Crime and Enforcement Update

Shots into a Dwelling, LaSalle and Newcomb, June 20, 12:15 a.m.
Bayview Officers Farrell and Wise responded on a shots fired call and met with a woman who reported that she had just been shot at while inside her vehicle. The woman was bleeding from glass fragments from the rear car window she had been sitting adjacent to. The woman, along with the other two occupants in the car, stated that they saw no suspects and could provide no explanation for why they had been shot at (050 685 925).

Possession Firearm, 3rd and 16th, June 20, 2:07 a.m.
Bayview Officer Cahill responded on a shots fired call and saw two vehicles fleeing from the area which matched the description provided by Dispatch of the suspect vehicles (green SUV and gold Oldsmobile). The officer was able to stop one of the vehicles and found that the driver had hidden a loaded handgun inside a blanket within the car. The driver stated that he had in fact been shooting his handgun, but only in self defense. The driver stated that a second set of suspects had been shooting at him as he stood at 3rd and 16th Street. The driver, living in Oakland, was booked for weapons charges (050 686 070).

Robbery, 1434 18th Street, June 20, 1:52 p.m.
Bayview Officers Dicroce and Doherty responded on the call of a pursesnatch and spoke with a woman who reported that as she was about to get onto a Muni bus, a male suspect grabbed her purse and broke it free of her grip. The suspect then fled on foot with the purse. The suspect is a black male, 17-19, 5'8", 150, corn row hair with shoulder length braids, wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt and blue jean pants (050 688 543).

Burglary Arrest, Fairfax and Evans, June 20, 1:55 p.m.
Bayview Officers Remedios and Mostasisa responded on a call that a woman had just broken a car's window, and the officers located the car and found a woman hiding inside of it. The car's stereo had been removed and the interior of the vehicle was strewn with other property. The woman was arrested and the victim was located. Not surprisingly, the victim did not know the woman, nor had he given her permission to remove his stereo. The woman, a transient, was booked for burglary (050 688 571).

Possession Cocaine, 3rd and Newcomb, June 20, 3:27 p.m.
Bayview Officers Fitzpatrick, Benzinger and Mustafich were on patrol when they saw a couple engaged in what appeared to be a drug transaction. The man, living on the 1700 block of Oakdale, was found to possess crack cocaine and was arrested (050 688 979).

Bayview Officer Marchand took a report of a robbery from a female high school student who stated that she had been attacked by six girls when walking home from summer school. The victim stated that the suspects beat and kicked her and then fled. The victim believes all of the suspects live in the Sunnysdale Development, and knew one of the girls is named Denisha and attends Burton High School (050 689 698).

Bayview Officers Rightmire and Hastings were on patrol when they saw a man they knew to be on parole. The man was found to possess both crack cocaine and a crack pipe and was booked for the offenses (050 689 808).

Bayview Officers Lyons and Scott, along with Sgt. Fabbri, were on patrol when they saw a man they knew to be on probation loitering in public housing. Shots Fired and Animal Cruelty, Northridge and Dormitory, June 20, 11:51 p.m.
Bayview Officers Singh and Farrell responded on a shots fired call and failed to locate a crime scene, but they did find an injured cat wandering about and saw that it was injured (its jaw was missing).
