Westmob Gangster Pleads Guilty

The US Attorney's Office for Northern California announced yesterday that Henry Tobias, a notorious member of the Westmob gang, has pleaded guilty to nine felony offenses prior to the start of his federal trial. Tobias pleaded guilty to an additional felony count following the selection of the jury. Tobias was indicted by a federal grand jury on May 10, 2005, and all of his offenses occurred in the area of Westpoint and Middlepoint (Westmob territory) on Hunter's Point Hill. Tobias will be sentenced August 17 in U.S. District Court. This is a major win for the entire Bayview community, and we will continue to push for federal prosecutions for our many lawless Bayview gangsters.

Crime and Enforcement Update

Heroin Arrest, 1748 LaSalle, June 1, 12:59 p.m.

Bayview Officers DeJesus, Solares, Fitzpatrick and Aherne were on patrol when they saw a known drug user (currently on parole with a search condition) loitering in the area. The man was searched and a stash of heroin was found. The man, living on the 1200 block of Kirkwood, was booked for possession of heroin (050 612 570).

Possession Marijuana for Sale, 3rd and McKinnon, June 1, 1:10 p.m.

Bayview Officers Solares, DeJesus, Fitzpatrick and Aherne were on patrol when they saw a known female drug dealer engaged in what appeared to be a drug transaction. The officers approached the woman and she shoved something into the crotch area of her pants. A female officer searched and located a stash of marijuana and the woman stated to the officers, "Why you trippin' off some weed in my pants?" The suspect, living on Cashmere, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale (050 612 558).

Cocaine Arrest, 106 Westpoint, June 1, 3:30 p.m.

Bayview Officers Fitzpatrick, Aherne, Solares, and DeJesus were on patrol when they saw two men engaged in a drug deal and approached the men. The men immediately began to walk away, and one of them dropped a bag to the ground. The officers recovered the bag and found it to contain crack cocaine. The man who dropped it was arrested and was found to possess additional crack cocaine, as well as methamphetamine. The suspect, living on the 100 block of Westpoint, was booked for numerous drug charges (050 613 346).

Burglary, 59 Watchman Way, June 1, 3:30 p.m.

Bayview Officers Fowlie, Rodatos and Sanders responded on a burglary call and spoke with the victim who stated that she returned home to find her apartment burglarized and was told by a neighbor that a well-known "local" had been seen burglarizing her unit in her absence. Unfortunately, the witness had not thought to phone the police during the actual burglary. The suspect is Cliffton Jones, residing at 7 Watchman Way. Jones is wanted for burglary and is 6'2", 197, and 36 years of age (050 613 590).

Bayview Officers Scott, Lyons, Izaguirre, and Benzinger were on patrol in the Doublerock area when they saw a man on active parole and conducted a parole search. The man was found to be in possession of both a knife and a crack pipe. The man, living in East Palo Alto, was booked for violation of parole and trespassing (050 613 396).

Bayview Officers Johnson and Erb responded on the call of several people armed with guns on a Muni bus. The officers located and stopped the bus, and found several juveniles in the rear of the bus who matched the description given of the persons with guns. Four of the juveniles were found to be armed with pellet guns. The guns were seized and the juveniles were all admonished and released to their parents (050 614 071).

Warrant Arrest, 900 Minnesota, June 1, 11:36 p.m.

Bayview Officers Paul and Arndt responded on a prowler call and found a man loitering in the area. The man, a transient, was found to have an outstanding drug warrant and was booked for the warrant (050 615 091).

Carjacking, 9 Osceola, June 1, 11:41 p.m.

Bayview Officers Wise and Bradford responded on a carjacking call and spoke with a man and woman who had been entering their car when they were approached by armed suspects who demanded their keys and property. The first suspect told the second suspect to shoot the male victim, and the male victim ran away, leaving the female with the suspects. The female victim begged the suspects not to shoot her, and they fled in the couple's car. Suspect one is a black male, 18, 5'5", 130, wearing a beige jacket. Suspect two is a Hispanic male, 5'5", 130, moustache, wearing a rag over his face, a black beanie, and a black hooded sweatshirt. The vehicle stolen is a 2001 Infinity, gold in color, California license of 5DOR595 (050 615 079).

Shooting and Robbery, 1003 Hollister, June 2, 12:20 a.m.

Bayview Officers Borgen and Chiang responded to a shooting call and found a man lying on the sidewalk bleeding from two gunshot wounds. The victim told officers that two suspects had attempted to steal his scooter and had then shot him. The area was searched for suspects and a possible suspect

was located at Cameron and Nichols. The victim positively identified the detained suspect as the one who had accompanied the shooter. The suspect, 13 years of age and living on Middlepoint Road, was booked for attempted murder, robbery and conspiracy. The shooter is described as a black or Hispanic male, 5'6", wearing a black hooded sweatshirt (050 615 176).
