Crimes and Law Enforcement

THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

Tuesday, March 14, 2006, 1:14 PM. Suspicious Occurrence on School Grounds. 600 Block of DeHaro St. Case #: 060280747. An employee at a local middle school met with Bayview Officers Archini and Berge. The employee had witnessed a suspicious exchange between two students at the school. The employee confronted the students and discovered that one student had sold a toy cap pistol to the other for \$5.00. The respective parents were notified and the Officers seized the toy gun.

Bayview Officers Espiritu and Reyes met with the employee of an antiques shop on Kansas St. The employee reported that a suspicious man had come to the store and was browsing around. The man entered a rear showroom and removed his jacket. Suddenly, the man left the shop and rode off on his bicycle. The employee went to the showroom and immediately noticed that an item was missing. The item was a 2000-year-old Chinese Hahn Dynasty figurine valued at \$10,000.

Wednesday, March 15, 2006. 2:30 PM. Possession of a Loaded Firearm by a Prohibited Person, Parole Violation. Kirkwood Ave. at Mendell St. Case#: 060284084. Bayview Officers Aherne, Fitzpatrick, and DeJesus were working a plainclothes assignment near the above intersection. They noticed four individuals loitering in the middle of the street. The officers recognized two of the individuals from prior firearm arrests. As the Officers approached, one of the individuals unknown to the Officers began to walk away hastily. As he walked, he paused briefly to crouch behind a tree. When the Officers came to the tree they discovered a brown paper bag with a loaded handgun in it. The chase was on and after a brief struggle the man was taken into custody. The man continued to resist at Bayview Station and refused to reveal his identity. Turns out he is on active parole for Robbery. He was booked on numerous felony charges and will be headed back to prison. He is a Bayview resident.

Wednesday, March 15, 2006. 12:05 AM. Street Robbery with a Gun, Resisting Arrest. Fitzgerald Ave. at Hawes St. Case #: 060282248. Bayview Officers Whitfield and Norris rushed to the gates of Double Rock Housing Projects and met with a robbery victim. The woman had just dropped

off a friend of hers when six strangers approached her. One of them asked to pet her pit bull. As the man approached he snatched the dog and stated, "We taking dogs tonight!" Then, another suspect produced a double-barreled shotgun and demanded the woman's jewelry. The Officers arrested a possible suspect on Gilman St. after a short foot chase. He was booked pending his identification. The gunman is at large. He is described as a black male wearing all black clothing. He had gold teeth.

Wednesday, March 15, 2006. 3:15 PM. Controlled Substance Offense. 4700 Block of 3rd St. Case #: 060284222. Bayview permits Officer George responded to a restaurant on 3rd St along with members of the Alcoholic Beverage Control and the City Attorney. The team was responding to complaints about loitering, drug dealing, and unlicensed alcohol sales at the restaurant. The team met with the business owner and began to search the building. They noticed the counter refrigerator was stocked with a variety of alcoholic beverages for sale.

Under the front counter they located three prescription bottles. The bottles contained nearly 150 pills of codeine and an unknown second drug. The business owner claimed not to know anything about the pills. The case is under investigation.

Thursday, March 16, 2006. 3:31 PM. Firearm Offenses, Narcotics Offenses. 100 Block of Dakota St. Case #: 060288622. A team of Bayview Plainclothes Officers was working on Potrero Hill when they spotted a known gang member in the area. The man spotted the Officers and ran off, firmly holding his waistband-an indication that he might be armed. The Officers followed him to an address on Dakota where he screamed for the occupant to lock the door. The Officers captured the man and contacted the occupant, a female on felony probation for narcotics violations. The Officers searched the apartment and located a handgun with obliterated serial numbers. They also found a large quantity of crack cocaine and marijuana packaged for sale. The Officers also discovered number of marijuana plants and various scales and drug packaging material. The man and woman were booked at Bayview Station.

Friday, March 17, 2006. 12.30 AM. Vehicle Burglary, Recovered Stolen Vehicle, Probation Violation. Minnesota St. at 19th St. Case #: 060289943. A large team of Bayview plainclothes Officers was working near the above intersection with the specific intent to curb a vehicle burglary problem. The Officers spotted a suspicious character wandering in the area on foot. The man entered a Jeep and began to circle the area. The Officers determined that the Jeep itself was stolen but didn't stop the man just yet.

They watched as he stopped the Jeep beside a red Honda. The man broke into the Honda and began to empty its contents into the stolen Jeep. With this evidence in hand some of the Officers moved in and arrested the

Friday, March 17, 2006. 12:14 PM. Narcotics Offenses, Parole Violation. 1900 Block of Yosemite Ave. Case #: 060291277. Bayview bicycle patrol Officers Dalton and McPherson were riding on Yosemite Ave. when they noticed a Chrysler convertible illegally parked on the sidewalk. They also noticed that the top of the convertible was down, and that the two men were seated in the car. One of the men was smoking crack cocaine. The Officers detained the men and noticed a knit cap lying on the seat between them. Inside the cap the Officer found crack cocaine and heroin. One of the men claimed the hat belonged to a female companion he had given a ride to earlier. Not believing this tale the Officers booked both men at Bayview Station. There they discovered that the both men are active parolees.

Saturday, March 18, 2006 1:00 AM - Hit and Run Arrest - 1300 Block of Thomas - CS# 060 293 966 - Bayview Station received an anonymous tip regarding a fatal hit and run accident that occurred on February 18, 2006 at the intersection of Silver and Bayshore Avenues. The tipster identified the driver by name.

In a strange turn of events, the police received a phone call about an auto burglary in progress. The get away vehicle was spotted by Officers Rodriguez and Correa and was pulled over. In the driver's seat was the suspect from the hit and run.

Officers went to the house of the suspect and peered into the garage. They saw a van that matched the description of the hit and run vehicle. The scene was quickly locked down. The owner of the house granted officers permission to search to the house. The van was towed and the case is being investigated by the Hit and Run Bureau.

police that she just parked her car and was feeding the meter when a man approached her armed with a handgun. The man demanded her purse. The suspect grabbed her purse but the victim refused to let go. The suspect threw the victim to the ground and ripped the purse from her shoulder. The suspect jumped into the passenger seat of a waiting Honda. The woman suffered minor injuries in the struggle.

We do not suggest that if you are faced with an armed robber that you resist. It is much safer to give up your replaceable property than risk serious injury or death.

The first suspect is described as a light complexion black male between 16-21 years of age approximately 5'10" and 150 pounds. Last seen wearing a black T-Shirt. The second suspect was only described as a black male driving a grey Honda.

Monday, March 20, 2006 12:33 PM, Robbery Attempt, - 2500 Block of San Bruno Avenue - CS# 060 302 175 - Bayview officers responded to a bank on the 2500 block of San Bruno Avenue on report of an attempted robbery. Bank employees said that they saw three black males wearing ski masks were standing at the door of the bank. Since the door can only be opened from the inside by the employees, the bank employees thought it would be best not to allow the masked men inside the bank. They eventually fled.

Monday, March 20, 2006 - Assault Weapon - 100 Block of Dakota Street - CS# 060 302 802 - Officer assigned to the Bayview Violent Crime Reduction Unit received information that a person was seen with an assault style weapon. The suspect is currently on probation and is wanted in numerous robberies. When Officers went to the house and knocked on the door they heard scurrying.

The resident refused entry into the premises. A key was obtained to make entry. It should be noted that this was legal because the suspect was on active probation and as a condition of his probation he gave up his right to warrantless search in exchange for being set free.

Entry was forced. Inside the unit two guns were found including the assault gun. Numerous arrests were made.
