#### Crime and Enforcement Update

Suspended License, Quesada and Rankin, March 17, 7:31 p.m. Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol when they saw a man driving a car and they had prior knowledgge that the man was prohibited from driving as a result of a suspended license. The man, upon seeing the officers, immediately pulled to the curb. The man, who has been charged at least 15 times for driving with a suspended license, was booked for the offense, and his vehicle was towed and impounded (050 301 488).

Warrant Arrest, 1053 Fitzgerald, March 18, 11:00 a.m. Bayview Officers Lamma and Doherty were on foot patrol in the Alice Griffith Development when they saw a young man they knew to be wanted and detained him. The young man, 15 years of age and living in Richmond, was booked at YGC for a warrant charging him with possession of stolen property (050 303 832).

Robbery, 2490 San Bruno, March 18, 2:42 p.m. Bayview Officers Kwan and Hui were on patrol at San Bruno and Felton when they were flagged down by a man who told them that he had just been robbed. The victim told officers that he had been working inside the Radio Shack Store when two men stole a DVD player and pushed him out of the way as they

were fleeing the store. The two suspects then fled in a vehicle described as an American compact car, partial license of 4VM\_\_\_\_. Suspect one is a black male, 20-30, 5'11", 180, wearing a black leather jacket, black jeans and black shoes. Suspect two is a black male, 5'11", 180, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt with an orange emblem on the sleeve, black pants, and black shoes (050 304 880).

Vandalism, 135 Mississippi, March 18, 2:58 p.m.  
Bayview Officers Lew and Berge responded to the Bay Guardian building and spoke with the caller who stated that she had heard a male screaming outside the building and looked outside to see a man walking back and forth on the sidewalk in front of the building. The man appeared agitated and then ran up to a window on the building and punched it out. The man then ran away. The suspect is a white male, 50 to 55, 5'10", 150, wearing a windbreaker and dark pants and pushing a shopping cart (050 304 971).

Stolen Auto Arrest, 6600 3rd Street, March 18, 6:03 p.m.  
Bayview's plainclothes team was conducting a surveillance at the Franciscan Motel when they saw a vehicle with two occupants pull into the parking lot and exit the vehicle. One of the occupants then knocked on several doors of the motel, spoke with several room occupants, and then entered the vehicle and drove away. The vehicle had a broken out window and the officers attempted to stop it, but it drove off at a high rate of speed. The officers lost the vehicle and were advised that it had just been involved in an accident at Gilman and Griffith. The officers responded to the second scene and saw the driver running from the vehicle. The officers attempted to stop the man, who struggled violently, and were eventually able to arrest him. The vehicle had just been stolen, and the driver, living on the 2000 block of Quesada, was booked for stolen auto. He was also booked for a warrant charging him with sales of cocaine (050 305 559).

Warrant Arrest, 1600 Kansas, March 18, 9:14 p.m.  
Bayview Officers Wilhelm and Correa were on patrol when they stopped a man for walking across the street against a red light and determined that the man was wanted for an outstanding warrant. The man, a transient, was

booked for the warrant which charged him with possession of methamphetamine and being under the influence of drugs (050 306 212).

Robbery, 1158 Jamestown, March 18, 11:45 p.m.  
Bayview Officers Borgen and Chiang responded on the report of a robbery and spoke with a man who told them two suspects had approached him in front of his house and demanded his money. The first suspect then struck the victim twice on his head with a hammer. The suspects stole the victim's money and then fled on foot. Suspect one is a black male, 25-30, 5'9", 150, wearing a gray shirt and black pants. Suspect two is a black male (050 306 535).

Robbery, 3rd and Ingerson, March 19, 7:15 a.m.  
Bayview Officers Leung and Altorfer responded on the report of a robbery and spoke with a man who stated that he had just been robbed at knifepoint. The victim told the officers that after the robbery the suspect had run into a home on the 6300 block of 3rd Street. The officers located the home and found a man inside. The officers conducted a "cold show" for the victim, but he was unable to identify the detained suspect. The suspect, who provided two different names, was identified and released at the scene. The suspect's brother, who also lives in the home but was not present, will be interviewed as part of this investigation (050 307 157).

Warrant Arrest, Revere and Silver, March 19, 12:45 a.m.  
Bayview Officer Nichols was on patrol when he stopped a man who appeared intoxicated and determined that the man was wanted for an outstanding warrant. The man, a transient, was arrested and booked for the warrant which charged him with battery and burglary (050 306 604).

Hot Prowl Burglary, 1186 Burrows, March 19, 10:23 a.m.  
Bayview Officer Damonte responded on the call of a burglary in progress and spoke with an elderly female caller who told them that she was awakened by loud banging on her front door and a few seconds later saw a man wearing all black clothing standing in the doorway to her bedroom. The woman screamed and the man fled from the home. A witness saw this man fleeing from the house join two additional men, also dressed in dark clothing, and

the three men all fled the area. Several minutes later, Bayview Officer Altorfer stopped a vehicle leaving the area which was occupied by three men who matched the description of the three suspects who had been seen fleeing the victim's home. The victim, very elderly, was unable to identify any of the suspects, but they were identified by the officer prior to being released (050 307 511).

Evading an Officer, 25th and Connecticut, March 19, 1:31 p.m. Bayview Officers Rodatos, Sanders and Reynoso were on patrol when they heard a vehicle revving its engine, screeching its tires and driving recklessly in the area. The officers attempted to pull the vehicle over, but it fled at a high rate of speed and left the area. The vehicle, a silver Camaro, has been seen by the officers in the Potrero Hill area (050 308 860).

Warrant Arrest, 1650 Davidson, March 19, 10:46 p.m. Bayview Officer Erb was on patrol when he came across a man who wanted for an outstanding warrant. The man, a transient, was booked for the warrant which charged him with grand theft and possession of stolen property (050 309 523)

Shooting, 700 block Missouri, March 20, 2:03 p.m. Bayview Officers Rodatos and Sanders responded on a call of shots being fired and a suspect vehicle, described as a gold Japanese vehicle, which had just fled the scene. The officers found two vehicles at the scene with bullet holes in them, but no victims. The officers were then notified that a shooting victim had just walked into SFGH and the officers responded there. The victim and the person who drove him to the hospital were very uncooperative and told the officers that they hadn't been near Potrero Hill. No victims ever came forward (050 311 114).

Homicide, 19th and Indiana, March 21, 2:02 a.m. Bayview Officers Rodriguez and Chu were on patrol when they heard several shots being fired and then located four individuals who had been shot near 19th and Indiana. Two additional persons later walked into Kaiser Hospital on Geary and stated they too had been shot at 19th and Indiana. One of the victims later died of his injuries. The suspect in these shootings is

possibly a Filipino male, and may have fled the area in a silver Range Rover with a black grille. Homicide Inspectors Balma and Dempsey have been assigned this case and may be reached at 553-1145 (050 312 786).

Auto Boost, 1627 Quesada, March 21, 3:47 a.m.  
Bayview Officer Norris responded on a call of shots being fired and spoke with the caller who told him that he had caught a man breaking into his parked vehicle, and when he confronted the man, he fled in a gray Acura Legend with the victim's property. As the suspect was fleeing the scene, the victim believes he heard a single gunshot. The suspect is a black male wearing black clothing (050 312 899).
