

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE December 6, 2004

Anonymous Tip Line

Every police station in San Francisco has its own anonymous tip line. These lines go to voicemail and are checked daily. Although we receive periodic information on our line, it would be beneficial to our criminal investigations if these lines were used more frequently. The number for Bayview's tip line is 822-8147.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On December 3, at 11:49 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on the 200 block of Barneveld when they saw a man they knew to be a sex offender who had failed to register his most recent address with the police department. The man was arrested and charged with the offense (041 374 696).

On December 3, at 2:26 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers responded to a home on Nichols Way in order to conduct a probation search of the man living there, who had been implicated in a separate incident from earlier in the day. The officers found the man upstairs in the home, and located a firearm, live ammunition, and crack cocaine in his bedroom. In addition, a quantity of methamphetamine was found in his car. The man, living on the first block of Nichols Way, was arrested for felon in possession of a firearm, possession of meth, possession of crack, possession of live ammunition by a felon, and violation of parole (041 375 478).

On December 3, at 2:45 p.m., Bayview officers took a report from a woman who told them that her ex-boyfriend had been threatening to do physical harm to her and her son since she had broken up with him two months earlier. The ex-boyfriend had threatened to both physically harm and kidnap her and her son. The officers obtained an Emergency Protective Order and referred the case to our Domestic Violence Unit (041 374 903).

On December 3, at 4:20 p.m., Bayview officers responded to San Bruno and Bacon regarding a street robbery. The victim told officers that two suspects had robbed him of his personal property and then fled on foot. The victim has seen the suspects in the area on prior occasions. Suspect one is an Asian male, 15-16, 5'4", 115, wearing a black beanie, black coat with brown fur collar, and black pants. Suspect two is a black male, 5'10", 135, wearing a black beanie, black coat and blue pants (041 375 763).

On December 3, at 7:34 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Fitzgerald and Jennings when they saw a man drive by in a vehicle which had earlier been reported stolen. The officers stopped the vehicle and removed the driver from it, but he resisted their efforts to control him and had to be restrained. The man was eventually arrested and charged with stolen auto. The man was also charged with two outstanding arrest warrants from Marin County (041 376 501).

On December 3, at 11:00 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1000 block of Connecticut Street on a burglary call. The caller told officers that she

had come home to find her apartment burglarized and her property missing. The caller's neighbors then told her that her uncle had been seen in the area selling the items which had been stolen from her apartment. The case is being investigated by our Burglary Detail (041 379 367).

On December 4, at 9:45 a.m., Bayview officers took a report from a woman who had been walking to her car which was parked at 22nd and 3rd Streets when she saw a man leaning over near her car, and then quickly walking away. As the woman arrived at her car she saw the window shattered and realized the man she had seen had stolen her stereo. The woman tracked the man down and confronted him nearby, but he jumped into a cab and fled the area. The man is a Hispanic male, 20-30, 5'10", 160, wearing a black backpack, a black jacket and black pants (041 377 991).

On December 4, at 2:51 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on the 1500 block of Newcomb when they saw a man they knew to be wanted standing on the sidewalk. The officers detained the man and he provided a fictitious name to the officers. The officers booked the man for the outstanding drug arrest warrant as well as possession of marijuana and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (040 229 373).

On December 4, at 9:35 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1000 block of Wisconsin on the report of a person breaking down the front door of a residence. The caller told officers that her boyfriend had attempted to break down her front door prior to the arrival of the officers. The victim also stated that her boyfriend had been inside her unit earlier in the evening and had punched her and then chased her into the bathroom while threatening her with a knife. The boyfriend, living with the victim on the 1000 block of Wisconsin, was booked for aggravated battery, domestic violence, terrorist threats, vandalism, violation of a court order (prohibiting him from contacting the victim), and an outstanding arrest warrant (041 380 154).

On December 5, at 1:25 a.m., Bayview officers responded to Westpoint Road on a battery call. The victim told officers that her neighbor's brother had physically attacked her after she had tried to purchase some cigarettes from him. After the suspect had battered the victim, the victim ran home. The suspect then threw a bottle through the victim's front window, shattering the window and striking the victim with broken glass. The suspect, living in Millbrae, was booked for aggravated assault, possession of methamphetamine (found in his wallet), aggravated battery, vandalism, and public intoxication (041 380 762).

On December 5, at 3:09 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the El Toro Bar at 2468 San Bruno Avenue on a domestic violence call. The female caller told officers that her ex-boyfriend was seated in his car outside of the bar in violation of a court order which precludes him from being near her. The suspect, living on Potrero Avenue, was booked for violation of a domestic violence court order (041 381 005).

On December 5, at 10:13 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Phelps and Innes when they saw a couple parked in a vehicle and recognized the passenger as a local prostitute. The officers approached the vehicle and it quickly pulled away from the curb. The officers stopped the vehicle and

learned from Dispatch that the vehicle was a reported stolen auto from Daly City. Both occupants were detained and the vehicle's owner was contacted. The driver told officers that the vehicle belonged to his "...baby's mama," however, the vehicle's owner told officers that she had not given anyone permission to possess her car. The driver, living in Vallejo, was booked for stolen auto and driving with a suspended license. The passenger, living in Oakland, was cited for possession of narcotics paraphernalia (041 381 522).

On December 5, at 2:00 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1500 block of Kirkwood on a report of theft of utility services. The caller, an employee of a church on the block, told officers that the next-door neighbor had been stealing utility services for some time, and had been admonished on numerous occasions not to do so. An extension cord could be seen running from an exterior outlet on the church through an open window of the adjacent home. The officers contacted the resident of the home who admitted stealing the electricity, stating that his power had been shut off. The man was cited for the offense (041 383 205).

On December 5, at 4:15 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on foot patrol at Newcomb and Toland when they came across two individuals in a parked vehicle. The officers looked into the vehicle and saw the passenger place a large bag of marijuana into a purse. Both occupants were ordered out of the car and 38 individual bags of marijuana were found inside the larger plastic bag. Also, additional amounts of marijuana were found in the pockets of both individuals. Adjacent to the vehicle was another parked vehicle, and it too had two occupants inside. The officers contacted these individuals also and found the driver to have a search condition as a result of felony probation from San Mateo County. The officers searched this vehicle and found another plastic bag containing marijuana on the car's floorboards. This bag contained three large bags of marijuana, as well as six smaller bags of marijuana. An additional bag containing marijuana was found in the console, and a bag containing numerous small (individual) baggies was also found. A third vehicle was parked adjacent to the first two vehicles, and the officers contacted the man in control of the third car. This man possessed numerous rocks of crack cocaine hidden in the waistband of his underwear. The first man, living on Delta, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale and conspiracy. The second man, living on Oseloa, was booked for the same charges. The third man, who refused to provide an address, was booked for possession of crack cocaine for sale. The fourth person, a woman living on Delta (she had been with the first man), was booked for possession of marijuana for sale and conspiracy (041 382 586).
