September 6, 2006, 1:00 PM - Transporting Narcotics, Parole Violation - Underwood and Keith - CS# 060 949 993 - Officers Altofer and Tennenbaum saw a vehicle fail to stop at a stop sign. A traffic stop was made and it was learned that the driver was on felony parole. As search of him was performed and a large cache of ecstasy pills was found. September 7, 2006, 8:25 PM - Robbery with a gun - 700 Block of Silliman - CS# 060 956 578 - As a man exited his vehicle he was approached by a black male 18-20 years old, 5'08" 140 pounds wearing a blue hooded sweatshirt, blue jeans and white tennis shoes. The suspect brandished a gun at the victim and demanded his money. The man gave the suspect all of his money. Unfortunately, the victim was paid that day for his week's wages.

September 8, 2006, 3:34 PM - Arson Arrest - Salinas and Carr - CS# 060 877 269 - A man wanted for arson of a residential building is in custody after spending the last three weeks eluding capture. The original incident occurred on August 17, 2006 when this suspect and another young man threatened to shoot a store owner and the members of his family. Later that night it is believed that they returned, poured a flammable liquid on the building and lit it on fire. It should be noted that there are apartments above the store. September 8, 2006, 6:30 PM, Driving Reckless (for the second time) - Westpoint and Middlepoint Roads - CS# 060 960 165 - An area man had his car taken away for him after he was caught doing "donuts" in the intersection of Westpoint and Middlepoint Roads for the second time that same day. This time the driver had his Ford Mustang towed due to likelihood of the offense continuing.

The Ford was raised up on big mud tires, so Officer Lamma could only talk to the driver at a distance, but she could still see that there were two young children who were in the car that did not have seatbelts. Officer Lamma cited the driver for unnecessary use of the horn and not having proper child restraints.

The driver drove off to his house, which was less than a block away. As he reached the house, "The Mexican Hat Dance" played once again, just as Officer Lamma was about to drive by. She stopped again and witnessed the driver stumble from the truck. that she was carrying. Because she is on probation, as a condition of the probation, she agrees to be searched at any time without warrant or probable cause. The officers searched the coat and found a crack pipe and crack cocaine. The woman was transported back to Bayview Station where she was booked on felony narcotics possession, possession of narcotics paraphernalia and violation of her probation charges.

Monday, September 11, 2006, 12:00 noon, 25th and Pennsylvania, Warrant/Narcotics/Weapon arrest (case # 060969242): Homeless Coordinator Officer Lavin responded to 25th and Pennsylvania on a report of a illegal homeless encampment. When she arrived on scene, she saw a blue tent set up with several items placed around the tent. A white male was just riding away from the campsite on a bicycle as she pulled up. She stopped the man, asking him if the campsite was his. He told her that it was his campsite. Officer Lavin then detained the man and decided to pat search the man for weapons. Being an experienced officer, Officer Lavin asked the man if he had anything sharp on his person. The man told officer Lavin that he had a switchblade knife in his pants pocket. Switchblades are actually illegal in the state of California and possession is a felony.

Officer Lavin reached into the man's pocket to retrieve the knife, but also felt a small bag of powder as well. The knife and the bag came out at the same time. When the suspect saw the baggie, he said, "I forgot that was in there." Officer Lavin recognized the bag as methamphetamine. A warrant check revealed that the suspect was wanted on an outstanding assault with a deadly weapon warrant. He was transported back to Bayview Station where he was booked on weapons, narcotics, the warrant and illegal encampment charges.

Monday, September 11, 2006, 1:00 PM, Newhall and LaSalle, under the influence of drugs/parole violation (case # 060969769): Officer Martin was on bicycle patrol at Newhall and LaSalle when he saw a man sitting in the drivers seat of a parked truck lighting the end of a socket from a socket wrench. The man would then suck on the other end and exhale a white smoke. Officer Martin being a highly trained officer realized that the man was partaking of illegal narcotics, probably crack cocaine.

Officer Martin was standing close enough to the truck while the driver was smoking crack that he could see that there was another man in the back seat who was drinking a 24 oz Old English malt liquor, a violation of the vehicle code.

The truck's registration was expired, but the driver had stolen a 2007 tab and placed it on the rear plate. Both men were transported back to Bayview Station. The crack smoker was booked on under the influence, possession of narcotics paraphernalia , false proof of registration charges as well as having his probation revoked. The drinker was booked on open container in a vehicle charges as well as the parole warrant.

Thursday, September 14, 2006, 8:00 PM, West Point and Middle Point, Shooting (case # 060984955): Officers responded to SFGH on a report of a shooting victim at the hospital. The victim, who was very uncooperative, first told officers that he was shot at 24th and Potrero, a block away from the hospital, but after further discussion admitted that he was actually shot at West Point and Middle Point. The victim would not provide any further information.

Wednesday, September 13, 2006, 5:00 PM, Davidson and Rankin, Graffiti and trespassing (case # 060979592): Officers responded to Davidson and Rankin on a report of trespassers performing grafitti. kidnapping (case # 060980135): The victim and her daughter were sitting on the bus when a woman directly opposite them, started towards the bus exit. The suspect then grabbed the hand of the daughter and tried to take the daughter with her. A struggle ensued where the two women tugged on the little girl. Other passengers intervened and helped the mother retain her daughter. All the while the suspect was yelling, "That's my child, not yours." The mother ran to the front of the bus and alerted the driver who notified police. The suspect got off the bus, but was quickly stopped by the police. The victims positively identified the suspect and she was taken to Bayview Station where she was booked on attempted kidnapping, child endangerment and for some unknown reason, domestic violence battery.

Friday, September 15, 2006, 6:30 PM, Oakdale and Baldwin, Gun and resisting arrest (case # 060988242): Plain clothes officers were patrolling the Oakdale Baldwin projects when they saw two well know gang members and a juvenile standing on the street. As soon as the gang members saw the unmarked police car, one of them quickly handed an object to the juvenile who started walking away from the group, holding the object in his right hand. When the officers told him to stop, he started running. Officers running after him saw that he had a handgun in his right hand. The officers broadcast that they were in a foot pursuit. Saturday, September 16, 2006, 11:30 PM, 3rd and Palou, Assault with pepper spray (case # 060992607): The victim was walking on Third Street, talking on his cell phone at 11:30 PM, when the suspect came up to him and and sprayed the victim in the face with pepper spray. The suspect then left the scene without making any demands or taking anything from the victim.

The first incident occurred in the area of Burrows and San Bruno Avenue. The witness first reported that he observed three juveniles throwing rocks at elderly people. He said that he saw these juveniles hiding behind cars and periodically emerging to throw rocks at passersby. The witness then found himself too to be a victim because the juveniles threw rocks at him. Fortunately, he was not struck and the juveniles ran away.

The juveniles made it a block away to Girard Street. There they saw a moped that was sitting in a driveway of a home. One of the males got on the moped and attempted to start it while the other two acted as look outs. However, a neighbor across the street spotted them and told the juveniles to "beat it." One of the look outs threw a rock at neighbor, missing him but striking his house. One of the other suspects then threw a soda bottle at the man, again missing him. The three juveniles fled the area.

This time they made two blocks away when they threw a rock at a passing motorist. The driver stopped and the juveniles began to run, but the driver caught one of them. The two other juveniles attempted to free the one that was caught and a melee ensued. Officers that were already in the area looking for these suspects spotted them and detained the juveniles.

The victims from the earlier incidents were all brought to the scene where they positively identified the juveniles as their attackers. The three juveniles were charged with many various charges.
