Crime and Enforcement Update

Theft from a Person, 3rd and McKinnon, July 25, 3:30 p.m. Bayview Officers Escobar and Calaunan responded on a theft call and spoke with a man who reported that he was waiting for a Muni bus when a suspect approached him and stole his cell phone. The suspect then got onto a Muni bus and the victim asked for his cell phone back, but the suspect refused to give it back. The suspect is a black male juvenile, 10-12, 4'0", skinny build, silver teeth, wearing black clothing and carrying a backpack (050 835 374).

Attempted Murder, 8 Bass Court, July 26, 3:00 a.m. Bayview Officer Barron interviewed a man who reported that he was arguing with another man (the brother of his girlfriend) because the man had been selling articles belonging to other family members and buyng drugs with the proceeds. The man became enraged and grabbed a knife, threatening to kill the victim. The man then attempted several times to stab the victim. The victim was slashed with the knife but managed to avoid serious injury. The suspect, living on Bass Court, was booked for attempted murder and death threats (050 834 166).

Trespassing, 1014 Connecticut, July 26, 10:45 a.m. Bayview Officer Rodatos responded on a trespasser call and met with a Housing Authority employee who directed him to a vacant unit in which a squatter had been found. The squatter, who provided an address on the 1100 block of Connecticut was found to be in possession of a crack pipe and was cited for both offenses (050 833 475).
