Crime and Enforcement Update

Robbery, Palou and Newhall, June 1, 1:30 p.m.

Bayview Officer George was on patrol when she was flagged down by a Spanish speaking man who stated that he had just been robbed after exiting a Muni bus. A Spanish speaking officer responded to the scene and learned that two suspects had attacked the man and stolen his property as he got off the bus. Suspect one is a black male, 18-24, 5'11", wearing a black mask over his face, black T-shirt and blue jeans. Suspect two is a black male, 5'2", wearing a red jacket and blue jean pants (050 613 493).

Burglary, 2277 Shafter, June 1, 2:37 p.m.

Bayview Officers Mojica and Stoumen responded on a theft call and spoke with employees who stated that a male suspect had just entered their warehouse and stolen a recently purchased power washer. The suspect is a white male, 40-44, 5'10", 180, wearing dark pants and a dark sweatshirt (050 613 697).

Stolen Auto, Turner Terrace and Missouri, June 2, 9:41 a.m.

Bayview Officers DiCroce and Catlett were on patrol when they saw four young men in a parked vehicle and determined that the vehicle was stolen. The juveniles were all detained and several family members approached the officers to say that the vehicle had been parked there for several days. The juveniles were identified and released to their parents, after being told to avoid sitting in vehicles they don't own (050 299 827).

Bayview Officer Kwan responded on the call of a male hanging onto a vehicle being driven by a female. The officers found and interviewed the female who stated that she and her husband had been in an argument and the husband had attacked the wife. The wife attempted to flee the area in her car and

the husband jumped onto the hood of the car, eventually falling off. The wife stopped at the main gate (of the Alice Griffith Development) and the husband again approached and again jumped on the car's hood. The wife again took off and "swerved" the car in an effort to get the husband to fall off of the car, which he eventually did. The man then ran back into the Doublerock area and was not available for interview (050 617 019).

Bayview Officer Nasir spoke with a 13 year old student at MLK School who stated that he had just been shot (with an air gun) by a fellow student (8th grader). School authorities were interviewed and stated that the suspect had already been suspended for an unrelated matter (050 617 508).

Possession Marijuana for Sale, Palou and Hawes, June 2, 3:04 p.m.

Bayview Officers Lyons, Scott, and Izaguirre were on patrol when they saw a group young men loitering at Oakdale and Baldwin. Two of the young men looked at the officers and then took off running. The officers pursued and caught one of the young men, who had several individually packaged baggies of marijuana in his pants. The suspect, living on the 1000 block of Plymouth, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale, resisting arrest, and trespassing on public housing property (050 617 558).

Possession Methamphetamine, 1539 Ingalls, June 2, 3:13 p.m.

Bayview Officers Benzinger, Mustafich, and Solares were on patrol when they saw a known drug dealer conversing with a man in a passing car.
