Unity Parade

The eighth annual Unity Day Parade and celebration will take place this Saturday, December 11, beginning at 12:30 p.m. The parade will begin at Gilman Park and will proceed down 3rd Street to Oakdale, concluding at the Bayview Opera House where a celebration will take place. This event is sponsored by numerous organizations, including the Neighborhood Safety Partnership, San Francisco SAFE, District Attorney Kamala Harris (who is also the Grand Marshall), Police Chief Heather Fong, the San Francisco Arts Commission, the Mayor's office of Criminal Justice, PG&E, the Third Street Light Rail Project, Wong's Meats, and Super Save Grocery. Crime and Enforcement Update

In yesterday's e-mail, reference was made to a BNT (Broke (n-word) Thievin') gang member who had run from Bayview officers and escaped through a liquor store. The officers began an investigation and tracked down the man, who is both on probation and parole, to a home in the Richmond District of the city. Bayview plainclothes officers began a surveillance on the home and eventually saw the gang member exit the house. The man got into a car and began to drive away and the officers stopped the car and searched it, pursuant to the man's probation and parole search conditions. A secret compartment was found in the car and a kilo of cocaine was located. This has a street value of more than \$18,000.00. The officers then searched the home and found a second parolee inside the home. A major drug dealing operation was found inside the home, including additional cocaine, scales, packaging material, firearms including a shotgun and a rifle, a large cache of live ammunition, and additional evidence. It must be noted that the home, at Balboa and 18th Avenue, was being used as a home for disabled and autistic children.

On December 9, at 3:00 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1000 block of Connecticut on a battery call. The officers found a man lying on the ground at the scene and requested an ambulance respond to the scene. The victim told officers that he "...was jumped," but he refused to say who had jumped him and for what reason. The victim's wife told officers that her husband had gone outside to smoke some crack and had been "...jumped on" by a man named Chuck. Neither the wife nor the husband would provide any additional information (041 396 305).

On December 9, at 9:05 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Fitzgerald and Hawes when they saw a vehicle stopped at the Doublerock Housing development gate. The officers realized that the vehicle had been reported stolen and the officers followed it into the development and approached the driver as he parked and exited the vehicle. The officers ordered the driver to stand still, but he began running east on Cameron. The officers pursued the suspect on foot, and the suspect picked up a trash can and threw it at the officers (sounds like something from a TV movie). The suspect was eventually caught and arrested. The man provided officers with a fictitious name, but they were able to eventually determine his actual name, and also determined that he was wanted for an outstanding arrest

warrant under that name. The man, living on the 400 block of Wilde, was booked for stolen auto, resisting arrest, driving with a suspended license, and a warrant charging him with grand theft (041 383 954).

On December 9, at 10:00 a.m., a Bayview officer responded to the McDonald's on Bayshore on an aggravated assault call. As the officer arrived at the scene he saw a man holding two sticks and ordered the man to drop the sticks. The man failed to comply and began to approach the officer. The officer was then joined by a second officer and the man was arrested. The original caller (from McDonald's) then approached the officer and told him that the man had been going through the trash and he had asked him to stop. The man with the sticks became angry and threatened the McDonald's employee, stating, "What the (expletive deleted) are you going to do?" The suspect then swung his sticks at the employee, barely missing his face. The man with the sticks was booked for aggravated assault, resisting arrest, and a warrant charging him with trespassing. The officers also located a stay away order which had been issued by the courts, prohibiting the man from going to the McDonald's on 16th Street (041 397 187).

On December 9, at 10:23 a.m., Bayview officers responded to Thurgood Marshall High School on the report of an arson. The officers spoke with fire fighters on the scene who told them that unknown suspects had set a garbage can inside the school on fire. The school principal told the officers that this was the second arson fire set in the school in the past 24 hours (041 396 656).

On December 9, at 12:00 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the Hunter's Point Expressway (near Candlestick Park) on a domestic violence call. The male caller told officers that he was parked in the area on a work break and was approached by his ex-girlfriend, who punched him in the eye and then took his car keys. The victim told officers that there is a history of domestic violence between him and his ex-girlfriend, and the keys she took belong to a vehicle owned by the both of them. The case has been referred to our DV unit (041 397 842).

On December 9. at 1:25 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol on the 1000 block of Palou when they saw a man they knew to have a stay-away order and approached him. The stay-away order prohibited the man from being within 150 yards of 1165 Oakdale (based upon a burglary and victim intimidation case), and the officers arrested him for the violation. The man, living on Ramsell, was booked for violation of a court order (041 398 464).

On December 9, at 2:32 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a business on the 2700 block of Ingalls on an embezzlement call. The business owner told officers that he noticed on his bank statement that his bookkeeper had paid herself five times in the past month, and when he confronted her regarding the overpayment, she admitted to having embezzled over \$50,000.00 from the company in the preceding months. The case was referred to our Fraud Unit (041 398 919).

On December 9, at 7:20 p.m., Bayview officers were flagged down at 3rd and Palou and told by a female that a man standing on the corner had been making anti-Hispanic comments to others on the corner. The officers

approached the described suspect and interviewed him, but could find no victim(s). The detained suspect, living on the 1800 block of Palou, was arrested for an outstanding warrant charging him with possession of methamphetamine (041 399 569).

On December 9, at 8:33 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 700 block of Jerrold on the report of a battery. The female caller told officers that someone knocked on her door, and when she opened it, a man named Ralph punched her in the face and ripped out her hair extensions. The victim told officers that Ralph is a friend of her husband's, and had "disrespected" her, leading to an argument and then the assault. The victim phoned her husband, who refused to provide Ralph's last name. Ralph left the area in a white Camaro. The hair extensions were recovered by officers and booked as evidence (041 399 707).

On December 10, at 12:49 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1500 block of Kirkwood on a call that three females, armed with knives, were fighting with a male armed with a stick. The officers found three females and one male at the scene. The officers saw that the male with bleeding from several injuries. The male refused to cooperate and refused to tell the officers what had happened. The females also refused to say anything. One of the females was arrested for an outstanding drug warrant and everyone else was released at the scene without charges. No sticks or knives were found (041 400 150).
