

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE December 9, 2004

Light Rail Meeting

The Third Street Light Rail project will sponsor a community meeting on Tuesday, December 14, from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. at the Pacific Energy Center, 851 Howard Street. Muni is looking for input from the public, and everyone is encouraged to attend.

Tree Collection

Golden Gate Disposal and Sunset Scavenger wish to remind everyone that Christmas trees may be recycled by placing them at the curb during the week of January 3-7, 2005. Please remove all bases (wood is OK), lights, tinsel, etc., and no flocked trees.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On December 6, at 3:33 p.m., Bayview officers made a traffic stop of a vehicle at Revere and Robblee and asked the driver for his license. The driver told officers he had no license with him, but he provided them with a citation from the CHP which listed a name and address from South San Francisco. As the officers returned to their car, the driver jumped from his car and fled on foot onto Robblee. The vehicle was towed and the officers ran the name of the person on the citation for a driving history. The physical description of the person who had run from the officers matched the description in the driving history (041 386 544).

On December 8, at 11:00 a.m., a Bayview officer was working at Burton High School on Mansell when he learned that one of the students had been threatened by another student with violence. The second student, living in the Excelsior and a "Norteno" gang member, had been dealing drugs at the school and had passed some of the drugs off to the first suspect to avoid being caught with them. The first student had subsequently been caught with the drugs by school authorities and the drugs were confiscated. The second student then demanded the money for the drugs from the first student, and the first student broke down and went to the office, telling the school officials he feared for his life. The officer arrested the second student and booked him for threats, gang affiliation, and drug charges (041 393 254).

On December 8, at 2:34 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at 3rd and Kirkwood when they saw a vehicle parked which they knew belonged to a known local drug dealer. The drug dealer, a validated member of the notorious BNT gang (Broke (n-word) Thievin'), is on both probation and parole and the officers approached the vehicle to talk with him. Two other parties were seated in the vehicle, a man and a woman, and the man was "rolling a joint." The man, on parole and living on the 1000 block of Wisconsin, was arrested and booked for violation of parole and possession of marijuana. The woman was released at the scene. The woman admitted to officers that the vehicle's owner had run into a nearby liquor store upon seeing the officers approaching. The officers checked the liquor store and learned that the suspect had run out the rear of the store just after entering (041 394 428).

On December 8, at 6:03 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at 3rd and Revere when they saw a known drug dealer loitering on the corner. The officers were aware that the drug dealer was prohibited from being at that corner by virtue of a court-issued stay away order, and the officers began to approach the man. The man ran into a liquor store on the corner and the officers followed, telling him that he was under arrest for violation of a court order. The man began to struggle with the officers, taking both of them to the ground, where he was eventually controlled and arrested. The man was in possession of marijuana and was booked for marijuana possession, violation of probation, violation of a court order, and resisting arrest (041 395 084).

On December 8, at 7:46 p.m., Bayview officers were sent to the liquor store at 4700 3rd Street on a report that numerous individuals were loitering in the doorway. The officers detained three individuals in the doorway and found one of the them to have a probation search condition, which was exercised. Seventeen bags of marijuana were found in the man's backpack and he was arrested. The man, living on the 1400 block of LaSalle, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale and violation of probation (041 395 410).

On December 8, at 10:35 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 500 block of Goettingen on a pursesnatching call. The victim told officers that she was walking up the stairs of her home and was about to enter her front door when a man approached her from behind and grabbed her backpack. The suspect ran to a black vehicle parked on Woolsey and entered the vehicle, fleeing toward San Bruno Avenue. The suspect is a black male, 20-25, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and black pants (041 395 846).

On December 8, at 11:09 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at San Bruno and Silliman when they stopped a vehicle for not displaying a license plate. The officers determined that the driver's license had been suspended (four times) and he was placed under arrest for this (continuing) violation. The officers were conducting an inventory of the car prior to towing it and located a toolbox which contained several blank auto ignition keys and three hand-held key making devices. The keys and tools were booked as potential evidence due to the large number of auto thefts and auto burglaries in this neighborhood of the district (041 395 880).

On December 9, at 12:46 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol when they saw a garage on fire on the 1700 block of Palou. The officers exited their car and approached the home and found the home's owner attempting to extinguish the fire. The SFFD then arrived and the fire was put out. The officers then observed a hydroponics drip system, planted marijuana, a large scale, water containers, heating lamps, and a large bucket containing marijuana. The Fire Department personnel then told officers that they had located additional marijuana upstairs in the home. The officers ran the homeowner's criminal history and learned that he is an active member of the Hells Angels (per the national gang and terrorist database). The man then provided officers with a certificate which showed him to be a "Compassionate Caregiver" for marijuana distribution. The man was booked for an outstanding arrest warrant and the marijuana case was referred to our Narcotics Unit for follow-up (041 396 242).
