## Crime and Enforcement Update

Indecent Exposure, Silver and Elmira, May 17, 8:23 a.m.

Bayview Officer Damonte responded on the call of a man exposing himself.

The officer located a possible suspect laying across the front seat of a

parked car. The officer determined that the man is a registered sex offender, and the victim responded to the scene and identified the suspect

as the man she had seen masturbating as she was walking her dog. The man,

living on 19th Avenue, was booked for indecent exposure and violation of

parole (050 547 541).

Warrant Arrest, 1607 20th Street, May 17, 9:40 a.m.

Bayview Officer Damonte was on patrol when he stopped a vehicle for traffic

violations and determined that the driver was wanted. The officer told the

man that he was under arrest and the man then threatened to kill the officer, telling him, "I'm going to kill you f...ing Bayview bitches." The man stated that he was a member of the "SFM" Latin gang and stated that

his "...boys were going to rush Bayview Station to free (him)." The man's

gang did not lay siege to Bayview Station, and he was booked successfully.

The suspect, living on the 200 block of Missouri, was booked for a warrant

charging him with making death threats, and also for the new threats he made against the officer (050 542 591).

Bayview Officer Rockwell responded on the call of a trespasser and found a

woman residing in a vacant unit. The woman, who has been charged with the

Bayview Officer Lavin was addressing the problems associated with a homeless encampment when she determined that one of the residents was a convicted sex offender who had failed to properly register upon being released from prison. The man, a transient, was booked for the offense (050 548 141).

Forcible Rape, 350 Girard, May 17, 12:47 p.m.

Bayview Officer Johnson responded to the Martin Luther King Middle School

and spoke with a 13 year old female victim who stated that she had been forcibly raped by another student in a restroom. The 14 year old male

suspect, living on Newcomb, was arrested and booked for rape (050 548 743).

The second suspect, 14 years of age and living on Nichols, was booked for the same charges (050 529 094).
