### SFPD Youth Fishing Program

The San Francisco Youth Fishing Program will begin its 38th year of taking local kids fishing. The program will run from June 20th through August 19th and fish for salmon. The program is open to established community groups that serve San Francisco Youth.

The boat will leave every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from Fisherman's Wharf at 5:30AM. The boat can accommodate fourteen kids and one supervisor. The youth participants must be over 12 years old and under 18 years old. Anyone over the age of 16 must possess a Fishing License. A one-day license can be purchased on board. Equipment and bait will be provided. The group must supply their own transportation and food.

**Homeless Abatement:** For the last 8 years, "The Plant Man" has been homeless and living in the area of Newcomb and Newhall. Although suffering from arthritis in both his hips and knees, he had been unwilling to go into city shelters because he could not take his dog, "Mommie." Officer Sue Lavin, Homeless Coordinator for the Bayview District, was determined to get him help and get him off the street. Officer Lavin determined that he is a ideal candidate for Hope House, a Bayview facility for chronically homeless with a debilitating condition. With the help of Danisha, Carole, Judy and Naim at Hope House, Dorothy Johnson from the Mayor's Homeless Outreach Team and Nurse Dorley Chavez and Dr. Dan from the Southeast Community Clinic, Officer Lavin was able to get the Plant Man his first real housing in 8 years. And with the help of Sgt. Forrester from Animal Care and Control, "Mommie" is now registered, has her shots and a clean bill of health and has joined the Plant Man at Hope House.

Crimes and Law Enforcement

THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

Tuesday, May 2, 2006, 5:00 PM, Newhall and Newcomb, Possible Robbery leads to Parolee at large (Case # 060468830): Officers Martin and Dockery were on bike patrol on 3rd Street when they were hailed by a woman telling them that she had just been robbed of \$7.00. The woman told the officers that the suspect was around the corner at Newhall and Newcomb. The officers responded to the area and found the suspect who then lied to the officers about his identity. After some research, the officers found the suspect's real name and it turned out that he was a parolee at large wanted for violating his parole. Unfortunately the woman who said that she was robbed left the scene and the officers were unable to locate her, so the suspect could not be charged with the robbery. However he was booked on the two warrants at Bayview Station.

Tuesday, May 2, 2006, 10:00 PM, 20th and Connecticut, Purse Snatch (Case # 060469460): The victim was walking on 20th and Connecticut when the suspect walked up to her and grabbed her purse and a dress that she was holding in her hand. When the victim did not let go immediately, the suspect punched her twice in the face, cutting her lip in the process. The suspect then grabbed the purse and the dress and fled towards the housing projects on the backside of Potrero Hill.

The suspect is described as African American male, early 20's, 5'10", 160 pounds wearing a black cap, jacket and pants.

Wednesday, May 3, 2006, 1:00 PM, 1600 block of Oakdale, Robbery (Case #060499963): The victim got off the bus at 3rd and Palou and was walking home on Oakdale when two men came up to him and started punching him. After hitting him several times, the suspects then told the victim to be quiet and to just give them all his money. The victim complied and the suspects

fled the scene. Officers searched the area for the suspects, but did not find them. They are described as African American males in their early 20's. One was 5'7" and 160 pounds; the other was 6'00" and 180 pounds. Both suspects were wearing black hooded jackets and baggie jeans.

Wednesday, May 3, 2006, 6:30 PM, Revere and Hawes, Stabbing (Case # 060473209): Officers responded to SFFD Station 17 regarding a stabbing. When they arrived, they met with the victim who told them that he had a fight with a female friend over money. When the victim told the suspect that he did not owe her money, she pulled out a pocket knife and stabbed him in the shoulder. The victim did not know the suspect's name or her whereabouts.

At 8:00 PM, a young woman calls dispatch and said that "everyone" is trying to kill her. When officers responded to her location, the woman told the officers that the reason "everyone" is trying to kill her is that she stabbed someone earlier in the day. After comparing notes, the officers from the first incident determine that the woman is the suspect from their incident. She was taken into custody and transported to Bayview Station. While at Bayview Station she admits not only to the stabbing, but that she had been smoking crack cocaine for the past week. She was medically evaluated before being booked at YGC on assault charges.

Wednesday, May 3, 2006, 8:00 PM, 1200 block of Van Dyke, Stolen car recovery (Case # 060473328): Officer Altorfer responded to an alarm on the 1200 block of Van Dyke. When he arrived, he met with an employee of the company where the alarm went off who told him that he had tripped the alarm in error. After handling the alarm, Officer Altorfer noticed that there was a white Lincoln with its lights on parked at the end of the block. He then saw a white male leaving the car, leaving the door open and the lights on. Officer Altorfer finding this a bit odd approached the man who was now walking away on Van Dyke and asked him if he owned the car. Initially the man tried to ignore Officer Altorfer, but being a persistent and diligent officer, Officer Altorfer persisted. Finally the man said, "No that ain't my car ... I was just digging for some change." Officer Altorfer detained the man and after an investigation determined that the car was stolen. The man was taken to Bayview Station where he was booked on stolen vehicle charges.

Wednesday, May 3, 2006, 11:40 PM, Oakdale and Phelps, Assault on a police officer (Case # 060469844): Plain clothes officers were on patrol in the area of Oakdale and Phelps when they saw a white Nissan 300ZX doing donuts in the middle of the intersection. The Nissan then backed into a driveway. Officer Scott then approached the car and identified himself as the police. Officer Scott recognized the driver as someone he had dealt with several times in the past and he ordered the driver to turn off the car. Instead the driver revved the engine and then started forward towards Officer Scott. Officer Scott had to jump out of the way in order to avoid being

run over. The driver sped down Oakdale at a high rate of speed. Officer Scott put out the vehicle description as well as the driver's name and description.

On May 4, 2006 at 2:00 AM Officers Rodriguez and Correa were patrolling in the area of 25th and Pennsylvania when they saw a white Nissan 300ZX parked on the West Side of Pennsylvania. Remembering that a white 300ZX had attempted to run Officer Scott over earlier, the officers ran the plate and found that it was the same car. There was an African American male standing near the car that matched the suspect's description. The officers approached the man and detained him. They then identified him as the driver of the Nissan that attempted to run over Officer Scott earlier in the evening. The suspect was transported to Bayview Station where he was booked on Assault on a police officer and reckless driving charges.

Friday, May 5, 2006, 4:40 AM, 3801 3rd St., Burglary in progress (Case # 060478293): Officers Ferrell and Anderson responded to the Goodwill Store at the Bayview Plaza Shopping Centre on a report of a burglar alarm. When they arrived, they found the rear rollup door up with the suspect just inside the rollup door. Officer Anderson ordered the suspect out of the store, but the suspect chose to charge Officer Anderson instead. After striking Officer Anderson, the suspect started running down Newhall St yelling, "You're gonna have to kill me!" The two officers gave chase, but even after catching the suspect he continued to fight with the officers. Other units arrived on the scene and the suspect was taken into custody. Unfortunately during the struggle, Officer Anderson's hand was injured. After the suspect was taken to Bayview Station, the officers continued their investigation and found that the suspect had dropped a backpack near the garbage dumpster. Inside the backpack, they found not only merchandise from the Goodwill Store, but also two small baggies with methamphetamine. The suspect was booked at Bayview Station on burglary, stolen property and narcotics possession charges. Note that the suspect in this case is the same as the suspect in the recovered stolen car on 5/3/06 mentioned earlier in this text.

Saturday, May 5, 2006, 12:15 AM - Threat with a Firearm and a knife, Arrest Made - 1000 Block of Oakdale - CS #: 060 481 707 - Bayview Officers responded to this area on report that a man threatened another man with a rifle and a knife. When they arrived they found the suspect and detained him. The victim said that this was caused by an argument over crack cocaine. The suspect accused the victim of doing something funny to the crack that they just bought together. The suspect pulls out a knife and said that he was going to kill the victim. The victim left the premises. While he was standing outside the suspect was pointing a rifle at the victim from the unit's window.

The knife was found in the back pocket of the suspect and the rifle was

found in a bedroom closet. The crack was not found. The suspect was booked on various weapons charges.

Sunday, May 7, 2006 - Attempted Burglary, Narcotics Offenses - 600 Block of Carolina Street - CS# 060 486 478 - A Potrero Hill resident was sitting in her living room when she saw a man on her roof looking through her yard. She called a neighbor. The neighbor went outside and yelled to the suspect telling him to come out. The suspect told the neighbor that he lived there. The neighbor, knowing this not to be true, called 911.

Plainclothes officers were the first on scene. Officer Alcaraz went into the back yard. He spotted the suspect who began to run away. Officer Alcaraz gave chase that led through several back yards. Officer DeJesus intercepted the suspect. In the process of the suspect's attempt to escape capture he also damaged a neighbor's garden.

The man who also had methamphetamine and cocaine on his person, was booked. It should be noted that the suspect had been arrested no less than ten times for burglary and theft charges. Analysis has shown that a narcotics addict will steal approximately 150-200 thousand dollars of merchandise a year to support his habit. There should be no question that this arrest prevented a burglary or worse crime.

Sunday, May 7, 2006 8:05 PM, Carjacking with a Gun - Potrero Hill Housing - CS# 060 486 729 - Bayview Station Officers responded to the Potrero Hill Housing complex on a report of numerous people running around the area with guns. When Officers Reyes and Haynes arrived they were flagged down by a young woman who told them that she was just carjacked. Two young men approached her, pointed a gun at her and demanded that she get out of the car. The woman was not able to give a description of the suspects.

Sunday, May 7, 2006 4:00 PM - Solicitation of a Minor by Internet - Many details of this incident are being withheld due to the age of the victim. Bayview Officers were alerted by the family members of a fourteen year old boy that had been victimized by a twenty-one year old man. It was learned that the suspect met the boy online using the myspace.com website. The man posed as a seventeen year old and solicited the boy.

There are some steps that parents can take to prevent their child from being victimized. The internet and websites such as myspace.com make it easy for users to post their profiles on line and in turn make it easy for other people to find out about them, including predators. Many young teens do not realize that they may be revealing too much to these would be predators. Coupled with a young teens natural curiosity of the world around them they can find themselves over their heads in a hurry.

It is recommended that the computer be kept in a family room or another

open space in the home. This will allow a parent to keep an eye on what the computer user is doing. If your child has an account with [myspace.com](http://myspace.com) or similar sites, know their user name and profile. Educate them about the dangers of revealing too much such as a full name, birthdays, addresses, and other personal information. Keep in mind that a crafty teen may create a profile that may make them appear older or even open a "free" email service through [yahoo.com](http://yahoo.com) or [hotmail.com](http://hotmail.com) that can be accessed outside the home.

Know what websites are being viewed. This can be done by pressing CTRL-H or by navigating the Internet Tools menu. Many programs are equipped with parental controls that can allow a parent grant access to websites that would be appropriate for children. Use of the Internet is a privilege, not a right. Be diligent.

Know who your child's friends are, their parents, and how to contact them. Know where your child is and where they are going. If your child has a cell phone look at the call history. Question your child about the phone numbers that appear frequently. Note the times that calls were made and the length of them.
