

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE May 17, 2005

Washington Memorial

More than one hundred members of the San Francisco Police Department travelled to Washington D.C. last week to participate in the annual Peace Officer Memorial ceremony held each May on the steps of the United States Capitol Building. We were there to honor the 156 American peace officers who lost their lives in the line of duty in 2004, and specifically, to provide support for the family of Officer Isaac Espinoza, the Bayview officer gunned down on Newhall Street in April of 2004. President Bush was the keynote speaker, and following his speech, he came into the crowd and met personally with the families of the slain officers, spending more than two and a half hours with them. On Saturday evening, just as the skies opened up to a drenching thunderstorm, hundreds of officers from around the country participated in a parade through downtown Washington D.C. Our contingent from San Francisco, including many Bayview officers as well as Chief Heather Fong and Deputy Chief Greg Suhr, was one of the largest attending, and those who stayed in the rain to watch the parade cheered loudly for San Francisco's finest. Isaac's family was very thankful for the support shown by our department members, and we were very proud to offer it.

Crime and Enforcement Update

Forcible Rape, 3rd and Williams, May 14, 3:30 p.m.

Bayview Officers Winesberry and Lane responded to SFGH on the report of a rape and learned that the 16 year old female victim had just left the hospital. The officers went to the victim's home in an attempt to interview her and spoke with her grandfather who stated that the victim told him that she had been raped at 3rd and Williams by two men, but provided no further information. The officers were unable to locate the victim and advised the grandfather to contact the police upon her arrival home (050 538 437).

Marijuana Sales, Silver and Bowdoin, May 15, 12:17 p.m.

Bayview Officer Coleman was on patrol when he stopped a vehicle for traffic violations and determined that the 17 year old driver was unlicensed. The driver was arrested and the vehicle was towed and impounded. A search of the vehicle revealed 17 baggies of marijuana which were seized and booked as evidence. The driver, living on Hamilton Street, was cited for possession of marijuana for sale (050 539 645).

Sexual Assault, Child Molesting, 1300 block Oakdale, May 16, 8:00 a.m.
Bayview Officers Pai and Reyes responded on a report that a 10 year old girl had failed to arrive at her elementary school. The girl's mother was called by school authorities and was at the scene, and the officers developed information that an adult male acquaintance of the family had been phoning the girl recently. The officers traced the male to a home on Lisbon Street and responded there, learning from another resident that the man had in fact been seen with the girl earlier in the day. The man was later located, as was the little girl, and the man was booked for rape and child molesting (050 543 458).

Attempted Murder, Westpoint and Middlepoint, May 16, 8:45 a.m.
Numerous Bayview officers responded on the call of a shooting, and four separate victims were found in the area, each with gunshot wounds. One of the victims told officers that a green or gray car containing four black males had pulled up to the bus stop and its occupants had shot at the four victims. An anonymous caller later provided the street names of the alleged shooters, and our Gang Task Force is coordinating the identification and search for them (050 542 422). Note that as I was finishing today's e-mail at approximately 9:00 p.m. (May 17), members of our Gang Task Force just arrested one of the shooters from this case.

Threats, 72 Cameron Way, May 16, 12:50 p.m.
Bayview Officers Calaunan and Escobar responded on a threats call and spoke with the female caller who stated that she is eight month's pregnant with her boyfriend's child, and the boyfriend became angry with her when she wrecked their car and threatened to kill her and her children by burning down her house. The suspect left these threats on the victim's cell phone in both voicemail and text, and the contents of the phone were booked as evidence. The suspect lives in Hayward, and the officers contacted the Hayward Police Department who located and arrested the suspect. The suspect was booked for felony threats (050 545 545).

Check Fraud, 6 Leland, May 16, 3:27 p.m.
Bayview Officer Madrid took a report from a man who stated that he had been notified by the Bank of America on Leland Avenue that a woman had just cashed a check on his account for \$500. The victim stated that the suspect had no permission to cash the check. The suspect is the victim's domestic partner, and the victim stated that the suspect has a drug problem and has done this in the past (050 544 616).

Robbery, Bayshore and Industrial, May 16, 3:40 p.m.
Bayview Officer Madrid took a report from a 17 year old male who had just been robbed. The victim was walking on the street when he was approached by two male suspects who robbed him. The suspects are two Hispanic males, 22-27 years of age, both over 6'0", and over 200 pounds. No weapons were seen (050 545 329).

Violation Court Order, 1600 block LaSalle, May 16, 5:30 p.m.
Bayview Officer Dalton was on patrol when he saw a man that he knew to have an active stay-away order for the area. The man was arrested and booked for violation of a court order, violation of probation, and loitering for drug purposes (050 544 650).

Threats, 633 Silliman, May 16, 7:30 p.m.

Bayview Officer Madrid took a threats report from a woman who stated that her neighbor and friend threatened to "hunt (her) down to the ends of the earth and kill (her)" following a dispute involving her dog. The victim stated that the suspect is mentally unbalanced and has threatened her on prior occasions (050 403 921).

Domestic Violence, 1600 block of Newcomb, May 16, 11:11 p.m.

Bayview Officers Foss and Bernal responded on the report of a fight and spoke with the female caller who stated that her children's father had just bitten her on her arm. The officers located the male, who stated that he had been arguing with his children's mother but had not assaulted her. The female became angry and stated that she had made up the story about the bite. The female then bit her own arm. The female, who has a court order which prevents her from going near the male was booked for domestic violence and violation of a court order. A psych hold was also placed on the female (050 546 242).
