suspect was intoxicated and had apparently been in a fight with other day laborers in front of the U-Haul on Bayshore. Following the fight, the suspect had thrown his bicycle onto a nearby vehicle, shattering the windshield. The man, a transient, was booked for vandalism and public intoxication (050 603 579).

Shots into Dwelling, LaSalle and Garlington, May 30, 11:05 p.m. Bayview Officers Norris and Whitfield interviewed a woman who told them she had been driving east on LaSalle when someone shot out her windshield. No one was injured in the attack, and the officers later located a crime scene in Sun Dial Park (above LaSalle and Osceola), where several shell casings (from two different firearms) were located (050 605 105).

Possession Paraphernalia, 1298 Quint, May 30, 11:16 P.M. Bayview Officers Erb and Johnson were on patrol when they saw a man scaling a fence as he exited a quarry on Quint Street. The officers stopped the man and found that he was in possession of narcotics paraphernalia. The man, a transient, was not in possession of any stolen property, and no responsible for the quarry could be located. The man was booked for possession of paraphernalia (050 605 155).

Vandalism, 950 Innes, May 31, 12:01 a.m. Bayview Officers Cahill and Wise responded on an assault call and spoke with a male who stated that he had just been involved in an argument with his girlfriend, and following the argument, the girlfriend threw his portable radio to the ground, breaking it.
