ISA Event

Crime and Enforcement Update

Attempted Murder, Palou and 3rd, April 29, 11:55 a.m.

Bayview Officer McPherson was on bike patrol when he heard five or six gunshots coming from the area of 3rd and Palou and began responding to the area. The officer found two (Spanish speaking) construction workers who had just been shot and medical assistance was summoned. The victims stated that they were standing near the bus stop when a blue Japanese vehicle pulled up and a man with a gun got out of the vehicle and began shooting at a man standing near the victims. The second man then started shooting back at the first man. The first man then got back into his car and fled. Suspect one is a black male, 18-25, 6'0", wearing a black hat, blue sweater and dark pants. Suspect two is a black male, 5'9", wearing an orange shirt, and he fled on foot onto 3rd Street. Note that members of our Gang Task Force have developed substantial leads in this case and may have identified the original shooter (050 475 685).

Aggravated Assault, 3rd and Newcomb, April 29, 7:18 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when they saw two women beating a girl at 3rd and Newcomb. The victim was attempting to flee from the suspects as they beat her, and she began to run away but fell to the sidewalk, where the two suspects continued to beat and kick her on her head, back and stomach areas. The officers ran from their car in an attempt to stop the beating, but the suspects continued kicking the victim until they were physically restrained by the officers. The victim, a 13 year old girl, told officers that one of the suspects has a child in common with the victim's current boyfriend, a 21 year old Bayview man who recently impregnated the victim. The victim stated that both suspects are "Hill girls," referencing a gang of females from Potrero Hill. It is very likely that the victim would have been seriously injured had the Bayview officers not been present to stop the suspects from further beating her. The first woman, 21 years of age and living in Oakland, was booked for aggravated assault, conspiracy, and a warrant charging her with robbery. The second suspect, 19 years of age and living on the 1800 block of 26th Street, was booked for the same charges. Our Juvenile Division will investigate the relationship between the 13 year old victim and the 21 year old man who impregnated her (050 477 647).

Possession Assault Rifle, 752 Kirkwood, April 30, 3:21 a.m.

Bayview Officers Wise and Cahill responded on the report of a man loading a firearm who had just fired two shots into the air. The officers found the described suspect sitting in front of 752 Kirkwood and detained him. The

original 9-1-1 caller could see the officers speaking with the suspect and the caller stayed on the phone with the Dispatch operator and directed the officers to a nearby bush where the suspect had hidden the assault rifle as the officers were approaching. The caller wished to remain anonymous and was not interviewed any further. The suspect, living on the 100 block of Northridge, was booked for possession of an assault rifle, possession of a firearm by a felon and reckless discharge of a firearm (050 478 883).

Aggravated Assault, 1885 Bayshore, April 30, 11:39 a.m.

Bayview Officers Lamma and Doherty responded on the report of an assault and spoke with two victims who stated that they had been involved in a road rage incident. The victims had been driving down 3rd Street after leaving the B & J Drive-In at 3rd and Paul when they noticed the man driving behind them was honking his horn at them. The second car then pulled alongside the first car and the driver called the victims "bitches" and told them to drive faster. The second car then pulled in front of the first car and stopped suddenly, and the victims were unable to stop in time and contacted the rear of the first vehicle. The victims then saw the driver of the second vehicle waving a gun at them and they quickly drove off. The suspect pursued the victims and caught up with them. The suspect removed the keys from the victims' car and then pistol-whipped the victim driver. The suspect then phoned the police and a female approached the victims and told them not to tell the police about the suspect's gun. As everyone waited for the police to arrive, the suspect told both victims they "looked fine" and said he would forget about the accident if they would agree to date him! The victims, one of whom was seriously injured as a result of just being pistol-whipped, declined the invitation to pursue a romantic relationship with the suspect. After the parties had all been interviewed and the suspect had left, the victims told the officers what had actually happened and the officers responded to the suspect's home, finding him and his vehicle. The officers searched the vehicle and located a replica firearm wrapped in a towel. The suspect, living on the 1400 block of Oakdale, was arrested and booked for aggravated assault, felony threats, battery, brandishing a replica firearm, and an outstanding warrant charging him with possession of cocaine (050 480 060).

Attempted Murder, 1163 Oakdale, April 30, 7:06 p.m.

Bayview Officers Archini and Kenney responded on the report of a shooting and found a victim lying on the ground at the scene. The victim told officers that he was shot by someone who had driven by in a black SUV. The victim could provide no suspect description and no motive for the shooting. Shortly after this call was dispatched, a second victim walked into SFGH and stated that he had been shot on Turk Street, although he asked about the condition of the victim from Oakdale. It appears likely that both victims were shot on Oakdale. No witnesses came forward (050 481 212).

Aggravated Assault on a Peace Officer, 2488 San Bruno, May 1, 12:50 a.m.

Bayview Officers responded to San Bruno Avenue on a call that two suspects were spray painting the roof of the Walgreen's Store with graffiti. The officers found several young men descending the roof as they arrived and one of the young men attempted to get into a car being driven by another young man. As the suspect got into the car, the officer grabbed onto him and the car began to speed away, knocking the officer to the pavement and injuring his leg. One of the four original suspects, a 15 year old male

living on Folsom Street, was booked at YGC for vandalism (050 481 892). Note that the suspect vehicle was located by Bayview officers approximately 15 minutes later and it was determined to be a stolen vehicle. The driver was booked for stolen auto (see below).

Battery of a Peace Officer, Northridge and Dormitory, May 1, 1:35 a.m. Bayview Officers Farrell, Anderson and Singh responded on the call of a dead body on Kiska Road. The officers located the body, lying face down, behind 190 Kiska Road, but realized there was no merit to the "dead body" call when the body started crawling away. The officers approached the man and could see that he was extremely intoxicated, and an ambulance was summoned. The man fought with the ambulance personnel when they arrived, and then tried to bite the officers as they attempted to control him. The man was booked at County Jail for drunk in public and battery on a peace officer (050 481 961).

Robbery Arrest, Oxford and Wayland, May 1, 12:45 p.m. Ingleside Officer Cueba responded on the report of a robbery and spoke with three victims who stated that they had just been robbed at gunpoint by two men who had escaped in a white four door Mazda with a possible plate of 4AZL443. Note that the suspect and vehicle description matched the description provided at 11:05 a.m. in a robbery reported at Bayshore and Thornton (see below). Bayview Lt. Bruneman spotted the suspect vehicle but lost it in the area on Ingalls and Northridge. Bayview Officers Remedios and Delvin then saw a man matching the description given of one of the robbers running from the area. The officers pursued and caught the man, and a different set of Bayview officers found the suspect vehicle parked at 15 Matthew Court. The suspect, living on Watchman Way, was booked for three counts of robbery, conspiracy, and felony flight from an officer (050 482 919).

Battery on an Officer, 23rd and Arkansas, May 1, 6:25 p.m. Bayview Officers Nichols and Arndt were on patrol and stopped a vehicle for traffic violations. The officers determined that the driver's license was suspended, and as they were speaking with him, the driver suddenly punched Officer Nichols in the face and fled on foot. The officers pursued the man and eventually overtook and arrested him. The suspect, living on the 100 block of Dakota, was booked for driving with a suspended license, resisting arrest, and a warrant charging him with violation of parole (050 483 785).

Aggravated Assault, Mariposa and Tennessee, May 1, 9:00 p.m. Bayview Officers Nichols and Arndt responded on the call of a man standing in front of a couple with his pants down and masturbating. As the officers arrived they saw three men holding a fourth man down, and the fourth man (suspect) jumped up and tried to strike one of the victims with a metal flashlight. The suspect then punched one of the victims in the stomach, kned the same victim in the face, and then struck the same victim in the head with his clenched fists. The officers attempted to arrest the suspect and he resisted violently, kicking one of the officers and continuing to struggle as the officers took him to the ground to control him. The man was eventually brought under control and the victim told officers that he and his girlfriend had just parked their truck when the suspect approached their vehicle and began handling himself. The suspect then made sexually explicit remarks to the female and the victim attempted to drive away. The

suspect then jumped into the bed of the victim's truck and refused to leave, and the victim was forced to pull over. The victim confronted the suspect and the suspect became violent with the victim and attacked him. The suspect, a transient, was booked for aggravated assault, assault on a peace officer, indecent exposure, and resisting arrest (050 484 169).

Drug cases

April 28, 8:35 p.m., a man, living on Exeter, was arrested at 3rd and Hollister for possession of crack cocaine for sale and possession of marijuana. The man was booked for both drug offenses (050 472 879).

April 29, 11:48 a.m., a man, living on the 1300 block of Ingalls, was arrested at 1864 25th Street for possession of methamphetamine, violation of probation, and a warrant charging him with possession of cocaine for sale (050 476 116).

Robberies

April 29, 11:08 a.m., a man and his wife were standing in front of 953 DeHaro when they were approached by two suspects who demanded his wallet. One of the suspects then put the victim into a headlock and threw him to the ground,, where he struck his head on the concrete. The suspects took the victim's property and fled. Suspect one is a black male, 15-16, 5'3", 120, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and black pants. Suspect two is a black male, 15-16, 5'3", 120, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and blue pants (050 475 516).

April 30, 3:30 a.m., a man had just closed his shop for the night and was entering his parked auto at 1255 Connecticut when a suspect armed with a gun approached and robbed him. The suspect is a black male, 20-30, 5'10", 200, hair in braids, wearing a black baseball cap, black puffy jacket, white T-shirt, and black pants (050 478 861).

April 30, 11:24 p.m., a woman was walking near 138 Goettingen when she was approached by three male suspects. One suspect blocked her path while another placed his hand over her mouth. The suspects then threw the woman to the ground and stole her purse. Suspects one and two are described as black males, 17-18, 5'7", 160, wearing all dark clothing. Suspect three was described similarly, only he was wearing a tan hooded jacket (050 481 757).

May 1, 11:05 a.m., a man was filling his car with gas at the station at Bayshore and Thornton when he was approached by two suspects in a second vehicle. One of the suspects produced a gun and robbed the victim and his wife and their currency. The suspects then fled in a white car. Suspect one is black male, 22-28, 5'8", 185. Suspect two is a black male (050 482 715).

Stolen Autos

April 29, 7:27 p.m., a woman, living on the 1600 block of Ingalls, was arrested at 3rd and Oakdale in a stolen auto. The woman told officers that the car belonged to her "friend," although she didn't know her friend's name. The woman was booked for stolen auto, driving with a suspended license, and an outstanding warrant (050 475 312).

May 1, 1:13 a.m., a man, living in Stockton, was arrested at 275 Girard in a stolen auto. The driver was in possession of a master key and was booked for stolen auto (050 481 905).

May 1, 12:30 p.m., a woman living on the 700 block of Jerrold reported that her ex-boyfriend stole her vehicle after assaulting her. The boyfriend, living in Oakland, later returned the car with a broken steering wheel. The woman wants no police action (050 482 884).
