General Community Information

Contractor Informational Workshop in Bayview presented by SFPUC. It is Thursday, January 20th from 4-7pm at the Alex Pitcher Conference Room in the Southeast Community Building - 1800 Oakdale Ave. It will provide information on certification and bidding for contractors interested in city contracts. The workshop is sponsored by local nonprofits (YCD, Bayview Rotary, ROSES).

Tow procedures

When a vehicle is towed by the SFPD we notify our TOW DESK immediately. Department of Parking and Traffic does the same. SFPD or DPT does not tow vehicles that are on private property. The owners of the property contract with a tow company to have the vehicles towed. When a tow company tows a vehicle from private property they have to report the tow to the TOW Desk with in so many hours, I believe it is around one hour. This is to keep track of the vehicles towed so that they are not reported stolen. Stolen vehicles are often recovered on private property. They need to be recovered and inventoried for evidentiary reasons by SFPD. We have seen a rise in the complaints against Tow Companies. Vehicles are being towed and our TOW DESK is not being notified. In some cases the Tow Company is notifying the registered owners (how we do not know) and they respond directly to the Tow Company to pick up their car. They pay fees to the company and then drive the vehicle away. Because the vehicle was never brought to the attention of the SFPD it has not been recovered. As far as the officers know it is still a stolen vehicle. (DO NOT DRIVE IT) I can only speculate why these companies operate this way. If they tow a vehicle, call the tow desk, and find out it is stolen. We are notified and recover the vehicle. It is towed to our facility and I do not think the company gets paid. That is why they should notify the TOW DESK before they tow it off the property. We have had reports of the registered owners paying several hundred dollars for towing and storage, When they shouldn't have to.

Citizen's Police Academy, March 1, 2005: The 2005 Citizen's Police Academy is about to start its first session. The class will commence March 1, 2005, and will run every Tuesday night for 15 weeks from 7:00 to 10:00 PM. Interested candidates must meet the following criteria:

- > Must be currently enrolled in school, or have a high school diploma, or GED.
