

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE December 16, 2004

Toys for Public Housing

Bayview housing officers will be present at 1065 Oakdale at 6:00 p.m. tonight to assist Operation Dream as it provides the kids living in the local development with Christmas gifts and toys. At 7:30 p.m., the officers will be on Kiska Road to provide toys for the kids living in Westbrook.

Toy Give-Away

This Sunday, December 19, a Christmas toy give-away will take place at Bayview Station from noon to 2:00 p.m. Bayview Station is working with Operation Dream to provide gifts and toys for needy children who reside in the Bayview District. Operation Dream normally provides toys every Christmas to children living in public housing, but this year is assisting Bayview Station with providing toys for kids who live outside of public housing, many of whom are also in need of our support and assistance. If you would like to support this effort, Operation Dream is still looking for donations, both monetary and in the form of toys and other gifts. If you know of any kids who could benefit from this program, please bring them by Bayview Station at noon on Sunday, where they can meet Santa and be provided with a Christmas gift.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On December 15, at 6:19 a.m., Bayview Officers Whitney and Dalton responded to the 1100 block of Fitzgerald on a call that two men were breaking into a van. The officers located two men who matched the description provided by Dispatch and detained the men. The officers identified the men, and the first man provided a name which came back in the system as being that of a deceased person. The officers found this to be somewhat of a red flag and made further inquiries. The officers examined the van and found that it had been broken into, and they also found property stolen from the van in a bag being carried by the men. Both men were identified by the original caller as the men seen breaking into the van, and they were arrested. The first man, living on the 1300 block of Gilman, was booked for auto burglary, conspiracy, possession of burglar tools, and a warrant charging him with burglary. The second man, living on the 1100 block of Palou, was charged with the same offenses, as well as possession of narcotics paraphernalia and a no-bail warrant. Although the second man had provided the officers with the name of a deceased person, he signed his booking card with his actual name. This was the second red flag that he might be stretching the truth (041 419 145).

On December 15, at 8:35 a.m., Bayview Officer Lavin was on patrol at Jerrold and Rankin when she saw a man with bolt-cutters in his hands attempting to cut the lock off the gate leading to state property. The man told the officer that he was cutting off the lock so that he could place his own lock on the gate, which would allow him and his friends access to the area so that they could camp there. The man was arrested for an outstanding warrant charging him with grand theft, possession of stolen property and possession of burglar tools. He was also commended for his

honesty (041 534 116).

On December 15, at 8:49 a.m., Bayview school Officer Valenzuela took a report from a teacher at Marshall High School that a student had inappropriately groped his teacher while alone with her in the classroom. The student, 15 years of age, was cited for sexual battery (041 419 361).

On December 15, at 9:47 a.m., Bayview Officers Dockery and Siguido were on patrol at Westpoint and Middlepoint when they saw a man they knew to be on felony probation for drug sales handing something to another man. The officers approached the man and searched him pursuant to his probation conditions and found a small container with crack cocaine inside of it. The man was arrested for possession of crack cocaine, violation of probation, and violation of a stay away order (which prohibits him from being in the area) 041 419 769.

On December 15, at 12:54 p.m., Bayview plainclothes Officers Benzinger, Fitzpatrick and DeJesus were on patrol at Keith and Thomas when they saw a known drug dealer flag down a passing car and lean into the window of the car as it stopped. When the man saw the officers, he dropped a wad of money into the car and turned away from the officers. The man had been previously admonished by Bayview officers for drug loitering at Keith and Thomas on August 16, August 17, August 31, September 13, October 29, and November 19. The man also has a stay away order issued for the corner. The officers placed the man under arrest and he became very angry at the officers, calling them "haters." The man then told one of the officers that he would someday sodomize him (he actually used more colorful language). The man, living on Lucy Street, was booked for violating the court order, loitering (again) at the corner, and threatening the officer (041 420 562).

On December 15, at 1:22 p.m., Bayview plainclothes Officers Lyons, Scott, Izaguirre, and Stoumen were patrolling the 3rd Street corridor when they saw a group of men loitering in front of the liquor store at 3rd and Newcomb and began to approach them. One of the men yelled out, "Five-Oh" to the group, to alert them to the presence of the approaching officers. The officers detected a strong odor of marijuana as they spoke with the members of the group, and they determined that one of the men was wanted for an outstanding \$100,000.00 warrant from Daly City. The man, living on the 1600 block of Oakdale, was arrested for the warrant. The other men were all admonished regarding their drug-related loitering (041 420 722).

On December 15 at 1:50 p.m., Bayview plainclothes Officers Fitzpatrick, Lewis, DeJesus, Mustafich, Solares, and Aherne were working a drug enforcement operation at Fitzgerald and Jennings. The officers saw a man walk up to a double-parked vehicle and converse with the driver. The two men then exchanged currency. The first man then walked back to the sidewalk and exchanged currency and other items with two passing men. The first man was then seen to stoop down near the base of a tree and retrieve something. The officers moved in and detained everyone. The officers found a bag containing both crack cocaine and heroin where the first man had been seen retrieving objects. The officers found a cup containing brown powder (heroin) in the second man's possession. And the officers also found thirteen bindles of heroin in possession of the female passenger

in the auto. The first man, living on Thrift Street, was booked for numerous drug charges and violation of probation. The second man, living on the 1400 block of Quesada, was also booked for drug charges and conspiracy. The woman, living on Westpoint Road, was booked for drug charges and conspiracy (041 420 885).

On December 15, at 3:00 p.m., Bayview school Officer Valenzuela responded to Thurgood Marshall High School on the report that a student had stolen keys from staff members. School staff persons had taken the student into custody and had determined that he had stolen, and had in his possession, numerous keys from various school employees. The student had been arrested in October for auto burglary and had just finished serving one month at YGC. The student, living on Central Street, was booked for several counts of theft at YGC (041 421 441).

On December 15, at 8:27 p.m., Bayview plainclothes Officers Stoumen, Scott, Lyons, Izaguirre, and Sgt. Fabbri, were on patrol at Westpoint and Middlepoint when they detained several validated members of the Westmob gang. One of the detained men, living on the 100 block of Westpoint Road, was arrested for an outstanding warrant from San Jose. A second man, living on the 1000 block of Plymouth, was booked possession for sale of marijuana and trespassing. A third man, living on Mendocino Drive, was cited for possession of marijuana and trespassing. A fourth man, living on Alemany, was cited for trespassing (041 422 427).

On December 15, at 8:56 p.m., Bayview plainclothes Officers DeJesus, Fitzpatrick, and Benzinger were on patrol at 3rd and LaSalle when they saw a group of several people standing on the corner, and as the officers approached, three of them began to quickly walk away in different directions. The officers recognized one of the women walking away as a known drug dealer, currently on (drug) probation. The officers also knew that the woman had a valid stay away order for the area. The officers approached and arrested the woman, who lives on the 1500 block of Jerrold and has seven prior narcotics cases, for violating the stay away order and for violation of probation (041 422 433).

On December 15, at 9:45 p.m., Bayview Officers Anderson and Farrell were on patrol at Illinois and 23rd when they were flagged down by a homeless woman who told them a nearby homeless man had been harassing her. The officers detained the man and determined that he was wanted for an outstanding parole warrant (041 422 637)
