Crime and Enforcement Update

On February 16, at 9:35~a.m., Bayview Officers Dicroce, Kwan and Hui responded to the 400~block of Dwight on a burglary call. The victims told

officers that they had left their home for a few minutes and, upon returning, had seen two men fleeing from the home. Suspect one is a black

male, 20-25, 6'0", 180, wearing all black clothing. Suspect two is a black

male, 6'0", 180, wearing all black clothing (050 183 189).

On February 16, at 10:50 a.m., Bayview Officer Nasir, assigned to Thurgood

Marshall High School, took a report from two students of an assault that

had occurred on February 14 aboard a Muni bus. The two victims, both Asians who spoke very little English, stated that they were on the 44 line

at Silver and Waterville when they were approached by three young men who

a handgun and threatened to shoot the two men and they phoned police. Back-up officers soon located the suspect and interviewed him. The man wouldn't admit to making threats, but said that he did believe that the car

in question belonged to his sister. An independent witness was present at

the scene who verified the death threats made by the suspect.

Additionally, the original victim showed the officers the paperwork for the

car. The suspect was booked for terrorist threats and traffic offenses $(050\ 183\ 929)$.
