

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE December 28, 2004

United States Attorney

I just received the statistics from our Gang Task Force listing the specific criminal (gang) cases referred in 2004 to the US Attorney's office in San Francisco for federal prosecution. A total of 65 criminal defendants were referred to the US Attorney for prosecution, including 63 firearms cases and 2 drug cases. 27 of these cases, including 25 firearms cases, were accepted and are being prosecuted in the federal court system. The 36 cases not accepted for federal prosecution are being pursued in the state courts. (Two of the defendants were murdered while their cases were pending.)

Milton Meyer Activities

Crime and Enforcement Update

On December 26, at 3:20 p.m., Bayview Officers Siguido, Rodatos, Sanders and Reynoso were dispatched to the 100 block of Middlepoint regarding a fight. Dispatch advised the officers that the male involved in the fight was wanted. The officers determined that the combatants had fled prior to their arrival, but later located the male combatant and detained him. The male provided the officers with a name which came back as having an outstanding warrant, and he was arrested. The officers checked the man's mug shot at the station and determined that he had provided them with another man's name. The man eventually gave his actual name, and a parole violation warrant was found for his arrest (041 459 953).

On December 27, at 3:30 a.m., Bayview Officer Hurley was flagged down on Palou by a woman who told her that her that she had just been in a physical confrontation with her 17 year old daughter. The woman stated that she became angry when she learned that her daughter's "...dope-dealing boyfriend" had obtained keys to her home, and she and her daughter argued regarding this development. The woman told officers that she was going to get a restraining order against both her daughter and the boyfriend (041 462 075).

On December 27, at 1:45 p.m., Bayview Officer Whitney responded to the 2600 block of San Bruno regarding a suspicious occurrence. The male caller told officers that "...the government was out to get (him)." The caller also

told officers that he was being watched by unknown people. The caller appeared in good physical health and did not meet the criteria for a psychiatric detention (5150 hold), but he did have an outstanding warrant for his arrest and was taken to County Jail with a request for a psychiatric evaluation by medical personnel in the jail (041 004 774).

On December 27, at 3:30 p.m., Bayview Officers Calaunan and Escobar responded to the 1300 block of Thomas on a vandalism / restraining order violation call. The male caller told officers that his girlfriend had hit the side mirror to his mother's car with an umbrella and knocked the mirror off. The mother then told officers that she doesn't get along with her son's girlfriend, and whenever the girlfriend gets angry, she damages the mother's car. The mother also told officers that she has a restraining order against the girlfriend. The case is being investigated by our Domestic Violence Unit (041 463 675).

On December 27, at 4:15 p.m., Bayview Officers Johnson and Erb, accompanied by Homicide Inspectors, responded to the Franciscan Hotel at 6600 3rd Street in order to arrest a wanted subject. As the officers knocked on the door of room 5, a male jumped from an adjacent window and began fleeing on foot. The officers pursued the male, but lost him in the area. (This male was not the wanted subject.) The officers eventually made entry to the room and found various pieces of evidence, including a quantity of powder cocaine. The wanted subject was not in the room, and the identity of the man who fled is not known, although several items with various names on them were found in the room (041 922 646).

On December 27, at 4:30 p.m., Bayview Officers Madrid and Archini responded to SFGH regarding a domestic violence case. The officers met with the female victim who told them that her ex-boyfriend had come to her home to speak with her about their daughter. The couple began to argue over custody of the child, and the ex-boyfriend punched the woman in the face and knocked her to the ground. The ex-boyfriend then punched her again, rendering her unconscious prior to fleeing. Bayview officers are searching for the suspect. The case is being investigated by our Domestic Violence Unit (041 463 590).

On December 27, at 7:00 p.m., Bayview Officers Calaunan and Escobar responded to the 1200 block of Gilman on a call from an anonymous reportee that a wanted person was inside a specific home. The officers knocked on the door of the home and the woman described by the caller answered the door. The woman, living in the home on the 1200 block of Gilman, was arrested for an outstanding warrant from Modesto charging her with aggravated assault and resisting arrest (041 463 744).

On December 28, at 12:23 a.m., Bayview Officers Wise and Pashby were on patrol on the 1300 block of Shafter when they were flagged down by a man who stated that his van had just been vandalized. The victim told officers that he heard the sound of glass being shattered in front of his home and looked outside to see a woman breaking the right front window of his parked van. The man told the woman to get away from his van and she began to yell something unintelligible at him. The man exited his house and the woman fled on foot. The woman was described as a black female, 20-25, 5'5", 110, wearing a black puffy jacket with hood and light blue jeans (041 464 178).
