Crime and Enforcement Update

Embezzlement, 1555 Burke, June 29, 12:17 p.m.

Bayview Officers Barron and Ernst responded on a fraud call and spoke with an employee of HMK Stone Care Systems who reported that a former employee had cashed a total of twelve company checks, made payable to himself, without permission or authorization. The employee failed to show up for work following the discovery. The employee, Juan Cabezas, is wanted for questioning by our Fraud inspectors (050 727 000).

Robbery, 1700 block of Quesada, June 30, 9:08 a.m.

Bayview Officers Lew and Berge responded on a man with a gun call and spoke with the female caller who reported that she was entering her parked auto when a 12 year old male juvenile armed with a gun approached her. The juvenile pointed the gun at the victim and demanded her car keys, but the victim reached for a knife to defend herself and yelled out, "You've got to be kidding me." The suspect fled east on Quesada toward 3rd Street on foot. The suspect is a a black male juvenile, 12, 4'10", 110, wearing an electric blue windbreaker and black jeans, armed with a small, gray, semi-auto handgun (050 730 451).

Illegal Lodging, Loomis and Industrial, June 30, 11:32 a.m.

Bayview Officer Lavin responded on a homeless encampment call and found a tent surrounded by garbage, recycling items, stolen shopping carts, a stereo system, and a lounge chair. Two individuals were found in the tent and were cited for illegal lodging (050 730 871).

Assault on School Employee, 100 Whitney Young, June 30, 12:00 P.M.

Bayview Officers Mostasisa and Leung responded on a threats call and spoke with a teacher who reported that a student had just threatened and

assaulted her. The teacher and several students had been travelling in a van to lunch and the suspect student had opened the van's door prior to it coming to a stop. When the teacher admonished the student for the behavior, the student became angry and threw a bag of chocolate chips at her. The student also called the teacher a derogatory name and threatened to slap her. The student fled prior to the arrival of the officers (050 731 073).

Warrant Arrest, 129 Girard, June 1:42 p.m.

Bayview Officers Darnell and Siguido responded on a person with a knife call and met with the caller, a real estate agent, who reported that he had been checking the rear yard of a home when he was confronted by a man armed with a knife. The man refused to leave the yard and the realtor phoned the police. The officers interviewed the man and learned that he had been given permission to stay in the home by a tenant. The knife was located and the man was booked for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with aggravated assault and battery (050 731 487).

Shooting, 3rd and Newcomb, June 30, 3:27 p.m.

Numerous Bayview officers were patrolling 3rd Street when they heard shots being fired near 3rd and Newcomb and began responding. Witnesses at the scene told officers that a black Ford SUV had just fled the scene with four juveniles aboard. Our plainclothes team quickly located an abandoned Ford SUV on Reuel Court and found it to be a stolen auto. A female victim at 3rd and Newcomb told officers that she had been seated in her parked auto when she heard gunshots being fired and saw her windshield shot out. This victim was uninjured. A second victim drove up to 3rd and Newcomb as the officers were securing the crime scene and stated that he had also been shot. Two bullet holes were visible on the driver's side of his car, and one had penetrated the driver's door and struck his leg. The victim was very uncooperative and refused medical treatment. He also refused to provide his name, but provided the officers with another man's name, stating that it was his. Ironically, the man whose name was provided lives on Reuel court, where the stolen SUV suspect vehicle was recovered (050 731 738).

Warrant Arrest, 1730 Newcomb, June 30, 6:22 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when they saw a man they knew to be wanted by the U.S. Marshall's office. The man, living on Burnside, was arrested and booked for the federal warrant (050 732 407).

Possession Cocaine, 961 Connecticut, July 1, 11:41 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when they saw a large group of people "hanging out" on Connecticut and began to approach the group. The people began to disperse and a woman threw a plastic baggie to the ground and began to flee. The officers detained the woman and retrieved the bag, finding it to contain crack cocaine. The woman, living on the 900 block of Connecticut, was booked for possession of crack cocaine for sale (050 733 176).
