Santa Drive for Troops

The San Francisco Police Officers' Association is working with the Mothers of Military Service Members (MOMS) to provide comfort to our troops abroad by donating small items needed by the troops. So far, over 10,000 pounds of valuable items have been sent overseas this year. These items are delivered to our service men and women currently stationed in Iraq and Afghanistan. If you would like to donate any items to this effort, you can deliver them to Bayview Station and we will ensure that they are put into the hands of MOMs, so that they can be sent overseas for the holidays. Items which are needed included sunscreen, hand lotion, toothpaste, anti-itch cream, deodorant, Top Ramen, tuna in pouches, peanut butter in squeeze tubes, etc. Three police officers assigned to Bayview Station are currently serving our country overseas as members of various military reserve units.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On November 30, at 10:20 a.m. Bayview officers took a report from a man who works at 4348 3rd Street who told them that as he was opening his business today a gunman entered the store and ordered him to "...step away from the counter." The suspect was then joined by a second suspect, and the two of them then removed the currency from the cash register prior to fleeing. Suspect one is a black male, 20-25, goatee, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt, armed with a handgun. Suspect two was not described (only heard by the victim) 041 362 215.

On November 30, at 10:26 a.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the first block of Middlepoint Road on a burglary report. The victim told officers that her apartment had been burglarized and numerous items had been stolen. The victim also stated that, according to neighbors, a local gangster named "Bush" had burglarized her apartment. When the officers returned to Bayview Station they learned from two Gang Unit inspectors that the man known as "Bush" was already in custody on a carjacking and gun case (see below). "Bush" was booked for burglary, possession of stolen property, and gang charges (041 362 328).

On November 30, at 12:00 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 100 block of Westpoint Road on the report of a carjacking. The victim told officers that she had parked her van on Westpoint at 5:30 a.m., and noticed that a car had just pulled up behind her. The victim saw a male exit the car and approach her own vehicle. The male was armed with a silver handgun and pointed it at her head, stating, "Give me your keys." The victim handed the keys to the armed suspect and exited her car. The suspect then drove away in the victim's auto. The victim learned that the suspect's street name was "Bush," and she related this to the officers (see below). "Bush"

was eventually booked for carjacking, possession of stolen property and gang charges (041 362 970).

On November 30, at 11:00 a.m., Bayview officers received information from an officer assigned to the SFPD Narcotics Unit that he had just learned from a confidential informant that a well known Bayview gangster had just hidden a rifle inside a black Cadillac Escalade which was parked at 41 Westpoint Road. The officers quickly located the parked Cadillac, and recognized it as belonging to another local gangster known on the streets as "Bush." The officers then saw the original gangster (seen hiding the rifle) drive by in a white Toyota, and the officers stopped him. The officers then received additional information that "Bush" had been seen driving in the area in a white van. "Bush" was located in the van at Hudson and Ardath and was stopped (this is the van previously taken in a carjacking, see above). "Bush" was found to be in possession of a key to the Escalade, and the vehicle was searched by the officers due to "Bush's" two felony probation search clauses. Both a rifle and a revolver were located inside the Escalade. The Toyota was also searched (pursuant to the other gangster's search clause) and a "banana clip" (extended magazine for an assault weapon) was found in the vehicle's trunk. The first gangster, living on the Middlepoint Road, was booked for a variety of weapons offenses and gang charges. The second gangster, living on Westpoint Road, was also booked for a variety of weapons charges, as well as the charges from the two previous (above) cases. Both individuals are validated members of the "Westmob" gang (041 361 950).

On November 30, at 11:44 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on Phelps at Kirkwood when they saw a woman walking on the 700 block of Phelps. The officers had been patrolling this area all morning and had seen this woman in the same spot on the sidewalk from approximately 9:00 a.m. on. The woman had also been seen waving at cars as they passed, and the officers detained the woman based upon her actions. The woman had prior arrests for both prostitution and narcotics, and she was placed under arrest for loitering for purposes of engaging in prostitution. The woman was interviewed at Bayview Station and provided the officers with her 'menu' of services, which ranged in price from \$10 to \$30, which seemed quite reasonable given inflation and all. The woman was also searched, and a quantity of heroin was found in her sock. The woman was booked for possession of heroin and loitering (041 361 922).

On November 30, at 1:05 p.m., Bayview officers responded to Walgreens at 3801 3rd Street on the report of two females resisting arrest. The officers approached a security guard and saw that his shirt was torn and bloody. The guard told officers that two females had attempted to leave the store without paying for items in their possession, and when the security guards attempted to stop them, the females became violent and struck the guards with their fists and other objects, including a tea kettle. One of the female suspects ran out of the store and got away, but the second female was arrested by the guards. The female, living on the 800 block of Missouri, was booked for theft and possession of a dangerous weapon (knife) 041 362 920.

On November 30, at 2:58 p.m., Bayview officers admonished a woman, living on the 1900 block of Oakdale, for loitering on the 1600 block of Innes for

purposes of engaging in prostitution (041 363 053).

On November 30, at 3:33 p.m., Bayview officers admonished a woman, living in Oakland, for loitering at Phelps and Fairfax for the purposes of engaging in prostitution (041 363 144).

On November 30, at 4:39 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol on Innes at 3rd when they saw a man seated at a table on the sidewalk selling CD's, DVD's, porno films, and other items. The man had hundreds of items with him, and told officers that he sold them on the street "...for a couple of bucks." The man, living on Scotia, was cited for peddling without a permit (041 363 558).

On November 30, at 7:45 p.m., Bayview officers responded to Rebecca Lane on the report of a robbery. The victim was an employee of the 'Luna Kitchen' on Mission Street and was delivering Chinese take-out food to a home on Rebecca when he was approached by two men, one of whom was armed with a gun. The armed man told the victim, "Give me the money and the food." The victim complied and the suspects then fled to a waiting vehicle. Suspect one is a black male, 25-30, 5'6", 150, wearing dark clothing, armed with a gun. Suspect two is a black male, 5'10", 150, wearing dark jeans. The vehicle is an early 90's Acura Integra, silver in color (041 364 089).

On December 1, at 1:00 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the 500 block of Dwight on a call of an auto being stolen. The officers found a 17 year old male working on a parked truck, with a second vehicle parked adjacent to the truck. When the officers asked the young man what he was doing, he replied that he was stealing the battery (which had already been removed from the truck). The truck's window was also shattered, and the young man was arrested. The owner of the truck stated that he had looked out of his window and had seen the young man "hot-wiring" his truck. The suspect, living on the 1900 block of Hamilton, was booked for auto burglary and possession of burglar tools (041 364 948).

On December 1, at 4:58 a.m., Bayview officers arrested a man at Evans and Rankin for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with drug offenses (041 423 626).
