Crime and Enforcement Update

On February 4, at 12:48 a.m., Bayview Officer Buelow was working an anti-burglary detail in the Potrero Hill area and was at 23rd and Tennessee when he saw a man dressed in dark clothing walking down the sidewalk carrying a pair of bolt-cutters. The officer patted the suspect down and located a screwdriver and a flashlight, as well as a crack pipe. The suspect, living in the Tenderloin, was arrested for possession of burglar tools and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (050 135 726).

On February 4, at 3:46 p.m., Bayview Officers Scott, Lyons and Izaguirre were on patrol on the 1700 block of Newcomb when they arrested a man for violation of his parole and possession of crack cocaine (050 138 281).

On February 4, at 7:20 p.m., Bayview Officers Solares, Fitzpatrick and Mustafich were on patrol at Dakota and Connecticut when they saw a man loitering in the dark near the building line. The officers were walking toward the man, and the man looked in their direction and began to walk away. The man then began running and the officers lost him in the area. The officers then found a fully loaded .357 revolver on the grass that the man had just run through. The officers booked the gun as evidence (050 139 126).

On February 4, at 11:54 p.m., Bayview Officers Wilhelm and Wise responded to Garlington and Commer Court on a report that security guards had arrested two men in possession of a handgun. The guards told the officers that they had found two men loitering in a parked vehicle, and when the guards contacted the men, they observed a handgun under the front seat and notified police. The man in the driver's seat, living on Commer Court, was booked for possession of a loaded handgun by a felon and possession of stolen property (the gun was stolen from San Jose in 1988). The passenger, living on the 1200 block of Webster, was booked for the same charges, as well as for an outstanding warrant (050 139 900).

On February 5, at 9:10 a.m., Bayview Officers Hui and Kwan read the teletype describing the warrant which had been issued for the armed (sawed-off shotgun) robbery suspect from San Bruno Avenue (described in an e-mail last week). The officers recognized the suspect from prior contacts and knew that his grandparents lived on Venus Street. The officers responded to the home and spoke with the grandmother, who verified that the suspect was in her home. The suspect was arrested and booked on the

robbery warrant (050 141 137).

On February 5, at 4:30 p.m., Bayview Officers Coleman and Escobar were on patrol at 1650 Kirkwood when they saw a man they knew to be wanted walking down the street. The officers arrested the man, living on the 1600 block of Kirkwood, for three outstanding felony warrants (050 142 260).

On February 6, Officer Lavin viewed a security video tape of a burglary which was committed in November, 2004, at the Army Street Mini Storage at 1100 26th Street. Officer Lavin recognized the suspect in the tape as a local burglar named Thomas Critchlow. Critchlow was driving a used white pick-up truck during the burglary and was responsible for burglarizing three separate storage units. Critchlow is a white male, born 08/05/50, 5'10", 190, blonde / red hair, blue eyes. As a result of this case, Critchlow is currently wanted for several counts of burglary (041 347 126).

On February 6, at 11:30 p.m., Bayview Officers Bodisco and Siguido responded to Harbor Road on the report of a dispute involving dogs. The officers interviewed both parties and determined that one party had an outstanding warrant. The subject, living on Harbor Road, was booked for an outstanding warrant charging her with auto theft (050 148 597). On February 7, at 7:24 a.m., Bayview Officer Kwan was on patrol on the 600 block of Keith when he saw a revolver on the top of the steps at 603 Keith. The officer seized the revolver and found one spent casing and five live rounds in its cylinder. The gun was booked as evidence (050 146 717).

On February 7, at 12:24 p.m., Bayview Officers DeJesus, Aherne, and Fitzpatrick were on patrol at Westpoint and Middlepoint when they saw a person known to them as both a drug dealer and a member of the "Westmob" gang seated in a parked vehicle. The subject was with another man, also known to the officers as a local drug dealer. The officers detained both men and discovered a quantity of marijuana, methamphetamine, and crack cocaine. The first subject, living on the 200 block of Westpoint and currently on parole, was booked for various drug charges and violation of parole. The second man, living on Westbrook, was booked for possession of crack cocaine for sale. The officers also seized over \$900.00 in currency from the two men and booked it as evidence (050 148 268).

On February 7, at 12:27 p.m., Bayview Officer Berge responded to the 1000 block of Fitzgerald on the call of a burglary which had just occurred. officer arrived on scene and was told by the caller that the two suspects had just boarded a Muni bus and pointed to a bus pulling away from the area. The officers stopped and boarded the bus and located and detained the described suspects. The caller then told the officer that he had just been released from County Jail in San Bruno following a three month stint, and when he returned home, he found the rear door to his apartment kicked The victim then entered his apartment and found it in disarray with numerous items of personal property missing. The two suspects then descended the apartment's stairs and walked past the victim, exiting through the rear door. The victim confronted the suspects about his belongings, but they said nothing. The male subject, a transient, was booked for burglary and was held for Homicide Inspectors. (His rap sheet noted that he was wanted for questioning in a Bayview homicide.) The female suspect, wanted out of Washington for a non-extradition warrant, was booked only for the burglary. (Note that several nearby states refuse to extradite wanted subjects who flee to California, as a means of funneling their criminals to the Golden State.) 050 148 321

On February 7, at 4:13 p.m., Bayview Officers Izaguirre, Fitzpatrick, Aherne and DeJesus were on foot patrol in the Oakdale Housing Development when they came across an "Oakdale Mob" gang member on active felony probation for a drug sales case. The man, upon seeing the officers, ran up a flight of stairs, put his hands into his pants, and removed an object. The man then threw the object into a hole in the wall below the unit at 1144 Palou. The officers retrieved the object and found it to be a bag of crack cocaine. The man, living on the 1100 block of Palou, was booked for possession of crack cocaine for sale, destroying evidence, and violation of probation (050 149 448).

On February 8, at 4:04 a.m., Bayview Officer Norris responded to the 900 block of Keys on a threats call. The officer found a man in front of the caller's home who had been throwing rocks at the home's windows. The caller told officers that the subject was her ex-boyfriend, who was angry that she was dating a new man. The subject was wanted for an outstanding warrant charging him with violation of parole and was booked on the warrant (050 150 809).
