

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE August 25, 2005

Acting Capt. Lt. Kurt Bruneman is sending this email to you.

#### General Community Information

Capt. Bruce received great news from Damone Hale of the Joe Lee Gym yesterday. Five young men from the Bayview will be attending school at Porterville Junior College this fall and will be playing on the school's basketball team. The young men have been given jobs in the area and will room together. Four of these young men played in our Late Night Basketball program and we wish them the best in Porterville (even though we're still smarting from how the young men defeated our police team soundly last month).

#### Murder Rate Down

Due to an increase in violence in our district this past spring, former Deputy Chief Greg Suhr assisted us by "loaning" several officers from other districts to the Bayview for the summer months. These officers work with our "Ceasefire" team, which focuses on gun violence and gang crimes. As a result of the work of these teams, as well as the work of all of our other Bayview officers, there have been no homicides in the Bayview since June 10. During this same period last summer, we had six homicides.

#### Housing Crime Down

Capt. Bruce just received the July crime stats for our four main public housing developments in the Bayview. There were 34 "Part One" crimes reported in the month of July in these developments (homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, pursesnatch, theft from a locked vehicle, and stolen vehicles). This compares to 51 crimes reported in July of 2004, a 33 percent reduction for 2005. The officers assigned to these developments have done a great job, and we're going to continue to focus on reducing crime in public housing, particularly violent crime.

#### Crime and Enforcement Update

Officers tried to notify a driver that his lights were off. As they did the driver sped off for no reason. The officers then surmised that the area where the car was is known for drive-by shootings. The suspect had his lights off and was looking up and down as if he was looking for a specific individual, and then he sped off. The officers tried to catch up and then activated their lights around Bayshore. The suspect continued to speed away. The officers gave up until they saw flames coming from the vehicle. They then notified the driver that his vehicle was on fire. He eventually pulled over near a park. He exited the vehicle and ran off. The officer chased the suspect and noticed that as he ran, he was tucking something away in his waistband. One officer was hurt during the foot pursuit. She sprained her knee and dislocated her shoulder. A search for the suspect was negative. He left some interesting identification in the vehicle, which may lead, to his arrest. (050949389)

Possession of stolen checks 08/24/05 10am 2000 block Jerrold  
Officer Damonte responded to the Bank of America. A teller called stating that there was a man that wanted to cash a check. The teller remembered a fraud alert for this same checking account. He was detained. It was determined that he tried to get cash for this check, he claims to have found. He was booked. (050949680)

Our plain-clothes officers were in the area when they recognized an individual they knew to be on probation and have a warrant for his arrest. His warrant was for a narcotics trafficking offense and strong arm robbery. (000723688)

Plain-clothes officers were on patrol in the area when they observed an individual drinking alcohol in a vehicle. As they approached it became obvious to the officers that the individual was discarding something under his seat. Plain-clothes officer were on foot when they observed a person known to them to be on parole. They detained this person and ran a warrant check. Yes he had a warrant violating his parole. He was booked at County Jail. (050952401)

Officer responded to a call of abuse. The caller stated that her brother was yelling and abusing their grandmother. When the officers arrived they saw that the brother was agitated and appeared to have been drinking. During the argument the brother yelled "I'll take care of you, by taking you out ^&\*\$#." Plain-clothes officers observed a group of suspects. They recognized them from prior contacts. When one of them yelled "five-o" another ducked trying to conceal himself from the police. The officers detained the three and discovered that there was forty rocks of cocaine discarded where the person ducked down. This subject was also on parole.
