

## BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE December 29, 2004

### Ongoing Violence

Yesterday was another violent day in the Bayview. Two homicides were committed, and they appear to be related. In addition, a notorious gangster from the Sunnydale was also shot, and is currently recovering at SFGH. These cases are believed to be related to numerous prior cases which have occurred in the Bayview in the past few months, including the recent homicide of another notorious Bayview gangster. Bayview officers met today with Homicide Inspectors and are following up a series of very promising leads.

### Milton Meyer Activities

For the next two weeks, while our kids are on Christmas break from school, Bayview officers will be present at the Milton Meyer Gym (Hunter's Point Gym) daily from noon to 6:00 p.m. to work with Park & Rec staff to provide activities and programming for the kids on Hunter's Point Hill. Weather permitting, we will have some outdoor sports and activities at the ball field, and at other times, games and activities will take place within the gym. In addition, we'd like to take some of the kids to the zoo or to the Aquarium on one or more of the days. ### Crime and Enforcement Update

On December 28, at 7:20 a.m., Bayview Officers Kwan and Hui responded to Oakdale and Ingalls on a vandalism call. The female caller told officers that her ex-girlfriend had been stalking her and had recently threatened to "...throw gasoline on (her) and set (her) on fire," if she sees her with another woman. The victim went to her car this morning and found that all four tires had been flattened. The victim then saw the suspect near her car and phoned police. The officers were unable to locate the suspect, and the case is being investigated by our Domestic Violence Unit (041 465 510).

On December 28, at 9:00 a.m., Bayview Officer Calaunan responded to the 1200 block of Revere on a domestic violence call. The male caller told the officer that his daughter's ex-boyfriend had come to his home looking for his daughter. When the father refused to tell the ex-boyfriend where the daughter was, the ex-boyfriend became angry and threatened to break into his house and shoot him. The ex-boyfriend then drove to the house of his ex-girlfriend's cousin and demanded of the cousin the current location of the girlfriend. When the cousin replied that he didn't know, the ex-boyfriend threatened to, "...break into (his) house and burn it down." The ex-boyfriend, Chris Porter, has an address on Ellsworth and is being sought in connection with this case (041 467 354).

On December 28, at 10:39 a.m., Bayview Officers Hui and Kwan responded to 3rd and Galvez on the report of a battery. As the officers arrived they found a man and a woman involved in a fight, and the man took off running

upon seeing the police. The man ran to a vacant lot and then climbed a ladder and ran across the roof of the adjacent building, eventually dropping back down to another vacant lot on Hudson. The man then ran across the street and was lost in the area. The female then told officers that the man was her ex-boyfriend, and he was upset that they were no longer romantically involved. The ex-boyfriend had been phoning the woman relentlessly, and had recently threatened to pistol-whip her if she refused to date him. The woman had been walking along 3rd Street today when she saw the ex-boyfriend, who approached her and began to choke her while pouring beer onto her face. The woman ran to a pay phone to summon police, and the ex-boyfriend followed her and ripped the phone from her hands. The ex-boyfriend then pistol-whipped the woman with a .45 handgun. Bayview officers are searching for the ex-boyfriend, and the case is being investigated by our Domestic Violence Unit (041 465 091).

On December 28, at 11:29 a.m., Bayview Officers Rodatos and Sanders responded to 25 Kiska on the report of a shooting victim down in the street. The officers found the victim, still lying in the street with numerous gunshot wounds, and began administering first aid. The victim's wife was at the scene and was present for the shooting, but she refused to provide any information about the suspects. A witness at the scene told officers that ten black males had been seen running from the area just after the shooting. Another witness stated that a cranberry colored Camaro might have been involved. The victim later died of his wounds (041 465 198).

On December 28, at 12:30 p.m., Bayview Officers Dicroce and White responded to the 6600 block of 3rd Street on a kidnaping call. The female caller told the officers that she was walking along Hollister Street with her baby and boyfriend when she was approached by her ex-boyfriend (and father of her baby) who asked to "take" the baby. The ex-boyfriend, who was in the company of his current girlfriend, then picked up the baby and got into a car and drove away. The baby's mother then phoned 9-1-1 and officers responded. The officers were able to eventually track down the ex-boyfriend, and talked him into coming to Bayview Station with the baby. The baby was reunited with the mother and the ex-boyfriend was cited for violation of a restraining order (which prohibits him from contacting either the baby or the baby's mother). The case is being referred to the DA to determine if additional charges will be placed against the ex-boyfriend (041 465 687).

On December 28, at 3:45 p.m., Bayview Officers Escobar and Calaunan responded to a home on the 900 block of Ingerson on a shooting call. The officers spoke with a 16 year old resident of the home who told them that he had been in his bedroom and was startled by the sound of a gunshot. The young man went to his kitchen and found that his mother was lying on the floor with a gunshot wound to her chest. The young man saw a male suspect running from the house and alerted his father, who was in another room, and they phoned 9-1-1. The son and father then saw that their front door had been kicked in. The mother expired of her injuries at MEH. The suspect is described only as a black male, 6'0", skinny build, wearing all black clothing. A possible second suspect (seen running from the area after the shooting) is described as a black male, 5'11", stocky build, dreadlock hair, wearing all black clothing. It is possible that this homicide is

related to the earlier homicide (from Kiska), and it is not believed that this was a random act of violence (041 466 419).

On December 28, at 4:20 p.m., Bayview Officers Bradford and Nichols responded to the 600 block of Gilman on a stabbing call. The officers found a woman, bleeding from a leg wound, and she yelled out, "My husband stabbed me." The woman was quite intoxicated and became uncooperative with the officers, identifying herself only as, "Santa Claus." The woman then told the officers that she didn't want her husband arrested and she didn't want to report the incident. The woman was transported to SFGH and the officers interviewed a neighbor, living in an adjacent trailer, who provided them with names for both the victim and suspect. The officers later received information that the husband had returned to the trailer, and they responded back and arrested the husband for aggravated assault and domestic violence (041 466 481).

On December 28, at 4:30 p.m., Bayview Officer Berge responded to Peabody Street to take a report of a gun incident which had occurred earlier in the day on Dakota Street. The female victim told the officer that her ex-boyfriend had come to her home and demanded his property. When the ex-boyfriend couldn't find his property, he pistol-whipped the victim and then punched her several times. The ex-boyfriend was accompanied by several other males, one of who was armed with an assault rifle. The man with the rifle also threatened the victim, and then fondled her in the presence of the other men. A friend of the victim's then phoned her and told her that he was in front of her home, and she ran out of her apartment and entered the friend's car. Both the victim and the friend then fled. The ex-boyfriend is wanted for numerous felony charges and is believed to live on the 1800 block of 25th Street (041 467 285).

On December 28, at 5:29 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the Franciscan Hotel at 6600 3rd Street on a trespassing call. The manager of the hotel asked that a man be escorted off of the premises, and the officers determined that the man was wanted. The man, living on Reddy Street, was booked for the warrant (041 466 817).

On December 28, at 6:24 p.m., Bayview Officers Reynoso, Dockery, and Suiguido were on patrol at Harbor and Northridge when they saw a man duck down behind a parked car upon seeing them. The officers then saw the man continue to watch them as he also continued to hide behind the car. The officers approached the man and he told them that he was just pouring out some liquor, and the officers then saw several rocks of crack cocaine on the ground at the man's feet. The man, who had a tattoo of "HR" on his chest, which signifies his gang affiliation with "Harbor Northridge," was booked for possession of crack cocaine (041 466 936).

On December 28, at 10:56 p.m., Bayview Officers Erb and Archini responded to the 100 block of Middlepoint on a domestic violence call. The female caller told officers that her she was awakened by noise coming from the first floor of her apartment, and when she went to investigate, she found her ex-boyfriend inside her home. The woman has a restraining order which prohibits the man from contacting her or her son. The man fled prior to the arrival of the police. The case is being investigated by our Domestic Violence Unit (041 467 558).
