Crime and Enforcement Update

Shots into Dwelling, Thomas and Quint, May 17, 10:30 p.m.
Bayview Officers Singh and Gallo responded on a shooting call and spoke with the female caller who stated that she had been seated inside her car with three other individuals when a suspect shot at her three times and fled in a 2005 red Nissan. The suspect is described as a black male, 19-20, 6'0", 180, dreadlock hair, wearing a white baseball cap, gray T-shirt and dark pants. The victim could provide no explanation or motive for the shooting (050 550 986).

Burglary Arrest, 1345 Rhode Island, May 18, 3:49 a.m.
Bayview Officers Bradford and Cahill responded on the call of an auto burglary and saw a man walking away from the area who matched the

description provided of the suspect. The officers stopped the man and saw that he was carrying numerous CD's and other pieces of property. The officers brought both the 9-1-1 caller and the boosted vehicle's owner to the scene, and the caller identified the suspect, and the victim identified her property. The suspect, living in Antioch, was booked for auto burglary, possession of stolen property, violation of (robbery) probation, possession of narcotics paraphernalia, and resisting arrest (he fought with the officers when being booked at Bayview Station) 050 551 310.

Possible Rape, Jamestown and Hunter's Point Expressway, May 18, 11:15 a.m. Bayview Officers Dicroce and Doherty responded to a youth center on a rape call and spoke with the director who stated that one of the juvenile residents had reported that she had been raped by numerous males the previous day near Monster Park. The victim refused to be interviewed by the officers and would provide no details (050 552 631).

Attempted Murder, 5174 3rd Street, May 18, 11:55 a.m. Bayview Officer Alcaraz responded to SFGH on the report of a shooting victim and spoke with the female victim who was being treated by doctors for a gunshot wound to her head. After the victim was stabilized, the officer attempted to interview her but she was very uncooperative and refused to provide either her name or any details of the shooting. The victim eventually told the officer that she had been robbed and shot at 3rd and Palou. The victim's family arrived at the hospital and the victim eventually admitted that her boyfriend had actually shot her following an argument. The boyfriend, Robert Brantley, is considered armed and dangerous and is wanted for attempted murder. The suspect has addresses on the 5100 block of 3rd Street and the 200 block of Holloway, and is driving a green 1997 Toyota Avalon, 4 door, with a California license plate of 3VUA100 (050 553 043).

Robbery, 1005 Phelps, May 18, 3:57 p.m. Bayview Officers Haynes and Reyes responded on the report of a robbery and spoke with the male caller who stated that he was walking home and was a few steps from his front door when two suspects approached him and assaulted and robbed him. Suspect one is a black male, 18-19, 5'10", 180, dark skin, broad shoulders, "twists" in hair, wearing a white T-shirt. Suspect two is a black male, 5'5", 130, wearing a light colored cap (050 553 899).

Warrant Arrest, Revere and Hawes, May 18, 6:26 p.m. Bayview Officers Lyons, Solares and Aherne were on patrol and looking for a wanted man when they saw a man attempting to enter the home of the wanted man. The officers stopped the man and he provided a fictitious name. The man was detained and eventually identified, and he was found to have an outstanding \$500,000.00 warrant for his arrest from South San Francisco charging him with grand theft. The man, a transient, was booked for the warrant and for possession of marijuana (050 554 518).
