Easter Egg Hunt

On Saturday, March 26, SFPD's Operation Dream will host the 11th annual Easter Egg Hunt for children living in public housing and other low income areas. Crime and Enforcement Update

Heroin Offense, Innes and Phelps, March 4, 2:47 p.m.
Bayview Officers Stoumen, DeJesus, Aherne and Fitzpatrick were on patrol at Phelps and Innes when saw two men engaged in what appeared to be a narcotics transaction. The men were stopped and the suspected seller was found to possess heroin. The seller, living on the 1200 block of Sunnysdale, was booked for possession of heroin, violation of parole and traffic offenses (050 248 131).

Possession Crack Cocaine, Revere and Jennings, March 4, 4:14 p.m.
Bayview plainclothes Officers DeJesus, Stoumen, Fitzpatrick and Aherne were on patrol when they saw a man looking at something in the palm of his hand. As the officers approached the man, he began to swallow an object that appeared to be crack cocaine. The officers recovered the crack and arrested the man. The suspect, a transient, was booked for possession of crack cocaine and destroying evidence (050 248 545).

Possession Firearm by Felon, 17 Nichols, March 4, 5:11 p.m.
Bayview's plainclothes team was on foot patrol in the Alice Griffith Development when they saw a man near a parked van. The man, upon seeing the officers approaching, bent down near the rear wheel well of the van and then got up quickly and began to walk away. The officers checked the

vehicle's wheel well and located a fully loaded handgun. The man was placed under arrest and a subsequent search revealed both marijuana and several counterfeit \$100 bills. The suspect, living on the 1000 block of Gilman, was booked for possession of a loaded handgun by a felon, violation of probation, possession of marijuana, and possession of counterfeit bills (050 248 818).

Possession Heroin, 1327 Fitzgerald, March 4, 5:32 p.m. Bayview plainclothes Officers Izaguirre and Benzinger, along with Sgt. Fabbri, were on patrol when they saw a man displaying several small objects in his open hand to another individual. Both men were detained and the first was found to possess several balloons of heroin and several rocks of crack cocaine. The second man was found to have an outstanding warrant for his arrest. The first man, living on the 1100 block of Hollister, was booked for transportation of heroin and crack, possession of heroin and crack, and an outstanding warrant. The second man, living on Esplanade, was booked for an outstanding warrant (050 248 937).

Marijuana Offense, Cameron and Nichols, March 4, 9:03 p.m. Officers Paul and Arndt were on foot patrol in the Alice Griffith Development when they saw a young man they did not recognize as a lawful resident of the development. When the man saw the officers, he took off running. The officers pursued the man on foot and were met by a large crowd of locals who stood in their path and began shouting profanities at them. The officers continued their pursuit of the man and eventually caught up to him. The man, living on the 1500 block of LaSalle, was booked at YGC for possession of marijuana and delaying arrest. The members of the mob were thanked for their assistance (050 249 725).

Warrant Arrest, Michigan and Marin, March 5, 12:41 a.m. Bayview Officer Cahill when he smelled burning chemicals in the area Michigan and Marin and found a man "burning the oil off" of spark plugs. The man, a transient, was found to have several warrants for his arrest. The man was booked for numerous warrants, including a probation violation warrant from Merced County (050 250 089).

Warrant Arrest, 56 Williams, March 5, 10:30 a.m. Officer Pascua was on patrol when he saw a man he knew to be wanted and stopped to arrest him. The man, living on the 300 block of Thornton, was booked for an outstanding warrant charging him with sales of cocaine (050

025 103).

Grand Theft, 1301 Marin, March 5, 10:51 a.m.

Bayview Officer Remedios responded to the Muni yard at 1301 Marin on the call of trespassers and met with a security guard who told him that he had seen a male suspect in the yard stripping metal off of buses. The suspect was gone from the yard, but approximately ten minutes later, Bayview Officers Cohen and Mostasisa were on patrol when they saw a man pushing a shopping cart filled with orange and white metal panels into the Circosta Metals yard at 1890 Evans. Relying on their finest investigative instincts, the officers determined that something was amiss and they detained the man. A Muni employee responded to the scene and identified the panels as belonging to Muni (they were actually all stamped with the Muni logo). The original caller also responded and stated that the detained man was not the man who had been inside the Muni yard. The suspect, a transient, was booked for possession of stolen property. As the officers were accompanying the caller back to the yard, they saw a second man at Evans and Toland and the caller identified this man as the one who had actually stolen the panels. The second man, a transient, was booked for grand theft and an outstanding arrest warrant (050 251 203).

Possession Firearm, 2998 San Bruno, March 5, 9:10 p.m.

Bayview Officers Birco and Ward responded to 2998 San Bruno to assist a CHP unit with an arrest. The CHP officers had two men in custody and told our officers that they had pulled a vehicle over for traffic violations and then found that the occupants were in possession of both marijuana and a loaded handgun. The driver of the vehicle was also found to be wearing a bullet-resistant vest. The driver, living on Nichols, was booked for possession of a loaded and concealed handgun, possession of marijuana, and traffic violations (050 253 011).

Parole Violation, 3rd and 20th, March 5, 11:10 p.m.

Bayview Officers Lavin and Buelow were on patrol when they came across a man wanted for an outstanding warrant. The man, a transient, was booked for a warrant charging him with violation of parole (050 253 259).

Homicide, 1996 Palou, March 6, 4:06 a.m.

Bayview Officers Singh and Gallo responded on a shots fired call and found

two people shot when they arrived at Palou and Rankin. The two victims were surrounded by a group of young men, and when the officers attempted to gather information and to interview the young men, the group became hostile and began yelling obscenities at the officers. One of the shooting victims was lucid and responsive, and when questioned, began swearing at the officers and refused to provide any information. A man who wished to remain anonymous stated that two Hispanic males had been the shooters and had run north on Rankin from Palou following the shooting. The first victim died of his wounds and the second victim was treated at SFGH for three gunshot wounds. The first suspect is described as a Hispanic male, 22-28, 5'9", wearing a half sleeve white T-shirt and blue jean pants. Suspect two is a Hispanic male, 5'8", wearing a half sleeve white T-shirt and black jean pants (050 253 920).

Stolen Auto, 1575 Bayshore, March 6, 12:40 a.m.
Bayview Officers Chu and Correa responded to the 76 Gas Station on a vehicle accident call. The officers found a U-Haul truck at the scene which had been driven at a high rate of speed into a pole. The driver had fled the scene following the accident. An off-duty officer assigned to Bayview Station was at the gas station at the time of the accident and had followed the suspect / driver as he ran into Silver Terrace Playground. The suspect was eventually caught as he ran onto Thornton Street. The manager of the U-Haul on Bayshore also responded to the scene and reported that the truck had just been stolen from their lot. (The thief had actually only driven a few blocks prior to wrecking the truck.) The suspect, a transient, was booked for stolen auto, possession of stolen property, hit and run, and driving with no license (050 253 550).

Warrant Arrest, Keith and Revere, March 6, 8:33 a.m.
Bayview Officers Damonte and Alcaraz responded to Keith and Revere on a suspicious persons call. As the officers arrived, a group of men and women began to disperse in various directions. The group left several jackets behind and the officers picked them up. A male then approached the officers asking for his jacket, and when the officers attempted to identify him he provided a fictitious name. The man then bolted and the officers pursued him on foot, eventually catching him a block away. The man's true identity was determined and he was booked for an outstanding no bail warrant charging him with parole violation (050 254 241).

Warrant Arrest, 5300 3rd Street, March 6, 12:27 p.m.
Bayview Officers Alcaraz and Damonte responded to Walgreen's on a shoplifting call. Security officers had detained a woman for shoplifting

and warned her regarding her actions. The officers determined that the woman, a transient, was wanted for an outstanding warrant charging her with possession of crack cocaine and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (050 254 871).

Bayview Officers Arndt and Olson were on patrol when they saw a man they knew to be wanted and arrested him. The man, a transient, was booked for a no bail warrant charging him with violation of parole.
