Crime and Enforcement Update

Illegal Lodging, Rankin and Davidson, March 30, 11:37 a.m.
Bayview Officer Lavin responded on a call of a homeless encampment

surrounded by piles of debris. The officer found a man surrounded by numerous stolen shopping carts filled with recycling material, as well as other general garbage and debris. The man is well known to the officer and has been advised on numerous prior occasions about his illegal encampments. He has also been provided each time with information and referrals concerning homeless services and shelters, but he refuses to avail himself of any services. The man was cited again (050 351 530).

Possession Cocaine for Sale, 1101 Silver, March 30, 2:58 p.m.
Bayview Officer Alcaraz was on patrol at Silver and University when he saw a vehicle fail to stop for a stop sign and he pulled the vehicle over. The driver told the officer that his license was suspended and the officer then determined that the driver was on probation, with a probation search clause. The officer asked the driver for the keys to the vehicle so that it could be searched and the driver handed them to the officer. The officer then noticed that a plastic container was attached to the key ring, and it contained 4 rocks of crack cocaine. Upon seeing the crack, the driver stated, "The key chain came like that." The officer chose to err on the side of caution and booked the driver, who lives on the 200 block of Cambridge, for possession of cocaine. Members of the community are cautioned to check any key chains they buy to ensure that they don't contain stashes of crack cocaine (050 352 641).

Robbery, 166 Cambridge, March 30, 4:05 p.m.
Bayview Officers McCormick and Paul responded on the report of a robbery and met with an elderly Hispanic female who stated that she was riding a Muni bus home and tried to exit the bus but was blocked from leaving by a female. A male suspect then approached her and removed several items from her purse. The victim stated she was too scared to say or do anything, and both suspects exited the bus at Cambridge and Silver and fled. The female suspect is described as Filipino with shoulder length hair, heavy-set, wearing a light blue shirt. The male suspect is a black male, 35-40, 5'6", 140, short hair, short beard, light complexion, wearing blue "gym" clothes (050 353 859).

Possession of Loaded Firearm, Dormitory and Northridge, March 30, 4:38 p.m.

Bayview Officers Lyons, Scott, Solares and Mustafich were on patrol when they saw four young men loitering in the street and began to approach them. One of the men placed his hand to his waist and took off running, and Officer Solares pursued him on foot. The man eventually surrendered and was taken into custody. As the officers arrested the suspect, they found a loaded and concealed .45 caliber handgun in his waistband. The suspect, 17 years of age and living on the 1100 block of Oakdale, is a validated member of the BNT (Broke N-word Thievin') gang. The gun had been reported stolen in Fairfield, and the suspect was booked for numerous gun charges, gang charges, and possession of stolen property (050 353 150).

Warrant Arrest, 17 Nichols, March 30, 5:15 p.m.

On February 19, Bayview plainclothes officers obtained a wanted bulletin from the Daly City Police Department describing a person who had just been named in an attempted murder (shooting) case which had occurred on Market Street in Daly City. The named suspect was believed to frequent the Doublerock area and Bayview officers have been "on the look-out" for him ever since. Yesterday, Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when they saw a man matching the photo on the wanted bulletin and stopped the man. The man provided a fictitious name, but the officers recognized him from the photo and brought him in to Bayview Station, where he admitted that he was the wanted subject. The man was booked for a warrant charging him with violation of parole and the Daly City Police Department was notified on his arrest (050 353 229).

Theft by False Pretenses, 2999 Harrison, March 30, 7:06 p.m.

A Bayview resident walked into the station and made a report with Officer Rightmire regarding an incident which had occurred at the "Liquor and Grocery Store" at 2999 Harrison Street. The victim stated that on March 9 she had used her food stamp credit card to purchase \$54 worth of groceries and the clerk had declined to provide her with a receipt, stating that the purchase would show up on her monthly statement. When the victim checked her monthly statement upon receiving it, she noticed that she had been charged \$154 by the store. The victim went back to the store and

confronted a store manager and was told that she could sue them if she had a problem with anything. This case will be investigated by our Fraud section (050 353 633).

Heroin and Cocaine Offense, 4410 3rd Street, March 30, 8:08 p.m. Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol when they saw three men loitering on the sidewalk and saw that one of the men began to conceal something in his pants upon seeing the officers. The officers approached the man and found both heroin and cocaine on his person. The man, living on Dedman court, was booked for possession of both drugs (050 353 906).

Suspicious Occurrence, Westpoint and Middlepoint, March 31, 12:08 a.m. Bayview Officers Anderson and Farrell responded on a well being check for a juvenile who had been seen sleeping on a Muni bench. The officers found an 11 year old boy who told them that he lived downtown and had gotten into an argument with his mother on Tuesday and had left home to sleep at a friend's home. The boy stated that he had nowhere to sleep on Wednesday night and was sleeping on the Muni bench. The officers contacted CPS (Child Protective Services) and were told to take the boy home and to check on the environment in the home. The officers did this and spoke with the boy's mother, who was asked why she hadn't alerted the police department when the boy failed to return home. The woman stated, "I know where my kids are at, he's not missing." The boy was left in the home and the case will be followed up by CPS (050 354 487).
