Wellness Expo and Block Party

Crime and Enforcement Update

Warrant Arrest, Middlepoint and Westpoint, June 23, 8:53 a.m.
Bayview Officer Pascua was on patrol and stopped a vehicle for traffic violations. He determined that the driver was both unlicensed and had an active warrant charging him with driving with no license. The driver, living on Kiska Road, was booked for both violations and his vehicle was impounded (050 699 835).

Warrant Arrest, 2000 McKinnon, June 23, 1:00 p.m.
Bayview Officers Ernst and Garate placed a wanted man under arrest after receiving information from the Inspector assigned to the case that a warrant had been issued (050 700 971).

Possession Cocaine, 42 Dakota, June 23, 1:31 p.m.
Bayview Officers Solares, DeJesus, Brandt, and Benzinger were on patrol when they saw a known drug dealer whom they knew to be on active probation, and the officers began to approach him. The man took off running and ran into a nearby unit. The officers pursued the man and were met by a woman who told them that she didn't know the man, and pointed out that he had just run into the bathroom. The officers heard the toilet flushing, and moments later, the man exited the bathroom and was placed under arrest. The officers found two large rocks of crack cocaine still in the toilet bowl, and found additional powder cocaine and packaged marijuana on the man. The suspect assured the officers that the crack wasn't his,

suggesting that he simply "really had to go" to the bathroom. The suspect, living on the 900 block of Alabama, was booked for numerous drug charges, resisting arrest, and violation of probation (050 701 098).

Warrant Arrest, 550 18th Street, June 23, 1:49 p.m.
Bayview Officer Lavin was on patrol when she found a homeless man "squatting" in an abandoned building and arrested him for an outstanding criminal warrant from Oakland (050 701 361).

Robbery, San Bruno and Mansell, June 23, 4:45 p.m.
Bayview Officer Dalton responded on a robbery call and spoke with a woman who reported that she was waiting on the street for the bus when a car pulled up and two men got out and approached her. The men threatened to shoot the woman if she didn't give them her property and she complied. Suspect one is a Hispanic male, 5'7", 160, wearing a black sweatshirt pulled over his head. Suspect two is a Hispanic male, 5'7", 160, wearing a black sweatshirt pulled over his head. The vehicle is described as a dark colored four door car (050 702 648).

Robbery, Kirkwood and Dolphin, June 23, 4:50 p.m.
Bayview Officers Madrid and Rodriguez responded on a call of a man with a gun and spoke with the male caller who stated that two juveniles had just attempted to rob him. The victim reported that two boys had approached him and displayed a black semi-auto handgun and demanded his money, but he told them that he had none. The suspects then fled on foot. Suspect one is a black male juvenile, 12-15, 5'2", 100, wearing a black beanie cap, black jacket, and black pants (armed with handgun). Suspect two is a black male juvenile, 14-16, 5'9", 100, wearing a black jacket and black pants (050 702 187).

Warrant Arrest, Lane and Underwood, June 23, 5:26 p.m.
Bayview Officers Solares, Benzinger, Brandt, Mustafich and DeJesus were on patrol when they saw two men (both of whom were wanted) walking together. Both men were arrested. Suspect one, living on Venus, was booked for a warrant charging him with possession of cocaine. Suspect two, living on the 1500 block of VanDyke, was booked for a warrant charging him with resisting arrest (050 284 260).

Arson, 17 Bertha, June 23, 5:50 p.m.

Bayview Officers Madrid and Rodriguez responded on an arson call and met with firefighters who had detained a man they had found throwing furniture into a fire. The man told officers that the "demons" made him do it (with apologies to Flip Wilson), and that "...Satan was there with me and we were partying!" The man was booked for arson and a psych hold was placed on him also (050 702 400).

Burglary, 1300 block of Kansas, June 23, 6:00 p.m.
Bayview Officers Cruz and Festa responded on a burglary call and spoke with a caregiver who reported that he was checking on the well being of his disabled friend and found that a window had been broken and property had been stolen from the apartment. The resident was unaware of the burglary due to his disability. No suspects were seen (050 702 676).

Possession of a Firearm and Cocaine, 2 Doublerock, June 23, 6:08 p.m.
Bayview's plainclothes team responded on a shots fired call in which two men were described, and two men who matched the description provided (an adult and a juvenile) were detained. The officers found a rifle nearby, and found numerous spent shell casings near it also. The officers attempted to isolate the casings, but a crowd gathered and started kicking and throwing the casings. A second crowd surrounded the officers and various individuals in the crowd shouted out various anti-police epithets. The officers brought both subjects to Bayview Station, as well as the rifle, but they were unable to seize any additional evidence, as it had been destroyed by the crowd at the arrest scene. The adult subject was found to possess both crack cocaine and a large amount of currency. The first suspect, 20 years old and living on 21st Street, was booked for numerous weapons and drug charges, and the second suspect, 17 years old and living on Nichols, was booked for an outstanding arrest warrant (050 702 579).

Sex Offender, Napoleon and Evans, June 23, 9:47 p.m.
Bayview Officer Cahill was on patrol when he saw a man (whom he knew to be a convicted sex offender) pushing a shopping cart. The officer stopped the man and found that he had failed to properly register, as required under his sex offender status. The man was booked for the offense (050 703 345).

Shots Fired, Kirkwood and Phelps, June 23, 10:18 p.m.
Bayview Officers Johnson and Erb responded on a shots fired call and spoke with the female caller who reported that she had heard shots being fired outside her home and looked out her with see two vehicles fleeing from the area. The vehicles were a gray colored American made SUV, and a black American made vehicle. Several assault rifle expended shell casings were found by officers in the area (050 703 254).

Warrant Arrest, Westpoint and Middlepoint, June 24, 12:45 a.m.
Officers from out SWAT team were on patrol and responded to Westpoint and Middlepoint on a call of shots being fired and detained a man found at the scene. The man, living on Westpoint Road, was found to have two outstanding warrants for his arrest and was booked for the warrants (050 703 599).
