

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE March 10, 2005

Medical Marijuana

Many Potrero Hill residents have contacted me recently regarding the Medical Marijuana outlet that is being planned for a building at 3rd and 20th Streets. The police department is not "in the loop" when these outlets are being licensed. Although we are certainly sensitive to the needs of people with legitimate medical conditions who require marijuana as a part of their treatment, we are also extremely concerned about the routine abuses which take place at these outlets. On numerous occasions in the past year, Bayview officers have come across drug dealers with Medical Marijuana cards which they pull out when being arrested. We will work closely with the community to ensure that the area around this new facility doesn't begin to look like a scene from a Cheech and Chong movie.

Crime and Enforcement Update

Domestic Violence, 130 Westpoint, March 9, 10:30 a.m.
Bayview Officers Siguido, Dockery, Pascua and Chantal responded to Westpoint and Middlepoint on the report of a domestic violence incident. The male caller told officers that he was driving past his wife's home when she jumped in front of his car and it stalled. The wife then approached the husband and punched him in the face several times. The husband had visible injuries and requested that the wife be arrested. The officers located the wife, who had no injuries, and booked her for domestic violence (050 266 9230).

Possession Marijuana for Sale, Palou and Hawes, March 9, 12:52 p.m.
Bayview plainclothes officers received information from an informant that a local drug dealer (known to the officers) was driving a cream colored Dodge Magnum in the area of Oakdale and Baldwin and had concealed a handgun under the front seat of the auto. The officers located the man near Palou and Hawes, driving the described vehicle and smoking marijuana, and they detained him. The man was found to have 30 baggies of marijuana stuffed inside his underwear. (They were very large underwear.) The car was searched also and no gun was found. The suspect, living in Fairfield, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale. A passenger, living on the 1100 block of Oakdale, was booked for an outstanding arrest warrant (050 267 313).

Aggravated Assault, San Bruno and Bacon, March 9, 2:17 p.m.
Bayview Officers Kwan and Hui responded to a call of a fight on a Muni bus.

The 52 year old male caller told officers that he had been seated in the rear of the bus when he saw an elderly woman looking for a seat on the bus and he asked a young man to move his backpack from a seat so that the woman could sit down. The young man became angry and swore at the victim. The young man was then joined by several more young men and women and they began to beat the victim. The suspects all exited the bus at the next stop. The suspects are described only as black males and females, 18-20 years of age. The victim had numerous injuries and stated he would seek his own medical treatment (050 267 943).

Marijuana Sales, 3rd and Revere, March 9, 3:28 p.m.
Bayview's plainclothes officers were in the area of 3rd and Revere when they found a 15 year old girl seated inside a parked vehicle and found marijuana next to the girl. The officers determined that the girl was a reported runaway and contacted her mother. The mother told the officers that her daughter had been dealing drugs and was involved with "serious drug dealers" who had been threatening her and her family. The mother wanted the girl taken to YGC, and the officers brought her there and charged her with possession of marijuana for sale. The allegations of ties to drug dealers will be investigated by our Juvenile Unit (050 268 719).

Warrant Arrest, 1671 Jerrold, March 9, 3:44 p.m.
Officers Berge and Lew responded to the 1600 block of Kirkwood on a call that a naked man was standing in front of the caller's home. The caller directed the officers to a home behind his, and pointed to an adjoining backyard where the offender was standing. The officers approached the suspect and found it to be a woman, fully clothed. The woman, a transient, had two outstanding drug warrants for her arrest and was booked for the warrants (050 268 327).

Heroin Case, Hudson and Reuel, March 9, 4:59 p.m.
Bayview Officers Bodisco and Reynoso were on patrol when they stopped a vehicle for mechanical violations. The driver provided a fictitious name to the officers and was arrested. An arrest search revealed both marijuana and heroin, and the driver, living on the 2000 block of Quesada, was booked for both, as well as for an outstanding warrant charging him with

possession of cocaine. A passenger, 17 years of age and living on the 1300 block of Revere, was arrested for an outstanding warrant charging him with possession of a loaded handgun (050 268 731).

Warrant Arrest, Jennings and Revere, March 9, 6:45 p.m.
Bayview Officer Buelow was on patrol when he saw a man he knew to be wanted and arrested the man. The suspect, living on the 1100 block of Oakdale, was booked for two outstanding felony drug warrants (031 477 658).

Crack Cocaine Possession, 107 Venus, March 9, 7:23 p.m.
Bayview's plainclothes team responded to a home on Venus to exercise a "probation search" on a local drug dealer. The officers found the probationer home and located varying amounts of marijuana, crack cocaine, MDMA (ecstasy), Vicodin, and hashish in his room. In addition, the officers found over \$1500.00 in currency and seized it as evidence. The suspect, living on Venus, was booked for numerous drug charges and violation of his probation (050 269 353).

Aggravated Assault, 158 Gaven, March 9, 9:05 p.m.
Bayview Officers Coleman and Nichols responded on a call that two aggravated assault suspects from the prior day had returned to the area. The officers were told that the suspects had just fled in a car, and the officers determined that the suspects lived on the 700 block of Peru Street. The officers responded to the home on Peru Street and located both suspects, who were then arrested. The suspects, living on Peru, were booked for aggravated assault and vandalism (050 264 096).

Warrant Arrest, 207 Westpoint, March 9, 9:25 p.m.
Bayview plainclothes officers responded to Westpoint and Middlepoint on the report of someone shooting a gun. As the officers arrived they saw a man they knew look in their direction and then begin to run away. The officers pursued the man and eventually caught him. The officers found the man to have three outstanding felony warrants for his arrest and he was booked for the warrants (050 269 632).

Warrant Arrest, 461 Goettingen, March 9, 9:59 p.m.
Bayview Officers Chiang and Borgen responded on the call of a verbal dispute involving family members and the caller (father) asked that his 38 year old daughter be escorted from the premises. The daughter, a transient, was found to have an outstanding arrest warrant and was booked for the warrant (050 269 892).

Auto Boost, 1346 Gilman, March 10, 1:51 a.m.
 Bayview Officers Norris and Whitfield responded on the call of an auto boosting which had just occurred. Dispatch provided the officers with a suspect description, and as they were arriving at the scene they saw a man who matched the description and detained him. The caller was brought to the scene of the detention, but he wasn't sure if the detainee was the suspect he had seen breaking into his car. The detainee, living on the 1100 block of Hollister, was released with no charges (050 270 269).
