

## BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE February 4, 2005

### Cameras

At last night's ROSES meeting, a community member raised the issue of "crime cameras" for the Bayview District, and how they would assist us in dealing with rampant crime at problem locations. The department has no such cameras, but there are two possibilities for securing such security systems which have recently been explored. The first option comes from a company named Safety Dynamics, located in Illinois, which has made presentations to both the Bayview Rotary Club and the Police Commission about a product they sell known as the Senti System. This product, which is normally mounted on utility poles in high crime areas recognizes the sound of gunshots within a two block area and then activates a flashing strobe light and isolates the direction of the gun shot. The device then sends an alarm to a command center (police) and provides information about the shots to the officers as they are responding. The device includes a pan-tilt camera system which is able to "catch" the suspect in real time. The second option is available through a federally funded program known as HIDTA (high intensity drug trafficking area), and could provide one (or more) cameras for problem locations which could then be accessed and monitored by local law enforcement. We are exploring both options. When the residents attending last night's ROSES meeting were asked if they would support a camera system for problem locations, there was near unanimous support for such a system.

### Portola Robbery

On December 17, 2004, three Asian girls were walking on San Bruno Avenue when they were approached by two men armed with a sawed-off shotgun. The girls were robbed at gunpoint and the suspects fled with their property. The main (armed) suspect has now been identified in this case, and a \$250,000.00 warrant was issued yesterday for his arrest. The suspect is Delvon Sanders, born 12/05/85, 6'0", 155, black male, last known address on the 300 block of Hamilton Street. If you see this subject, phone 9-1-1 immediately (041 432 573).

### Crime and Enforcement Update

On February 2, at 11:00 p.m., Bayview Officer Whitney responded to the 1600 block of Revere on the report that a burglary had just occurred. The caller told the officer that he heard noises coming from his garage and when he investigated, he found a man inside his garage who then fled out the back door and got away. The suspect is a black male, 40-50, 5'8", 140, salt and pepper hair, no further description (050 132 346).

On February 3, at 7:20 a.m., Bayview Officers Ernst and Garate responded to the 1100 block of Wisconsin on the report of an auto boost in progress. The caller told officers that he saw a suspect inside of a neighbor's car and told the suspect to get away from the car. The suspect told the witness he would shoot him if he didn't go away, and the witness then phoned police. The suspect fled as the witness was phoning the police, and is described as a black male, 5'8", overweight, wearing a white T-shirt, black backpack and black pants (050 132 158).

On February 3, at 9:30 a.m., Bayview Officers Lavin, Parry and Pi responded to the 2300 block of 3rd Street on a graffiti call. The caller told officers that the "tagger" had just boarded a Muni bus, and the officers stopped the bus and detained the suspect. The suspect, a 44 year old man, admitted to officers that he had been tagging "Hoss 5," in the area, and the officers located numerous tags within a few blocks. Due to the numerous tags and the extent of damage, the suspect was charged with felony vandalism (050 132 681).

On February 3, at 1:55 p.m., Bayview Officer Lavin responded to the 1300 block of Egbert on the report of a man living in a vehicle. The officer found the man and determined that he had an outstanding parole violation for his arrest. The man, a transient, was booked for the warrant (050 134 198).

On February 3, at 3:53 p.m., Bayview Officers Scott, Lyons and Izaguirre were interviewing several men at Keith and Thomas when an additional man began yelling at them. The officers identified this man and determined that he was wanted for an outstanding warrant. While booking the man at Bayview Station, two bags of marijuana were found on his person and he was charged with both the marijuana and the warrant (050 134 314).

On February 3, at 5:41 p.m., Bayview Officers Solares, Aherne and Benzinger were on patrol at 3rd and Newcomb when they saw a man and a woman huddled together in front of 1631 Newcomb. The officers recognized both subjects as regulars in the local drug scene, and as the couple saw the officers, they began to walk away in different directions. The man was then seen to discard a paper bundle, which the officers recovered and found to contain four rocks of crack cocaine. The man then threatened the officers and told them, "You better get a stun gun, because I'm about to hurt you!" The woman was detained and admitted that she had been in the process of purchasing some crack when the officers first arrived. The man, living on Dukes Court, was booked for possession for sale of crack cocaine and threats against an officer. The woman was released at the scene (050 134 659).

On February 3, at 6:01 p.m., Bayview Officers Erb and Johnson were on patrol at Innes and Selby when they saw a man walking away from a parked auto carrying a case of motor oil. The officers drove past the auto and saw that its rear window was smashed. The officers returned to the man to detain him and saw that he had slipped through a hole in a fence at the end of Innes. The officers used their PA system to order the man to stop, and he dropped the case of motor oil and began running across the railroad tracks. The officers pursued the suspect on foot and caught up to him at Evans and Selby, placing him under arrest. The suspect, a transient, was booked for auto burglary and possession of stolen property. The suspect was also wanted for violation of his parole and was booked for this also. The suspect, a transient, has numerous convictions for burglary, robbery, and other offenses (050 134 762).

On February 3, at 10:38 p.m., Bayview Officer Norris responded to the 100 block of Gilman on the report of a fight. The officer interviewed the female caller who told him that she had just been involved in a physical

fight with her baby's father who had punched her, threatened her, and then smashed her car's windshield with a stick. As the victim was being interviewed, the suspect ran past the scene and was pointed out by the victim. Back-up officers found the suspect hiding in a grass field behind the Bret Harte School on Ingerson and arrested him. The suspect, living on the 900 block of Arlington, was booked for vandalism and domestic violence (050 135 403).

On February 3, at 10:56 p.m., Bayview Officers Lyons and Scott, along with Sgt. Fabbri, were working an auto boosting detail when they came across a man holding a screwdriver as he was seated in a vehicle parked on Silver Avenue. The officers approached the man and saw that the ignition was "punched" on the auto and the driver was still holding a screwdriver in his hand. The officers had the driver and passenger exit the car and then saw a glass crack pipe on the seat where the driver had been sitting. The officers then determined that the driver was on probation from San Mateo County and they performed a probation search, finding both crack cocaine and heroin in the man's pockets. The officers then found a wallet under the front seat, and inside the wallet located credit cards and checks in the names of five different people. The officers then asked the passenger her name, and she provided a fictitious name. The passenger's actual name was obtained at Bayview Station (via mug shots and fingerprints), and she was booked for four outstanding criminal warrants. The driver, living on the 800 block of Laguna, was booked for numerous drug charges and numerous fraud charges (050 135 538).

On February 4, at 1:00 a.m., Bayview Officers Bates and Batchelder responded to 1830 3rd Street on a call that security officers were fighting with a man. The security guards directed the officers to a man who was intoxicated and had threatened the guards to fight. The man, living in Los Angeles, was booked for both disturbing the peace and public intoxication (050 135 754).

On February 4, at 2:44 a.m., Bayview Officers Whitfield and Norris responded to 5201 3rd Street on the call of an auto boost which had just occurred. The caller told officers that he heard his car alarm sound and went outside to find a man sitting in his car and going through his belongings. The victim phoned police and the suspect fled. The suspect is described as a black male, 5'5", 130, wearing a black jacket with red writing on the back and blue jean pants (050 135 889).
